## 2022 NIGERIA FOCUS

EMPHASIS: REVIVAL PRAYING

Population: 209,603,600

THE PLAN
Developed by Sunday Congo, Nigeria Coordinator, and
Sunday Bwanhot, SIM USA Director

Since 1986, prayer seminars have been conducted in Nigeria, Africa's most populous nation. The visible impact far exceeds any of the sixty nations. The first seminars were in **Imo State** (Owerri) with the Ibo tribe and the Baptists. Prayer seminar workbooks were translated into the Ibo language.

The 1988 venue was sponsored by Sudan Interior Mission (SIM), Ian Hay, President and their Bible churches known as the Evangelical Church of West Africa (ECWA). There were seminars in each of the Bible colleges and seminars. The climatic moment was in the final seminar in Jos, Plateau State. The Holy Spirit called out Onesimus Sule and Sunday Bwanhot to establish a prayer ministry using the JGHM teaching tools. Their goal was to impact the nation and lead each church to become a praying church. Hundreds of prayer seminars were conducted. Their success was phenomenal and is still going strong. In 1988, headlines of secular newspapers read, "SPIRITUAL AWAKENING SWEEPS NIGERIA." ECWA reported 2.6 million members at that time. Now there are over 10 million. Many of the current leaders came out of the 1988 Jos seminar.

THE PLAN is to greatly expand the prayer movement to ensure it will continue. There are 89 districts to be covered with a minimum of 50 churches in each district and some over 100. In January, the 89 coordinators are being trained. The basic teaching tool is our prayer seminar workbook and Sunday Bwanhot's book, Lord, Teach us to Pray, a contextualization of our prayer seminar. We gave agreed to provide 20,000 "seed" workbooks (10,000 English and 10,000 Hausa). Above all we need prayer support.

Production costs will be \$13,000. Since sharing with our **Doorkeepers** recently, seventeen have given \$2,185. We need 100 contributors. Use the enclosed response envelope and draft the check to **The Prayer Seminar**.

## A Trip Down Memory Lane A Valuable Lesson Learned from a Saint

I consider 1953-58 as my boot camp years in the pastoral ministry. The first few months were spent with Westside Baptist Church, Berea, Kentucky. I'm not sure that these months counted as a "pastor" assignment since I felt too young and inexperienced to be called a "pastor." Nevertheless I was the leader in establishing this congregation including building the initial meeting place (a concrete block facility that was the "basement" of what would be the sanctuary in a few years). When there was a suggestion that I be the pastor," I insisted that a "seasoned man of God" should be called.

Little did I realize that a few days after Westside was formally organized, a pulpit committee from Liberty Avenue Baptist Church would knock at my dormitory door in Pearson Hall, inviting me to be their pastor. I sat there, rather informally attired in my briefs, and incredulous in what I was hearing. That congregation had "split" over some alleged moral issues and the flock of several hundred had scattered. In spite of my age, I believe some of the best years of my twenty-eight year pastoral ministry were those years. My devotion to God and enthusiasm was never stronger." From 1958 until 1962, I was pastor of a well-established congregation, Rosedale Baptist Church, Richmond, Kentucky. It was during these years that I learned to be a "pastor, teacher, evangelist." Showers of blessings began flowing with church growth, most coming into the church through baptism and many by letter from other churches. It was at Rosedale that I meet Martha Sandlin Ogg

(1880-1970), the daughter of Lewis Daniel Sandlin, M.D. (1838-1916) and the widow of Will Ogg (1871-1949). It is as though the brief comments that follow have brought feelings of walking on holy ground. This godly saint taught a young pastor so many valuable lessons. Her eyesight was failing so she wanted "Brother Jim," my esteemed title in her mind, to read and discuss Scripture during every visit. She frequently urged me to memorize Scripture as she had done in earlier years and was still doing. She





said, "I hide the Word in my heart, not only because it will keep me from sin as the psalmist counseled IN **Psalm** 119:11, but it will not be long until my sight is gone and I will no longer be able to read the Bible."

When I left that pastorate to accept a new congregation in Washington Courthouse, Ohio, as a "church planter" serving under the Ohio Baptist Convention and the Home Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention," Mrs. Ogg gave me two gifts. One was her picture with a personal note written on the back. The other was a vase, that she considered her most precious possession. Her father, Dr. Sandlin, had brought it from the 1904 Saint Louis World Fair. She was eighty-one at the time and you can imagine what these items mean to me now that I am eighty-six. In addition, I cherish the greatest gift from my wonderful friend, learning to memorize Scripture. In her memory, I am sharing a bookmark as the first gift to our readers and friends from The Prayer Seminar [founded as J. Gordon Henry Ministries in 1984].

Here is the message written on the back of Mrs. Ogg's photo: "Bro Jim, You will never know what an inspiration you have been to me the past four years. Some of my richest Christian experiences have been during your ministry. I cherish the many visits and heart-to-heart talks we have had in my home and the hospital May the Lord bless your work. Martha Ogg, Age eight-one years."
