The weekend of May 18-19, 2013, was a very special one for me. The Class of '53 gathered for the sixtieth year reunion of our graduation from White Pine High School. Actually, this building was my learning center, my "academic home," for twelve years (from September 1941 until May 21, 1953). Although there were only twenty-one in my graduating class, the education that I was provided

was superior in every way. I was well prepared for college.

It was my privilege to serve as the editor of the **Pine Cone**, our yearbook. My own copy is full of personal notes that will forever be precious to me. The one from "**Miss Grace**" (teachers were addressed by their first names) **Brotherton** is reflective of the love and ongoing support that the students

Needed: Spiritual renewal in America

The Word of God speaks:

"Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people" (**Proverbs 14:34**). "The wicked shall be turned into hell, and all the nations that forget God" (**Psalms 9:17**).

"And that, knowing the time, that **now it is high time to awake out of sleep**: for now is our salvation nearer than when we first believed. The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light" (**Romans 13:11-12**). "Therefore, He says, Awake, you who sleep, Arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light. See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is" (**Ephesians 5:14-17**).

The face of America is changing at an accelerated rate. Christians were incensed a few years ago when a theologian declared that God is dead and expressed concern for the spiritual condition of our nation. Many began to pray and to return to the Word. The concern did not last, however, and soon we were drifting along once more. **9/11** moved us to understand the need for God and for His protection upon us as a people. Hope was expressed that once again we were moving back toward God and the principles detailed in His Word. In a sense, the sleeping giant simply awakened briefly, turned over, and went back to sleep. The moral erosion continues. For many, morality is relative and there are no absolutes to guide behavior. We are a nation in trouble!

Almost daily, examples in the media remind Christians that a spiritual war is being waged in the United States. November 2003 will likely go down in history as the month when one of the

Chronicles Commission

One of our **Doorkeepers**, **Suzy Kauffmann** (Mrs. Howard), Atlanta, has suggested that it is time for Christians who know the **Great Commission** (**Matthew 28:19-20**) commit themselves, first, to a **Chronicles Commission** (**2 Chronicles 7:14**). I agree wholeheartedly. Until the requisites of this text are met, we are unlikely to fulfill the Great Commission. She asked, "Do you think we, as Christians, are commissioned by God to obey the passage if we want our land healed?" Yes, I do think that and see the value to calling each **Doorkeeper** to accept the **Chronicles Commission**. It is high time to awake and to

most serious attacks has come on America, precipitated internally by the judicial branch of our government, not externally by our nation's enemies.

On Sunday, November 23, 2003, our home church pastor, Jack Barrett (Forest Baptist Church, Forest VA) spoke on the crisis facing America using **Romans 1:18-32** as his text. Using a decision by the Massachusetts' Supreme Court mandating that commonwealth's legislative body accommodate gay marriages within the next six months. He noted that a moral vacuum has been created and that Christians have sat on the sidelines with the attitude that we don't want to be judgmental. He pointed out that many of our prevailing attitudes simply do not square with the Word of God. Speaking from **Romans 1**, Pastor Jack encouraged His flock to respond in four ways:

1. With common sense (**vv 26-27**). Many of the actions being taken in America are unnatural in the light of **Genesis 1:27-28**.
2. With genuine concern (**vv 26-32**). There are consequences to sin as is illustrated by David's agony described in **Psalms 51** and **Psalms 32**. We need to be concerned for people who are blind and have gone astray. Jesus is our model. We need to reach out with love to bring sinners to a saving knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ remembering Jesus died for sinners. We cannot put our heads in the sand. Otherwise, we are approving those who practice ungodliness and are headed for eternal death.
3. With compassion. We must love sinners into the kingdom of God. Lifestyles change when one

becomes a Christian and begins to walk with God. This is our hope.

4. As a community, we must get engaged and involved. It is time to use our voice in our society and with our elected officials.

What can Christians do to make a difference? What can you do? We must pray for spiritual renewal in America; then we must put legs to our prayers and be willing to take steps that will make a difference. The Word of God provides the insights that are needed for effective praying and for influencing the nation. It is time to act before the door is closed and there is no opportunity to stand for Christ and His Word in a free nation.

Pastor Jack's message was delivered almost ten years ago. What has transpired in the past decade is incredible. There is no doubt that a nation is a reflection of the values of the people. As you read my account of my experience in White Pine School (pages one and twelve), you will see an example of the influence of the Judeo-Christian values that guided our nation for over two hundred years and formed its moral fiber. In our homes, our schools, and our culture, we knew what was right and what was wrong.

There is abundant evidence that many Americans have lost their moral bearings and no longer hold the values that made our nation great. **Satan is out to destroy America and has mobilized his forces to do so.** During the past few months, Christians and conservatives are looked upon as "extremists." Opponents of abortion, same-sex marriage, illegal immigration are singled out as dangerous. Scandals are being uncovered almost daily. IRS has demanded pro-lifers reveal "the

content of their prayers." The cover of the June issue of a conservative publication has a picture of a white church building, one with steeple reaching into the sky, with these shocking words emblazoned: "**THE MOTHER OF ALL SCANDALS ... OBAMA'S WAR ON CHRISTIANS.**"

Only those who have their heads buried in the sand are in the dark on this matter. Will it soon become a crime to "let your light shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father in heaven" (**Matthew 5:16**)? How long before we are required to put our lights under a basket? The bottom line is that we are in trouble and the people of God must do something.

At a time that a spiritual awakening is so direly needed in the United States of America, there is little observable interest in revival. Historically, Southern Baptist churches scheduled two revival meetings each year. Generally, these were two-week meetings. One of my friends explained that the first week was directed toward God's people. He spoke of a "burden for unsaved people" as being necessary for a moving of God. After the "burden" came, emphasis shifted to evangelism. When Joel encouraged the priests to "weep between the porch and the altar" that became a directive watch cry for pastors and evangelists. After a burden was in the hearts of the leadership, it was not long until the same pathos was exhibited in the people. It was then that people gathered with a sense of expectancy knowing that God was going to do the extraordinary.

In past years, I have spoken and written of the spiritual awakening that is needed in our nation. As I have

prayed about what our ministry can do in 2013, the answer was to go back to that theme and provide basic teaching in the **Reflector**. Will you, my brothers and sisters, join with me in intercession for our great nation? In Isaiah's day, God looked down from Heaven looking for intercessors. The event is recorded in **Isaiah 59:16**: "And [God] saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no intercessor." Will you become an intercessor for America? Will you focus the power of God on America? That is our privilege. We are to ask and then leave the results up to a just and merciful God.

[Related to salvation, we must come through Jesus](#): "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life; no man cometh to the Father, but by Me" (**John 14:6**). Our access to the Father is Jesus. Acknowledge that when you begin to pray and keep Him included as you pray!

One of the blessings that the Lord has provided over the past fifty-nine years is to touch lives through the **Reflector**. Often someone lets us know that some thought that we shared helped him/her along life's journey. I'm glad this is so. When Paul wrote to the Corinthian believers, he said: "Not that we have dominion over your faith, but are **HELPERS OF YOUR JOY**; for by faith you stand" (**2 Corinthians 1:24**). "Helpers of your joy" if you read the verse too quickly, you can easily miss this central phrase. In fact, I had read it many times, but it was not until April 1986 that the Holy Spirit spoke to me a plain word. Through the printed and verbal ministries, we are to be **HELPERS OF JOY**.

Often I take time in a prayer seminar to acknowledge that “my purpose in being here is to encourage, not discourage; to build you and the people up, not tear you down; to be a stepping stone, not a stumbling block.” This does not mean that our time together will be altogether comfortable. In fact the opposite is often true. As the Word is taught, the Holy Spirit begins to speak the message that each person needs to hear. All too often, a person has come wanting a “praise the Lord! Hallelujah! Glory to God!” experience only to find out the proper response is not “Amen!”, but “Oh, me!” This is the type of experience that most of us need. It is that point that we hear what God wants us to hear. The Holy Spirit may say, “You are not in the Word for your food!” OR “You don’t have a prayer life yet!” OR “You never share your faith!” OR “You are not right in your giving!” OR “You have unconfessed and unforsaken sins!” OR “You are not right with others!” It is only when we are confronted that we are in a position to repent, confess, receive forgiveness and cleansing, have our direction changed, and are ready to surrender to the Holy Spirit. It is at this point that the joy of God’s salvation will be there to bless you.

President Lincoln's Proclamation for a Day Of National Humiliation, Fasting and Prayer 1863

By His Excellency, Abraham Lincoln, President of the U.S.A.

WHEREAS, The Senate of the United States, devoutly recognizing the Supreme authority and just government of Almighty God in all the affairs of men and nations, has, by a resolution, requested the President to designate and set apart a day for National prayer and humiliation.

And WHEREAS, it is the duty of nations, as well as of men, to own their dependence upon the overruling power of God, to confess their sins and transgressions, in humble sorrow, yet with assured hope that genuine repentance will lead to mercy and pardon, and to recognize the sublime truth announced in the Holy Scriptures and proven by all history, that those nations only are blessed whose God is the Lord.

And, inasmuch as we know that by His Divine law, nations, like individuals, are subjected to punishments and chastisements in this world, may we not justly fear that the awful calamity of civil war, which now desolates the land, may be but a punishment inflicted upon us for our presumptuous sins, to the needful end of our national reformation as a whole people?

We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of Heaven. We have been preserved these many years in peace and prosperity. We have grown in numbers, wealth, and power as no other national has ever grown.

But We Have Forgotten God

We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace, and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us; And have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us!

It behooves us, then, to humble ourselves before the offended Power, to confess our national sins, and to pray to the God who made us!

Now, therefore, in compliance with the request, and fully concurring in the views of the Senate, I do, by this my proclamation, designate and set apart Thursday, the 30th day of April, 1863, as a day of National Humiliation, Fasting, and Prayer. And I do hereby request that all the people to abstain on this day

from their ordinary secular pursuits, and to unite, at their several places of public worship and their respective homes, in keeping the day holy to the Lord, and devoted to the humble discharge of the religious duties proper to that solemn occasion.

All this being done, in sincerity and truth, let us then rest humbly in the hope, authorized by the Divine teachings, that the united cry of the Nation will be heard on high, and answered with blessings, no less the pardon of our national sins, and the restoration of our now divided and suffering country to its former happy condition of unity and peace.

were given: "Dear James, I am glad to know that you are a senior and to know you are a capable person. Of course one watches students who prove to have special talents, and you did have in the first grade, and of course, still have. I am sure that you will always be the best person you can be a useful citizen wherever you go. I wish you the very best in life. Affectionally, **Grace Brotherton.**"

Y. J. McAndrew, my football coach who later became the Jefferson County superintendent of schools, wished me "success and happiness. May you always continue the principles that you now believe." It is interesting how many of my classmates and teachers encouraged me to stick with my "strong beliefs and strong faith." Since I did not become a Christian until I was in the eighth grade and did not attend church regularly before that time, I contribute the emphasis placed on Bible reading and prayer to begin each school day as a major factor in my moral and ethical foundation. White Pine High had a Bible class. Since **Deane Bell Harrison** (Mrs. John), one of my two "master" teachers taught this class, I grew by leaps and bounds in my knowledge and understanding of the Scriptures. Coupled with the influence of my church (Bible-believing, Bible-teaching, Bible-practicing), I soon solidified my basic beliefs that have served me well for the past six decades.

The "master" teacher who

influenced me the most was **Dorothy Spickard**. She expected me to be an excellent student and would settle for nothing less. Since she was a graduate of Berea College in Kentucky, I wanted to go there. She had studied at Duke University and I dreamed of going there. Through God's goodness, I was able to study at both institutions. I became a teacher because of Miss Spickard. Her note in the yearbook was one that motivated my academic career:

"Dear James, I have enjoyed working with you during the past four years. Your interest in history has made many class periods a special challenge to me. May you keep your vital interest in world affairs and have as successful college career as you have had in high school. Sincerely,

Dorothy Spickard."

Embedded in the **Pine Cone '53** are nuggets of a legacy that I consider unparalleled and a gift from a Father in Heaven who loves and made provisions for me. Basically, I learned how to learn and mastered organizational and practical skills that have served me well both personally and professionally. Our principal, **Mrs. Ross Powers**, taught typing. When I wanted to take a second year, she said "no" that one year was all I needed since my fingers sped along the keys and would only improve through future use. She was right! Even the typing skills have served me well. God has been good to me in every way!
