A YEAR OF FRUITFULNESS

"...let us go on ..."

Hebrews 6:1

God, in His providence and mercy, has given us the gift of a New Year—2007. In His wisdom and goodness, He hides from our eyes the course of future events. I'm glad that I do not know what is going to happen this year! But I do know Who is directing my life, and my goal for this year is to be sensitive to His leading that I might live each day in His will. Living that way, whatever comes in 2007 will be for my good and for God's glory. I could ask for nothing more. I am sure that you join me in this desire for the New Year.

New Year's resolutions are frowned upon by some because they are so quickly forgotten. In my mind, however, it is good for every Christian to begin the New Year by taking account of how he is investing his time and by establishing priorities and goals for the next twelve months. Time does pass quickly, and each of us would do well to make decisions today that will guide our daily lives.

Here are a few thoughts to help you plan for a year of fruitfulness.

God is able! God is willing! God is waiting! We must order our lives around prayer. The sovereign God has ordained prayer as the tool to get His work done. Prayer is the work that must come before the "greater works" that Jesus promised in John 14:12-14. God's command is crystal clear: "Call to Me, and I will answer you, and show you great and mighty things, which you do not know" (Jeremiah 33:3). Am I obeying His command to pray?7

A DAILY PRAYER. Father through Jesus in the power of the Holy Spirit, I come to you in prayer. Jesus said to ask, seek, and knock. My intention is to pray without ceasing today. I know that life is fragile and I must handle it with prayer. I know you are able, willing, and waiting for me to call on you asking for specific things to be done for Your glory. May the Holy Spirit keep my eyes directly on You. I ask for a spirit of prayer in Jesus' name. Amen."

Jesus is Lord! Our lives, as Christians, must be built on an unconditional, absolute surrender to Jesus Christ as Lord. Have you developed the "Yes, Lord!" attitude or do you maintain the veto power? This is the key question: "Is there any area of my life where I am reserving the right to make final decisions?" "And He is the head of the body, the church . . . that in all things He may have the preeminence" (Colossians 1:18).

A DAILY PRAYER: "Father, You have made Jesus Lord over all. I surrender myself afresh to Him this day. Jesus, I acknowledge Your right to reign over every area of my life. My life is not my own, it is Yours. May my choices, my actions, my words, my attitudes, and even my thoughts reflect Your Lordship. In Your name, I ask and surrender gladly to Your will and way. Amen."

"For me to live is [for Christ to live all over again]" (Philippians 1:21).

God's thoughts are revealed in His Word!

The Word of God must determine our thinking, direct our decision-making, and reign supreme over every area of our lives. Is there any biblical truth that I know but am not obeying?

A DAILY PRAYER: "Father, more and more I understand that You reveal Your will and ways

Perspectives

For those who are willing for it to be so, a new year offers an opportunity to have a fresh beginning. As you assess your spiritual progress, don't waste time in regret over things that you did not accomplish last year. There is a land of beginning again. Although it could be any day for a Christian, what better time is there than the beginning of a new year? Certainly one key area to focus on is prayer.

God's provision for His people has always been prayer. Prayer history began when men began to call on the name of the Lord (Genesis 4:26b). During our seminars in Peru in June 2006, the Holy Spirit brought to my mind a way to remind the Peruvians what is needed for God to "do great and mighty things" even beyond our expectations (Jeremiah 33:3), He lead me to state GOD IS ABLE, GOD IS WILLING, and GOD IS WAITING! We, too, need to be so reminded. Think with me about the place of prayer in our lives as we enter into 2007. It is important to understand that God wants us to order our lives around prayer-pray about everything is the general guideline. Jesus Himself said that "men ought always to pray and not faint" (Luke 18:1).

A basic definition

What is prayer for the Christian? Prayer is coming to the Father through the Son in the power of the Holy Spirit for self (petition) and for others (intercession). Prayer is to "our Father" according to the pattern for praying given by Jesus in the Model Prayer. John saw the Father sitting on His throne in Heaven (Revelaton 4) and Jesus is at His right hand (Romans 8:34). There is only one way to get to the Father and that is through the Son (John 14:6). His name is the authority to open the storehouse of Heaven. The power for prayer is the Holy Spirit who is our interpreter as we bring either words or groanings to the Father (Romans 8:26). Amazing! The moment we begin to pray both Jesus and the Holy Spirit join us.

Touching three worlds

Prayer touches three worlds. When we touch Heaven, we look toward God with praise for who He is and that is worship. When we touch earth, we look at people and circumstances and that is work. Finally, when we touch hell, we look toward Satan and that is warfare. One reason that Satan does not want us to pray is that genuine prayer brings his defeat. We need to touch all three worlds, but there is a desperate need for us to do the prayer work as a church and as an individual. God is looking for intercessors.

Intercession-touching earth

As we look at our world, our lives and the lives of those around us, we see the need for a fresh touch from God upon us all. There is much work that needs to be done in our families and in our nation. Prayer is the work that must come before all other work in the Lord's service. God is "sovereign," which means that He has final say. The sovereign God has ordained prayer as the tool to get His work done. "Ordained" means that He has laid it out ahead of time. He has established the boundaries and the parameters under which we most serve Him. God works only in concert with the praying of His people.

Prayer is the work that must come before all other work. Most of us are familiar with John 14:12-14, which I call the "Greater Works Passage." Jesus told His disciples that they would do greater works than He had done during His time on earth. If you don't keep on reading, however, you will never have a clue as to what this incredible pronouncement means. He said, "as you ask things in My name." Asking in His name is prayer. Prayer must come before greater works are done. God is able! God is ready! God is waiting for us to pray!

Most believers think that prayer is mostly prefix and suffix—what you do before you begin and finish work for the Lord. It is the work which must undergird all other work—such as evangelism, teaching, or preaching. Work implies spending energy. It is important to know that prayer requires energy and time.

The need

Few Christians are prayed for regularly by anyone after they become Christians. You can pretty well say to a new convert, "I'm glad you came to Christ. I hope everything goes well for you. But you are on your own now." Most unsaved people are never prayed for by anyone. Failing to pray for others is one of the greatest sins of the church. One can actually say that the failure of the church is the failure of prayer.

In Isaiah's day, God looked down from Heaven and saw all the people living in Israel and Judah—and "wondered that there were no intercessors" (Isaiah 59:16).

We need to pray for the lost regularly. Consider the people who live in the fifth house from your church building. Ask yourself if they have ever heard the name of Jesus in a saving sense one time. Are they going to Heaven when they die? Who is praying for them? The answer usually is "Nobody!" If you are not praying for your children, nobody else is. The need of the hour is intercessors!

Do you have the world on your heart, yet? There are close to six billion people on earth. Many believe that two out of three have never heard the name Jesus in a saving sense (the Gospel) one time. Isn't it time for us to begin to pray earnestly for the Gospel be available for the unreached people? Are you praying for laborers? Are you praying for missionaries?

In order to become intercessors, it is important for a believer to understand biblical teachings that govern this aspect of praying. I have written Intercession: Prayer as Work not only to provide basic knowledge, but to provide practical suggestions that will motivate you to become an intercessor and to help your church become a praying church. Copies are available through our office.

May 2007 be the year when we make prayer the top priority in our lives and in our churches. Remember, God is able, God is willing, but He is waiting for us to call on Him (Jeremiah 33:3).

Forty-seven **prayer seminars** were conducted during 2006 in sixteen states (AL, AK, CA, FL, GA, IL, KS, KY, MI, NC, OH, SC, TN, VA, WA, WV) and three nations (Kenya, Peru, South Africa). Miles traveled totaled 52,766 with ninety-seven days on the road. We have now conducted 1,252 seminars in forty-six states, the District of Columbia, and forty-seven nations with miles traveled totaling 2,133,599.

2007 has been a banner year for the number of prayer seminars. Not only have seminars been conducted by several pastor/teachers in the United States, there have been numerous seminars in other countries including Pakistan, Kenya, Congo, Nigeria, and South Africa.

From his prison cell in Rome, Paul wrote to Timothy, his young comrade, in what was his last epistle. As he closed his letter (2 Timothy 4:9-18), he explained his situation and urged Timothy to be diligent to come quickly (v 9). He asked him to bring Mark (v 11), his coat, and his books (v 13).

In the early nincties, the Lord impressed upon me the importance of reducing key truths and insights He was teaching me to writing to help His children in their daily walk with Him.

Classic Moody

For the past few months, attention has been given to the issue of Calvinism. In a nutshell, Calvinists believe that God has already selected or pre-ordained those who will be saved. In fact, LifeWay Research of the Southern Baptist Convention conducted a study to determine where their churches/pastors are in regard to Calvinism, Are people's eternal destinies fixed already or can they make their own choice? This seems to be the issue. Calvinists believe, among other things, in what is known as unconditional election. They maintain that God decreed from eternity to elect certain individuals to salvation The study concluded that ten percent of Southern Baptist pastors embrace Calvinism. This is not a new question. Dwight L.

Moody, in his day, provided the classic answer to this query that will provide insight and guidance for evangelism today. Here is his statement:

"How many men fold their arms and say, 'If I am one of the elect, I will be saved, and if I am not, I won't. No use bothering about it.'

I have an idea that the Lord Jesus saw how men were going to tumble over this doctrine of election, so after He had been thirty or forty years in Heaven, He came down and spoke to John one Lord's day in Patmos. He said to him. 'Write these things to the churches.'

John kept on writing. His pen flew very fast. And then the Lord, when it was nearly finished, said, "John, before you close the book, put in one more invitation. 'The Spirit and the bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst, come. And whosoever will, let him take of the water of life freely' (Revelation 22;17)."

Seeking the lost

While I believe firmly that God knows the decisions people will make, I do not believe He has pre-ordained anyone to spend an eternity in Hell. Ever since the Garden of Eden, God has allowed men and women to make choices.

God gave Jesus a specific purpose. "For the Son of man has come to seek and to save that which was lost" (Luke 19:10). In the parable of the lost sheep (Luke 15:4-7), Jesus reminds us that just as a shepherd must go and search for that one lost sheep, we are to keep seeking that one lost sinner. Why bother if God already knows who is going to heaven or not? Why did Jesus give the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) if we are not to evangelize? And, finally, why would God allow His Son to be crucified on the cross if His death meant nothing?

Pray for the lost to be saved

We need to pray for our lost loved ones by name. We know that it is the will of God for them to be saved (2 Peter 3:9, 1 Timothy 2:3-4). Ask God to bind Satan so that he can no longer blind their minds (2 Corinthians 4:4). Pray that the Holy Spirit will convict them (John 16:8-11). Pray that someone will share the Gospel message with them (Luke 10:2). Pray that the decision will be made now (2) Corinthians 6:2) since tomorrow may be too late.

Thank you

Sue and I are grateful that the Lord entrusted us with the prayer seminar twenty-five years ago and continues to enable us to minister. Through your prayer and financial support, we have been able to touch lives in forty-seven nations (with the workbook translated into many languages), forty-six states, and the District of Columbia.

One of the great blessings as we have gone country to country is to see how the Lord stirs hearts of His children to provide the needed prayer and financial support. Ninety-three families provided \$8,963.36 for South Africa—2006, which exceeded our budget.

You prayed! You gave! God gave the increase! There were fourteen prayer seminars in two provinces in the Zulu Kingdom: Kwa-Zulu Natal and Mpumalanga provinces. I preached three Sundays during the morning worship services. Seventy-five were saved. Miles traveled internally were 2,200. LESLIE PRESENTING CERTIFICATE A VERY MEANINGFUL MOMENT

From the moment we landed on Saturday in Durban (after a 28-hour journey), we were on the move. **Leslie Motsalane** (Director—JGHM-Southern Africa Branch, Welkom, Free State) and his assistant **Abram Mohale** (pastor, Qua Qua), with open arms and smiling faces were there to welcome us. The venue Leslie had established was rigorous with fourteen prayer seminars in two provinces—KwalaZula-Natal and Mpumalanga. We concentrated on the Zulu Kingdom, one rich in history.

We enjoyed the astoundingly beautiful landscape from the far northern sector of the Zulu Kingdom ministering twenty miles from the Swaziland border. There is a unique combination of grasslands, forests, mountains, and plains in this area.

We moved across the two provinces using four cities (Pietermaritzburg, Newcastle, Ermelo, Secunda) as our headquarters and then worked out from them to the adjacent black townships. We concluded by traveling to Leslie's church in Welkom, Free State for the Sunday services. While I do not have the number, many pastors attended. Around seventy-five made professions of faith.

Lighthouses of Prayer

God gave believers in Pakistan a vision to establish Lighthouse of Prayer across their nation to penetrate the spiritual darkness of Islam. God then sent them the prayer seminar ministry to prepare the prayer warriors for the lighthouses.

During the South Africa ministry, our ninth year in South Africa, the Holy Spirit clarified our mission. We are to establish Lighthouses
