

How's Your Walk with the Lord Going?

In reviewing one of the Seed Bed Folders that I have generated over the years, I found a note written to myself many years ago. The Holy Spirit brought the few words alive and placed this thought into one of my mental folders that I carry around, the one labeled "Finishing Well." The note was take time for some fine tuning. This has become a prayer focus as the door for a new year looms closer. Not only do I expect to profit from this exercise, I believe that it will challenge our many readers to do the same. God grant that this may be true.

Take time to fine tune - The Holy Spirit's Impression for 2020

In the early 1980s, I was invited to contribute articles on the Christian life for a monthly publication under the banner heading, "A Study with J. Gordon Henry." One of the first articles was entitled **Take Time to Pray**. The article follows and then some fine tuning comments.

Most Christians put prayer high on their list of failures and deficiencies. What about your personal altar? Is it broken down and deserted? Take measure of your prayer life. What has happened to the practice of prayer in your life?

No believer's spiritual life will ever rise above the level of his prayer life. You are what you are on your knees—nothing more. Regular daily contact with your Source of spiritual life, Jesus Christ Himself, is absolutely necessary.

Average Christians fail in their prayer lives because they do not set apart a definite time and place to meet the Lord

BEGIN THE DAY WITH GOD

My voice shalt thou hear in the morning, O Lord; in the morning will I direct my prayer unto thee, and will look up"

Psalm 5:3.

David was indeed a man "after God's own heart" (1 Samuel 13:14). He made the above promise to God.

For the Christian, it is important how he begins the day. A later poet expressed the same spiritual truth this way:

"So I think I know the secret Learned from many a troubled way.

You must seek God in the morning If you want Him through the day."

-Ralph Cushman.

Jesus set the example for us concerning quiet time. He took time to connect with the Father regularly. Twenty-one times there is reference to Jesus praying, "Then Jesus went with His disciples to a place called Gethsemane, and He said to them, "Sit here while I go over there and pray" (Matthew 26:36). One would think that Jesus, being the very Son of God, would not have needed to pray. But the record says, "In the morning, rising up a great while before day. He went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed (Mark 1:35).

What then, is the secret? Seek God in the morning if you want Him through the day. daily. Would you expect to be healthy if you ate a meal only once a week? Of course not! The same is true of your spiritual life.

Here's a workable plan on how to begin and maintain a morning meeting with the Lord. Sink your roots deeply into a DAILY DEVOTIONAL LIFE. Without a QUIET TIME you will not grow spiritually as you should.

Here are some suggestions for starting your daily time with the Lord:

ESTABLISH IN YOUR MIND THE PRIORITY OF PRAYER. You do what you consider important. You have spent a lifetime developing patterns of behavior that have become habits in your life. In order to establish a prayer time, you will need to develop new habits. As you are in the process of doing this, you will be pulled between old habits and new ones; that's normal, so expect it. Make up your mind that each day you will find a time to be alone with Christ. Set a specific time to meet the Lord in prayer.

DESIGNATE A TIME AND A PLACE. Begin each day with God. If you normally get up at 6 a.m., plan to get up at 5:45 a.m. to have minutes for God. THIS IS A MATTER OF DISCIPLINE. If we follow the example of Jesus, it will be a morning hour. You may need to get to bed earlier so you can meet your appointment with God.

Jesus gave His disciples the model prayer, expressing a manner of praying for us to follow. That prayer does not lend itself to any other time than the early morning. You would not ask God for your daily bread, for example, after your day was over. Neither would you need deliverance from temptation when you are about to go to sleep.

A major reason why it should be the first part of your day is that we should bring God in on the beginnings; we should not wait until we have messed up our day and then bring the pieces for God to put back together.

The place of prayer should be private. Jesus suggested a place that is quiet, secluded, and shut. Designate a place that will be your altar of prayer. Use that place exclusively for your time with God.

Remember, you must in your mind and heart make prayer important enough to schedule a time for prayer in your daily life just as you schedule eating and sleeping. You can do it! Ask God to help you: "Lord, I look forward to meeting You the first thing in the morning for a few minutes. When I awaken, I have an appointment with you"

HOW TO USE THE TIME DAILY. Have a pen and pencil handy. As you read the Word and put the proper information into your mind, you program your day to let Christ be Lord of your life.

Let God speak to you directly through His Word. Read a brief portion and think about what you are reading. Open your heart to God, offering Him the right to teach, to discipline, to direct you as you study.

You will be surprised at what He is ready to do for you.

FINE TUNING

Actually, I believe there are enough thoughts in the article to accomplish its purpose for the readers both then and now. Generally, my style of writing has been to speak from my heart, from the crucible of personal experience, and to anchor thoughts that I share

with Scripture. When I penned the words for "A Study with J. Gordon Henry," there were number-of-words parameters.

Interestingly enough the genesis of the article was from the Prayer Seminar Workbook (p24) that came out of a series of studies on prayer prepared for the 24/7 Prayer Chapel Ministry in Virginia. So there has not been a prayer seminar that did not include these practical suggestions for personal praying.

If you and I were in private conversation, I hope you would ask me "How's Your Walk with the Lord Going" and I could ask you "How's Your Walk with the Lord Going?"

A Sunday in the Blue Ridge Mountains

Sunday, August 31, 1986. I remember it as though it were yesterday. I had traveled from our home in Murfreesboro, Tennessee to Central Virginia to conduct a prayer seminar in Dr. Tom Foster's home church in the Blue Ridge Mountains in Nelson County—the Rockfish Valley Baptist Church, Nellysford. He and his wife, Mary Dale, had become precious friends during my days at Liberty Baptist College (now Liberty University). He held a professorship in business at a university in Oklahoma and had expressed interest in coming to Liberty to begin our business program. Although he did not come, we kept in close touch. The Fosters spent the summer in his childhood home in Nelson County, Virginia.

The excitement was enhanced by having our daughter Melody, a nurse in Lynchburg, to spend the day with me as I shared the seminar. I never dreamed that the time spent there would impact my life so dramatically. Dr. Foster's sister, Catherine Thomas, decided to become a Doorkeeper that day. For years upon years, she was a faithful partner. Now all three—Dr. Foster, Mary Dale, and Catherine—are residents of the Celestial City called Heaven.

That was the day that Josephine Fitzgerald came into my life. She, too, became a Doorkeeper. Without question, the impact that she had on the prayer seminar ministry and my life was unequaled by any other. We became one from day one! She was seventy-seven at the time.

IN MEMORY DOORKEEPER JOSEPHINE FITZGERALD January 13, 1909 January 15, 2009



To begin with, Josephine informed me that God wanted her to write a book. When I said, Well, then you must write a book. She said, I can't write a book. But she did. In fact, she wrote five books. Her first book. published in 1990, was entitled When Thou Walkest Through the Waters. Her other four books are Precious Memories (1994), I Found the Answer . . . I Prayed (1996), We Grow in the Valleys (1998), and Christ Our Burden Bearer (2001). Initially, she wrote in longhand, but someone gave her a typewriter and she learned to type. Many of our long-term Doorkeepers have her books since she insisted in giving a copy to each Doorkeeper family.

For twenty-three years, every few weeks, I had a letter from Josephine, written in her home in the Blue Ridge and later from Alabama where she lived with a daughter and granddaughter during the last years of her life. She always had a Scripture to share—not just the reference, but she wrote out the verse completely. I cherished and was strengthened by her friendship. I knew that she not only prayed for me every morning, but many times during the day. She was our oldest Doorkeeper.

Josephine told her family that she was going to live to be a hundred and then she was going to

go be with the Lord. To celebrate her 100th birthday, family and friends gathered at her home in Alabama. Two days later, Josephine laid down on her bed to sleep and woke up in Heaven. I'm not surprised that this is what happened. Certainly, we miss Josephine on earth. For many years, she had longed for God to take her. On one occasion, she was seriously ill in the University of Virginia Medical Center, actually thought to be at the point of death. However, God raised her up because He wanted her to write another book. The first letter after she returned home began with the words "I'm so disappointed. I thought I was going to Heaven, but here I am back in my earthly home." Well done, good and faithful servant ... enter into the joys of the Lord.

Josephine wanted to share with others what she was learning about prayer. She was especially interested in the international phase of our ministry. Her example in determining what financial support she should give for each trip became known as the Josephine Principle.

One year I promised leaders in Borneo (East Malaysia) that I would return and that we would be responsible for 300 pastors. When Josephine took out her checkbook she begin to write in the amount and began at \$10. When she asked the Lord if this is what He wanted, she said that he told her to add another zero. Ten dollars became one hundred dollars. Again, Lord is this enough? The answer was add another zero. Her check came for \$1,000 with her account of what happened.

One year Josephine shared that

she was to host a prayer seminar in her home in the Blue Ridge Mountains if I would come. It was a memorable time with many people gathering. This reminds me to explain that the Lord had me to make a commitment to never require a certain number for a prayer seminar or answer anyone's question about the amount of support I expected. I explained that we are a faith ministry depending on the Lord to touch hearts related to how much support He wanted them to provide. Adam Nathanson and I have discussed this approach and the meaning of a faith ministry.

The Defender's Study Bible (Now The Henry Morris Study Bible)

Are you ready for a new study Bible? If so, I recommend the <u>Defender's Study Bible</u>, which features OVER 6,400 explanatory footnotes written by **Dr. Henry Morris (1918-2006)**, one of our **Doorkeepers**. Prior to publication, I had the wonderful privilege of serving as a reader for the notes. My life was greatly enriched by the insights of this man of God.

As I have shared over the years, I have used a new study Bible each year since 1977. Several years, it has been **The Defender's Study Bible** (now called the Henry Morris Study Bible). During 2019, this has been my study Bible. Although I greatly profited from serving as a consultant for the notes, each year I have used the Bible as my primary study Bible I am literally amazed at the insights of my dear friend presented in

words/expressions that are clearly understood.

The **Defender's Study Bible** is the only study Bible stressing the defense of the Biblical Christian faith from the perspective of literal creationism and absolute biblical inerrant authority. Dr. Tim LeHage calls it The most valuable Bible resource between two covers. Dr. Herman Austel, Dean, Northwest Baptist Seminary (WA), points out that it contains a wealth of information in historical and scientific matters as well as in prophetic interpretation and spiritual application.

There are eighteen appendices, as well as an index, concordance, center-column references, and maps.

Nineteen days before his death, Dr. Morris inscribed three copies of the New Defender's Study Bible, one for Sue, one for me, and one for me to give to Dr. Jerry Falwell, our mutual friend and colleague. Since he had been hospitalized for some days, it is incredible that he could accomplish this cherished feat.

Sue's inscription read: "For Sue Henry With highest regards in Christ. Henry Morris 2-6-06. Isaiah 40:8-11."

In a recent conversation with a Liberty University student, I asked him if he was acquainted with **Dr**. **Henry Morris**, who was called the father of modern creationism. Much to my chagrin, he confessed that he



had never heard of Dr. Morris. Both of us invested much time and energy in developing the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (he as Chairman of the Board of Directors and as a benefactor that kept TRACS afloat financially during the developing years leading to recognition from the United States Department of Education as an accrediting agency for Christians colleges/universities/ seminaries/graduate schools that believe in the historicity of the first eleven chapters of Genesis including creation, rather than evolution and I as the first full-time Executive Director). How many benefiting from a higher education experience in an institution accredited by TRACS administrator, faculty or staff member, or student know anything about Henry Morris, one of the stars during his life on earth?

Dr. Morris was a prolific author. Although Sue and I have given our libraries to the Northeastern Baptist College, Bennington, Vermont, I kept back many of Dr. Morris' books. Each time a new book was released, he sent Sue and me an inscribed copy (with an appropriate Scripture.

Pray the Scriptures: Paul's Prison Prayers a Model

Through prayer, a believer can touch three worlds: Heaven, Earth, and Hell. When he touches Heaven. his focus is on God the Father (High and Lifted Up) seated on His Throne of Grace. That is worship time. The second world prayer touches is earth, looking toward people and circumstances. This is the time when we work in prayer. The third world is Hell with the focus on Satan. This is the time when we engage in spiritual warfare. We will never win the war if we do not know where the battle is being fought. Victories are won through prayer. Satan is defeated through warfare praying.

It is true that God has provided armor to protect us when we go to battle and the instruction manual for preparation for battle is in the warfare section in Ephesians 6:10-18. Although God has provided the armor, He does not put the armor on for us. By faith put on the whole armor—each piece is vital. The battle is fought in prayer. The first activity mentioned, after the armor is on, is prayer (v 18),

Each of us, while on earth, needs to be interested in touching earth—people and circumstances. Greater works than Jesus did during His earthly sojourn are possible (John 14:12-14). It is at that point a prayer list is crucial. Over the forty years that my main ministry has been teaching believers the purpose and power of prayer (in their individual lives and in their churches) I insist that my students write in the

2019 A Banner Year: International Ministry



During 2019, Adam Nathanson has had an extended ministry (prayer seminars, clinics, preaching) in Brazil, Canada, Chile, Cuba, United States and Venezuela--145 churches. He was advised not to return to their home in Caracas, Venezuela due to the political unrest sweeping the nation. He has used Baltimore, Maryland as his base. He will begin the 2020 work with prayer seminars in Panama City, Panama, in January.

Having traveled throughout Venezuela mobilizing prayer warriors, my heart breaks for this nation. Adam has resumed responsibility for the prayer seminar ministry both in the United States and other nations.

We rejoice with Digmar Garcia for his 2019 work Colombia, Cuba, and the Dominican Republic. It has been thrilling to read his report for 2019 and discern his humble, serving spirit. There were 36 prayer seminars with 2,139 in attemdance. This included 48 pastors and 36 missionaries. There were 84 professions of faith. attending (99 pastors, 64 missionaries). There were 32 professions of faith. Miles traveled were 8,000 miles. Days on





the road totaled 46.

Many of you know that my first overseas ministry was Cuba in January 1960 when I was twenty-four years old. Fifty years later, I returned to First Baptist Church. Placetas, where seventy came to Christ in 1960. Amazingly nine of the seventy were in the 2010 services. Adam and I were thrilled beyond words. At that time, Digmar Garcia was pastor of First Baptist Church. We never dreamed that he would move to a church in Santa Clara and become the director for JGHM: Cuba and Venezuela Branch. God is good.

Martin Shikuku who is director of JGHM: East/Africa Branch, and his team led 29 prayer seminars with 2,597 participants (1,485 Churches; 1,115 pastors; 728 professions of faith; 2,052 miles traveled. A detailed plan to organize prayer warriors in every state in Kenya is being carried out with unusually great success. His van was replaced this year thanks to the special giving of Ropeholder Doorkeepers. Funds were recently provided for 1,000

Swahali and 1,000 Luganda prayer seminar workbooks. His 2020 plan is to focus on Uganda.

A series of prayer seminars have now been completed in major cities in Pakistan. JGHM has been responsible for providing Urdu prayer seminar workbooks and covering basic expenses related to the seminars. Ropeholder Doorkeepers have provided the necessary prayer and financial support. We must understand that for these Christians to build churches, they risk their lives. 100% of these Christians face persecution for their faith. Only 1.6% in Pakistan are Christians, the majority follow Islam. If a Muslim has a problem with a Christian, the Christian is accused of blasphemy against their religion. Such accusation often carries a death sentence, When the invitation came to provide prayer seminars in Pakistan, Silas Yashim (Nigeria) wrote that this is a God thing. Islam is a violent religion. Christians are looked upon as second class citizens. One looses his position when he becomes a Christian and is assigned to menial jobs.

Year after year, prayer seminars have been provided across Nigeria. Othniel Wakili leads the work. assisted by Nickson Matthias. The latest report submitted was January through October 2019: Number of prayer seminars 23; Participants 8,731; Pastors 2,401; Churches 85; Miles traveled 7,300. Othniel and Shem traveled to the dangerous NE mountains, where Muslims dominate. Arrangements were made for them to return to conduct prayer seminars. Ropeholder Doorkeepeers provided the funds for these seminars. We need prayer warriors for this most heavily population African nation.









We continue to be amazed at reports from other nations where the prayer seminar materials are being taught. The above report are the nations that we have targeted to represent the other ones. One goal during 2020, which will likely be the last year for JGHM's leadership, is to mobilize USA churches to adopt these groups. We are depending on our partners to provide a prayer covering for the ongoing work.

intercession section of the Prayer Seminar Workbook in large letters: NO PRAYER LIST, NO PRAYER LIFE! Each day be sure you pray for your family members by name listening and allowing the Holy Spirit to direct your prayer. If you are not praying for your family, you can be sure that no one else is! Remember PRAYER IS THE WORK THAT MUST COME BEFORE ALL OTHER WORK! Sadly there is seldom much time and effort given by the average Christian to prayer work. In fact, most of us do not do enough work in prayer in a year to make a butterfly tired!

Remarkable insights into intercessory prayer come from Paul's self-described "striving in prayer" mode (Romans 15:30, Colossians 2:1,2 and 4:12), an expression that means to the point of exhaustion. This kind of praying is based on the fact that prayer is work demanding time, energy, and effort. A compilation of Paul's prayer list from the epistles is astonishing in its length and geographic scope.

Take time to study Paul's <u>prison</u> <u>prayers</u> recorded in <u>Ephesians</u> 1:15-23, 3:14-21; Philippians 1:9-11; Colossians 1:9-12. You and I may pray these prayers for ourselves knowing that when we do we are praying the will of God since he asks for the very things needed in our lives. We can use them in intercessory prayers for others. The two prayers in Ephesians complement each other.

The first (Ephesians1:15-23) is for enlightenment—knowing what God has done for us and the second (3:14-21) is for enablement—experiencing His blessings.

If your appetite for intercessory praying has been whetted as you read this article, remember that these thoughts are fleshed out in my book, Intercession: Prayer as Work, Remember that the format for the book lends itself to use as a text in Sunday school classes or small groups, as well as for individual study.
