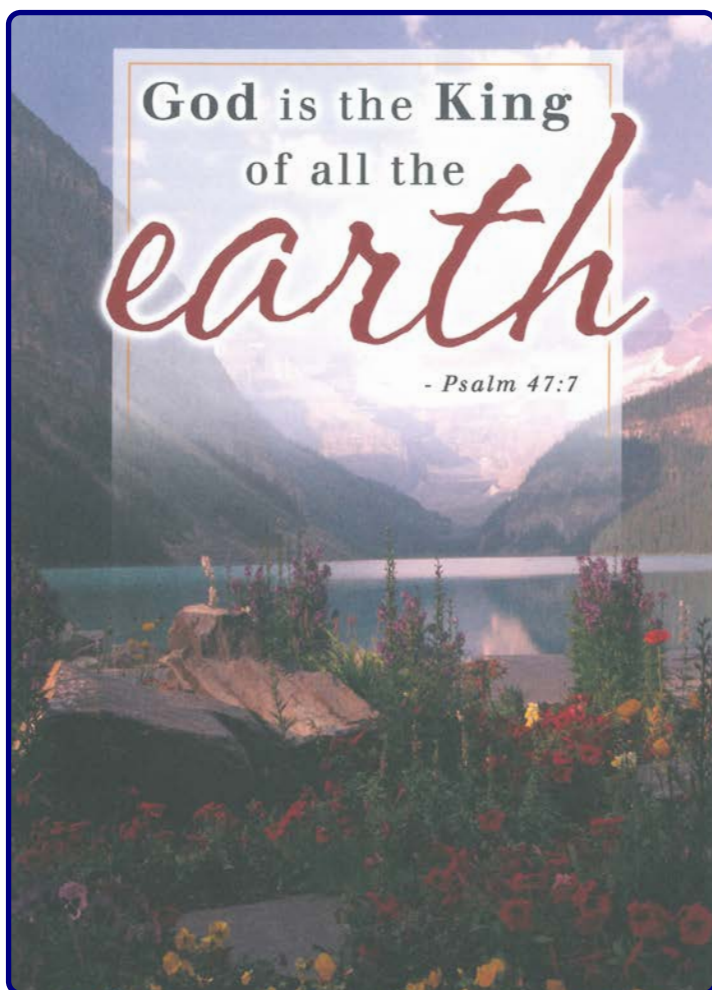

WORSHIP IN HOLINESS



IT'S TIME TO GIVE PRAISES
TO THE ROCK OF ALL AGES

"Oh, worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness!"
1 Chronicles 16:29c

ADORATION; PRAYER AS WORSHIP

Prayer has various elements. It includes worship, praise, thanksgiving, confession, petitions for our own needs, and intercession for the needs of others. In the six-hour prayer seminar, the basic teaching tool is the Prayer Seminar Workbook, a thirty-page publication. There are ten sessions (sections) to cover. We began with a focus on What is prayer? An effort is made to establish that after one becomes a Christian, God expects us to pray.

The presentation of the elements follows an acronym, easy to remember: **A-C-T-S** and is laid out in Session Five, **A-C-T-S. PERSONAL PRAYING**. Of course, this is not the only place that we deal with A-doration, C-onfession, T-hanksgiving, S-eeking (1) for self, petition and (2) for others, intercession.

Worship and praise are laid out under the A-doration element. The focus of worship is God Himself. Worship is the communion of the spirit-soul with God. It is lifting our hearts to Him in adoration. It is bowing in reverence before Him. The Old English (Anglo-Saxon) expression of worship is worthship. Later it was shortened to worship. Worship draws our heart to God, the only worthy object of our worship.

Jesus emphasized the importance of worship when He gave the **Model Prayer**, usually called The Lord's Prayer. My preference is to use "The Model Prayer", the title I chose for a book giving an in-depth look at His instruction. Jesus responded to the request of one of His disciples who ask Him to teach them how to

pray. In simple, easily understood language, Jesus laid out a pattern for praying. When you pray, He said, Pray like this. The prayer, then, is not so much a prayer to pray in repetition, it is a prayer that teaches us how to pray. This does not mean a believer can never pray this prayer, but only when his heart is in it, not just remote memory.

The Model Prayer teaches how to organize your praying. Divide it into two halves and focus on the pronouns. In the first half, the pronoun is Thou, and in the second half, it is on us and our. The first half deals with a focus on God Himself—Father ... in Heaven ... hallowed by Thy name .. Thy Kingdom come ... Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. In the second half, we have a section with a focus on us. Few Christians devote one-half of their praying to worship and praise God for who He is. A person has many requests to ask of God that seem urgent to present. You will often find when you give preeminence to worship and praise that many things on your request list vanish.

Worship: Occupied only with God Himself. . . . For He is thy Lord, and worship thou Him (**Psalm 45:11**). He is the LORD. The psalmist David wrote: Bless the Lord, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless His holy name (**Psalm 103:1**). In worship, we ask nothing of Him; we focus our mind on God and who God is.

As our hearts become quiet in worship, we become aware of the reality of His presence. Worship gives God His rightful place in our lives and puts us in our rightful place at His feet. As we quietly meditate on who He is, our hearts

will begin to overflow in praise for all He has done. The Bible says, . . . Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised . . . (Psalm 145:3). Our hearts will shout with praise. I will call upon the Lord, who is worthy to be praised (Psalm 18:3).

Not only are we to praise God when things are going smoothly, but also when trouble comes. The psalmist says, I will bless the Lord at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth (Psalm 34:1). We need to shift our focus from our circumstances to the One who is with us in our circumstances. We need to take our eyes off our problem, and put them on the Problem-Solver.

One day the king of England entered a room where a group of British noblemen were gathered. Although the noblemen were personal friends of the king, they honored him as their king by standing. Sit down, gentlemen, he said to them. You are my personal friends. Then he added in jest, After all, I am not the Lord. One of the gentlemen replied, No sir, if you were the Lord, we would not stand to our feet. We would fall to our knees.

Time and space allow only for a few brief words about worship and praise. If you want to explore the topic further, and I hope you do, you might want to request a copy of my book, **Adoration: Prayer as Worship**.

To worship the Lord in the beauty of His holiness is to worship God in the adornment, enrichment, and enhancement of His "otherness" and sacredness. He is so separate and set apart from all that He created. He is the Holy One--that

is His crowning attribute that sums up all of His attributes. The holiness of God is the lyric and theme of the songs of Heaven sung by angels, seraphim, and cherubim (Isaiah 6:2; Revelation 4:8). To worship God in the beauty of holiness keeps our worship transcendent and God-centered; that is, unrestricted by the world's style and unpolluted by human self-centeredness.

May is a month with thirty-one days. Why not examine your personal daily prayer life. How much time do you give to worship and praise with focus on God the Father Himself, as Jesus taught? I am including a wonderful document from my personal file on worship and praise. Thirty-one attributes of God are listed, one for each day of the month. For the next few months, I encourage you to begin your prayer time reflecting on one of the verses. When a month has fewer than thirty-one days, you can double up. You will begin a journey that will make a difference in time and eternity.

Program of Praise to the Lord!

A few years ago **Bob Hostetler** developed a "program of Praise" that has proven wonderfully helpful. He explained, "I focus on one attribute of my awesome God and Father each day, using the Scripture-based sentences as **praise starters**. At the end of the month, I start the list over, combining traits when the month is shorter than 31 days." The following is excerpted from **Pray! Magazine, Issue #12**.

1. **God the Creator**. "Creator God, I praise You because "You made the heavens, even the highest heavens, and all their starry host, the earth and all that is on it, the seas and all that is in them. You give life to everything, and the multitudes of heaven worship You" (**Nehemiah 9:6**).
2. **The Only God**. "God, I praise You because You are the LORD, and there is no other; apart from [You] there is no God" (**Isaiah 45:5**).
3. **The Almighty God**. "O LORD, God Almighty, who is like You? You are mighty, O LORD, and your faithfulness surrounds You" (**Psalms 89:8**).
4. **The Everlasting Father, the Ancient of Days**. "I praise You, Lord as the 'Ancient of Days' (**Daniel 7:9**), the Everlasting Father' (**Isaiah 9:6**) who lives forever and ever,"
5. **A Loving God**. "I praise You because You are a loving God, whose very nature is love" (**1 John 4:6**).
6. **A God of Justice**. "Lord, I praise and magnify You, who is 'just and the One who justifies those who have faith in Jesus'" (**Romans 3:26**).
7. **A Faithful God**. "Heavenly Father, I give You my praise and adoration because You are a 'faithful God, keeping [Your] covenant of love to a thousand generations of those who love [You] and keep [Your] commandments'" (**Deuteronomy 7:9**).
8. **A Merciful God**. "Lord, I praise and magnify You, who is 'just and the One who justifies those who have faith in Jesus'" (**Romans 3:26**).
9. **God, My Refuge, My Fortress**. "I praise You, Lord, for You are 'my mighty rock, my refuge'" (**Psalms 62:7**).
10. **A Patient Persevering God**. "Father, I praise You because You are patient with [Your] children], not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance" (**2 Peter 3:9**).
11. **Eternal, Serving God**. "I give praise to You, Father, 'the only God our Savior.' To You be glory, majesty, power and authority, through Jesus Christ our Lord, before all ages, now and forevermore" (**Jude 25**).
12. **The Holy One**. "Holy, holy, holy [are You] Lord God Almighty, who was, and is, and is to come" (**Revelation 4:8**).
13. **A Personal God**. "I praise You, God, because You are a personal God, who gives me the honor of knowing You personally, even inviting me to feast at Your kingdom's table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob" (**Matthew 8:11**).
14. **A Giving God**. "All praise and honor be Yours, O God, because You are a generous God, who did even stop short of giving Your own Son" (**John 3:16**).

**God is seeking those who will worship
Him in spirit and in truth.**

15. **A Provider God.** “I praise You today, Lord, as my *Jehovah-Jireh* (the Lord Will Provide) who makes all grace abound to in me and generously provides all I need” (2 Corinthians 9:8).
16. **God, My Shepherd.** “I bless Your name and praise You as my *Jehovah-Rohi* (The Lord My Shepherd), who will shepherd me and guide me in the paths of righteousness for Your name’s sake” (Psalm 23:1-3).
17. **God, My Victory.** “Praise to You, my God, because You are my *Jehovah-Nissi* (The Lord My Banner), God, my victory, ‘who always leads [me] in triumphal procession in Christ” (2 Corinthians 2:14).
18. **God, My Peace.** “I praise You with all my heart, Lord, because You are my *Jehovah-Shalom* (The Lord Our Peace), ‘the God of peace [Who] will soon crush Satan under [my] feet” (Romans 16:20).
19. **The God Who Heals.** “Father, I praise You because You are *Jehovah-Rophe* (The God Who Heals) who heals me” (Exodus 15:26]
20. **The God of All Comfort.** “Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion, and the God of all comfort” (2 Corinthians 1:3).
21. **The God of Miracles.** “Lord, I praise You because You are the God who performs miracles; You display Your power among the peoples” (Psalm 77:14).
22. **A Forgiving God.** “”I want to bless You with praise, Father, because You are a forgiving God, gracious and compassionate, slow to anger, and abounding in love” (Nehemiah 9:17).
23. **The Burden Bearer.** “”Praise be to the Lord, to God [my] Savior who daily bears [my] burdens” (Psalm 68:19).
24. **A Faithful God.** “”I praise You because ‘Your love, O Lord, reaches to the heavens, Your faithfulness to the skies’ (Psalm 36:5), and ‘great is Your faithfulness” (Lamentations 3:23).
25. **King of kings and Lord of lords.** “All honor and praise be to You, my God, ‘the blessed and only Ruler, the King of kings and Lord of lords, who alone is immortal and who lives in unapproachable light” (1 Timothy 6:15).
26. **God the Liberator.** “”I will praise You because You are my help and my deliverer, O Lord” (Psalm 70:5).
27. **The Lifter of My Head.** “Father God, I praise You because You are a shield around me, O LORD; You bestow glory on me and lift up my head when I am weary or despised” (Psalm 3:5).
28. **God of Light.** “”I praise You, Lord, because you are ‘my light and my salvation’ (Psalm 27:1), and because You know what lies in darkness, and light dwells with You” (Daniel 2:2).
29. **God of Joy.** “I give You praise, O LORD, because you have granted [me] eternal blessings and made [me] glad with the joy of Your presence” (Psalm 21:6).
30. **The God Who Answers Prayer.** “I praise and honor You, Father, because You are a God who loves to answer prayer and who begins to answer ever before I pray” (Isaiah 65:24).
31. **The God of All the Earth.** “I praise and adore You, Lord, as the Holy One of Israel ... [my] Redeemer ... the God of all the earth” (Isaiah 54:5).

Oh, worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness!

When D. L. Moody's church in Chicago lay in ashes, he went over to England, in 1872, not to preach, but to listen to others preach while his new church was being built.

One Sunday morning he was prevailed upon to preach in a London pulpit. But somehow the spiritual atmosphere was lacking. He confessed afterwards that he never had such a hard time preaching in his life. Then the awful thought came to him that he had to preach again at night, and only the fact that he had given the promise to do so kept him faithful to the engagement.

But when Mr. Moody entered the pulpit at night, and faced the crowded congregation, he was conscience of a new atmosphere. "The powers of an unseen world seemed to have fallen upon the audience. As he concluded he said, "If there is a man or woman here who will tonight accept Jesus Christ, please stand up," At once about 500 people rose to their feet.

Thinking that there must be some mistake, he asked the people to be seated, and then, in order that there might be no possible

misunderstanding, he repeated the invitation, couching it in even more definite and difficult terms. Again the same number rose. Still thinking that something must be wrong, Mr. Moody for the second time, asked the standing people to be seated, and then he invited all who really meant to accept Christ to pass into the vestry.

Fully 500 people did as requested, and that was the beginning of a revival in that church and neighborhood.

The sequel, however must be given, or our purpose in relating the incident will be defeated. When Mr. Moody preached at the morning service there was a woman in the congregation who had an invalid sister. On her return home she told the invalid that the preacher had been a Mr. Moody from Chicago, and on hearing this she turned pale. "What," she said. "Mr. Moody from Chicago! I read about him sometime ago in an American paper and I have been praying God to send him to London, and to our church. Now sister, go out of the room, lock the door, send me no dinner; no matter who comes, don't let them see me. I am going to spend the whole afternoon, and evening in prayer." God, Who ever delights to answer prayer, poured out His Spirit in mighty power!

A Tribute to Mother

Willie Clark King Troutman
(Mrs. Rollie A.)

March 13, 1911–November 26,
1992

You can judge a person by what she loves! Having been in the Troutman family three and one-half decades, my own memories are intensely active as I wander down reminiscent trail to recall thirty-six years of observation of a very remarkable woman, wife, mother, grandmother, and great-grandmother—my mother-in-law—**Willie Clark King Troutman.**

1. She loved God the Father, God the Son the Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit as revealed in Creation, the Word of God, and her daily walk with them. Never was there a question about that which motivated her on a daily basis.

You can judge a person by what she loves! Mrs. Troutman loved the Lord!

2. She loved the written Word, the Bible—to hear, read, study, memorize, and meditate—and to talk about it. Whether it was the Scripture itself, sermons written in the Sword of the Lord or messages over the radio or diligent, formal study to prepare to teach her Sunday school class or informal study to feed her soul, she was never far from the Bible. She knew the Scriptures by heart and often there were opportunities for in-depth discussion of the meat of the Word in spiritual maturity far beyond what one would expect of a woman living in Troutman Hills, McLean County, Kentucky. She never settled for the milk of the

Word, but wanted to understand the deep things of the Lord. For her, great truths were settled because of the plain teaching of the Bible.

During the long months of winding down her earthly sojourn, Sue spent time reading Scriptures to her. Often, she needed only to begin a verse and her mother would finish it! Her long years of hiding the Word in her heart served her well.

Christian literature was important to her and her mailbox was full of publications which she read and frequently passed on to others. Often I have returned home from a visit with many wonderful articles to study.

You can judge a person by what she loves! Mrs. Rollie A. Troutman loved the Word!

3. She loved her church. Assembling together at Old Buck Creek Baptist Church was important to her and she wanted to keep the doors open. Even when health began to fail, she wanted to be carried to the church. I can see her now dressed up in her church clothes with eyes that were sparkling and twinkling and a smile on her lips as she set out for church. She loved her pastor and had always an encouraging word. Singing, praying, giving, hearing the Word preached delighted her heart.

You can judge a person by what she loves! Willie Troutman loved the church of the Lord Jesus Christ.

4. She loved the causes of the Lord Jesus Christ. Her radio was tuned in to Ernest I. Reveal, Evansville Rescue Mission, and she talked of her interest in this ministry. All during the child-rearing years, the

day started at 6:15 a.m. with Cadle Tabernacle's Nation's Family Prayer Period with a message by B. R. Lakin. Ere you left your room this morning, Did you think to pray? drifted through her home as the children prepared for the day. Back to the Bible and Theodore Epp were favorites. A few years ago when I conducted a prayer seminar for the staff of Back to the Bible, she was delighted. She was a staunch supporter of Dr. John R. Rice and the Sword of the Lord. Often she shared thoughts from the Sword—and sermons. The Old Time Gospel Hour became an item of interest when my family and I moved to Lynchburg, Virginia, to assist Dr. Jerry Falwell in establishing Liberty Baptist College. Her checkbook entries reflected her commitment.

Her partnership in the prayer seminar ministry in faithful giving and praying which has resulted in providing around 520 prayer seminars around the world has been remarkable. There has never been any doubt that she walked in her heart with Sue and me mile by mile.

You can judge a person by what she loves! Grandma Troutman loved the causes of the Lord Jesus Christ.

5. She loved her nation and her Kentucky. She expressed her concern for the moral decline of her country and felt that Kentucky was the best. She loved Troutman Hills and often joked that she was blessed by having several addresses starting with Livia and never having moved! She enjoyed her flowers and her garden!

You can judge a person by what she loves! Willie Clark King Troutman loved her land.

6. Then, she loved her family. Her husband of sixty-one years. Thirteen children. 27 grandchildren. 20 great-grandchildren. She had her family in her heart, in her mind, and in her prayers constantly. Their joys and victories were her joys and victories. Their sadnesses and defeats were her sadnesses and defeats. Her faith never wavered. Her interest reflected itself in constant letter-writing.

My fascination with her came during my first visit in 1956. She was prepared with a table laden with delectable foods including a pineapple pudding. When we sat at the table, she expressed her appreciation to have a young preacher at her table, but she stated that she always served the most important one in her home first—her husband. Then the preacher would be served. Her devotion to Pap was unparalleled and touched my own heart more than words can tell.

Having her family gather for a Thanksgiving feast and for Christmas were highlights of her life for many years. As the grandchildren came, it was amazing that each grandchild was on her shopping list for Christmas—even when the number grew large. When others were asleep, she was still up working. She is the only person that I ever saw who gave herself so fully that she could fall asleep with a cup of coffee in her hand!

She enjoyed having her grandchildren visit her. It is said that children need to learn twenty percent of their life's values from grandparents. Mrs. Troutman was a teacher, whether it was teaching a daughter-in-law to make gravy without lumps or her granddaughter,

Melody, how to cook using a pinch of this and a dash of that. Although Scrabble was her favorite game, she knew how to play a good game of Husker Doo. She knew how to listen and encourage.

Soon time will pass and life will go on with routines and other crises. Let it be said, however, that the legacy of Mrs. Rollie A. Troutman (Willie Clark King) is one which will live on in the lives of many of us who have walked with her and were the recipients of her influence and good will. Our Lord said that when a believer does well that He will say Well done, good and faithful servant. In my heart, there is assurance that Mrs. Troutman did well and will hear the accolade!

Genesis 2:7 and 1 Thessalonians 5:23. A person is soul, spirit, and body. The body is the tabernacle that houses the person who is soul-spirit. Soul is mind, emotion, and will. The spirit is that part where the control seat is and where the Holy Spirit makes His residence when a person comes to Christ. The spirit of man died to God when Adam sinned (Genesis 3), but comes alive when a person is born again (John 3). The body and soul are not born again, but it is possible when we allow the Holy Spirit to control our lives for body and soul (mind, emotions, and will) to be controlled by the Holy Spirit. That is the goal of all of us.

The word death means separation when the person who lives inside the body (the real person) moves out. The Christian goes through the first heavens where the birds fly through the second heaven where the stars are and into the third heaven where Jesus is. Paul clearly tells us this in 2 Corinthians 5:1,8 when he says when this earthly house of this tabernacle is dissolved (that is, the earthly body), we have a body not made

by hands eternal in the heavens (v 1). He climaxes this by revealing that to be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord (v 8).

So, what happened on Thanksgiving afternoon, November 26, 1992 was that Willie Troutman moved out of her earthly house (escorted by angels, by the way!), soared through the first and second heavens, and entered into the presence of the Lord in all its glory and splendor—in fact so great it is that eye hath not seen, ear hath not heard, nor even entered into the minds of men the things He has laid up for His children (1 Corinthians 2:9). At the same time, her death was precious in the sight of the Lord (Psalm 116:15).

The real person who moves into Heaven is fully conscious and is substantive. Therefore in Heaven, she will know and be known (1 Corinthians 13:12). I believe when Mrs. Troutman arrived home—not only our Lord Jesus Christ greeted her, but Genie, Ann, Grant Wade and other loved ones as well!

But that is not the end! One day the Lord Jesus Christ will return. When He does, He will bring into the air with Him those who have already gone to Heaven. Down on earth, the dead will rise first (1 Thessalonians 3:13-18) which means that those bodies which have been laid aside will now come to resurrection (the word resurrection means stand up straight). Those resurrection bodies will move into the air and

the folks from Heaven will move back into their bodies. But that is not the rest of the story. It will be at that moment that the Lord will touch those resurrected bodies and make them glorified ones—bodies which will be just like Jesus' body (1 John 3:2-3). Thus shall we ever be with the Lord! Praise God!

Now as for those who are left behind, remember that Jesus promised that He would never leave us comfortless which is a Greek word—literally orphans (John 14:18). You and I are not orphans because the Holy Spirit is the Comforter Who came when Jesus returned to Heaven (John 14:16) to be the Paraclete (which is the Greek word translated Comforter) and literally means One called along side to help—our Helper. Then in verse 17, Jesus explained to His disciples there in the Upper Room just hours before His death on the cross, that when the Holy Spirit came that He would be in us. What more can we ask! Expect the Holy Spirit to represent the Lord Jesus Christ well to meet your every need. Expect the Scriptures to come alive as never before as the Holy Spirit applies those Scriptures to your hearts. I know that He will.

A Mother's Love

A young mother set her feet on the pathway of life. Is the way long? she asked.

And her guide said, Yes, and the way is hard and you will be old before you reach the end of it, but the end will be better than the beginning. But the young mother was happy and would not believe that anything could be better than these years. So she played with her children and gathered flowers for them along the way and bathed with them in the clear springs. The sun shone on them and life was good and the young mother cried, Nothing will be lovelier than this.

Then the night came and the storms and the path was dark and the children shook with fear and cold. And the mother drew them close and covered them with her mantle, and the children said, Oh, mother, we are not afraid, for you are near and we know that no harm can come to us. And the mother said, This is better than the brightness of the day, for I have taught my children courage.

And the morning came and there was a hill ahead, and the children climbed and grew weary, and the mother was weary too, but at all times she said to the children, A little patience and we are there. So the children climbed and climbed and when they reached the top, they said, Mother, we could not have done it without you. And when the mother lay down to sleep that night, she looked up at the stars and said, This is a better day than the last, for my children have learned fortitude in the face of hardness. Yesterday,

I gave them courage—today I gave them strength.

And the next day the strange clouds came, clouds of war and hate and evil. And the children groped and stumbled, but the mother said, Look up. Lift up your eyes to the Light And the children looked up and saw above the clouds the Everlasting Glory and it guided them and brought them beyond the darkness. And that night the mother said, This is the best day of all, for I have shown my children God.

And the days went on and the years and the mother grew old, and she was little and bent. But her children were tall and strong and walked with courage.
