



September is my month!

The month of my physical birth (September 30, 1935), my spiritual birth (September 24, 1948), the month that I began my work as a pastor (September 1953), the month that I conducted the first prayer seminar outside my own pastorates (Madison Baptist Church, Madison NJ September 5-8, 1980), the month that I was inaugurated president of Northeastern Bible College (September 27, 1980), the month that the prayer seminar moved into its own facilities in Murfreesboro, Tennessee in 1984.

I am a Henry. One of my heroes is a Henry-Patrick Henry (May 29, 1736-June 6, 1799)-who is memorialized at Red Hill, a short distance from Lynchburg, Virginia, (where Sue and I have resided since April 2002). He was a follower of Christ and a man of faith. On November 20, 1798, in his last will and testament, Patrick Henry wrote: "This is all the inheritance I give to my dear family. The religion of Christ will give them one which will make them rich indeed."



Praying in the Name of Jesus

One of the nine sessions in the Prayer Seminar Workbook is entitled Praying in the Name of Jesus. This study follows basic, foundational information provided in Session One: What is Prayer? A brief recap of that information is our working definition of prayer (page 4): PRAYER IS COMING TO THE FATHER THROUGH THE SON IN THE POWER OF THE HOLY SPIRIT FOR SELF (PETITION) AND OTHERS (INTERCESSION).

How do we know that Prayer is coming to the Father? We need go no farther than to review the pattern Jesus gave His disciples in what is commonly known as The Lord's Prayer or the Model Prayer. Personally, I prefer the latter designation and have written a book entitled THE MODEL PRAYER. The prayer is not so much a prayer to be prayed as a prayer to teach us how to pray. Jesus began his instruction by saying, "When you pray, pray like this: 'OUR FATHER which art in Heaven, hallowed by Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven." (Matthew 6:9-13, Luke 11:2-4)

Where is the Father? Certainly His presence covers the whole universe but He is seated on His throne of majesty in Heaven. The lead-in paragraph in the Prayer Seminar Workbook to this key building block, my working definition of biblical praying, follows: "Isn't it time that we who easily trust the word of our fellowmen would begin to trust our Lord and His Word? A <u>major truth to learn is where</u> we are when we are praying. The problem of mind wandering and loss of concentration can easily be dissolved by knowing where we are as we pray. You see prayer is not bringing God down to get in on what we are up to at all; it is not even going into the garden where the dew is still on the roses!"

Then using **Revelation 4:1-2**, we establish there is a THRONE ROOM in Heaven. John saw a door opened into Heaven, and heard a voice inviting him to come in. In Heaven, John

saw an occupied throne. Not only is the Father on His throne, Jesus is seated at His right hand (the position of honor and authority). Any serious believer would do well to spend time with Bible in hand reflecting on three Scriptures (Hebrews 7:25, Hebrews 9:24, and Romans 8:34). Jesus always lives, in the presence of the Father, making intercession for us. When He was on earth, He explained that He is only way to get to Father (John 14:6) for salvation and our access for prayer.

Amazing, the very moment we begin to pray both the Holy Spirit and Jesus join us. See **Romans 8:26:27**. **Armin Gesswein**, whom I considered a mentor during the formative years of the prayer seminar ministry, wrote booklet that came into my life by appearing on my desk at Liberty Baptist College. It was entitled **Seven** Wonders of Prayer. I consider the first wonder the most important paragraph I have ever read. In prayer, we come into the Throne Room in the presence of the Father and the Son. The paragraph is provided in the Prayer Seminar Workbook (page seven).

My advice is to acknowledge Jesus the very moment you begin to pray. Some wait until they are closing their prayer acknowledging they are praying in Jesus' name (such as, "In His name" or "In Thy name".) There is no need for shyness or ambiguity when you pray, Father, through Jesus, in the power of the Holy Spirit I come to You.

Upon assuming the presidency of Northeastern Bible College, Essex Fells, New Jersey, my admiration for my predecessor, the founderpresident, **Dr. Charles Anderson**,

grew by leaps and bounds. He was a powerhouse for God. He had the world on his heart. He served not only as the president of Northeastern, but was pastor of the large Brookdale Baptist Church, Bloomfield, New Jersey. He was a conference speaker par excellence. He made a mark for Christ. A few members of Brookdale maintained that his ministry was so powerful that a number were convicted and trusted Christ as Savior during his announcements.

One day Dr. Anderson talked with me about his relationship with Donald Grey Barnhouse, a leading evangelical voice. When Dr. Anderson finished his theological studies, Dr. Barnhouse invited him to join his staff at the Tenth Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia. Dr. Anderson chose to stay with the Baptists and work in the New York City area. Dr. Barnhouse assured him that he would amount to nothing and would be wasting his life and opportunity. Dr. Anderson became a giant with a very fruitful ministry!

My appreciation for **Donald** Grey Barnhouse grew as I learned more about this man of God and his extraordinary ministry. Some years later, my lodging was in Dr. Joseph **Tan's** guesthouse in Singapore. Dr. Tan has been our coordinator in Asia and thousands have attended prayer seminars he arranged in Indonesia Malaysia, Borneo, the Philippines, and Singapore. He was responsible for translating the prayer seminar workbook in several languages. There was a small library in the guesthouse. One volume caught my attention That Man Barnhouse, and I procured a copy upon returning home. When Sue and I gave our libraries to the new Northeastern Baptist College

Bennington, Vermont, I kept a few books and this is one of them.

Dr. Barnhouse illustrated what I was learning about prayer always opening his prayer with "Father, through Jesus, in the power of the Holy Spirit I come to You." This is highly appropriate as the entry to prayer. Any believer is wise to acknowledge Jesus quickly and then keep Jesus in the conversation. He has said that we should ask in His name. His name is the key to Heaven's storehouse. Why are we hesitant to keep the Trinity in our praying?

Some, and I am one of them, feel it is important to use this approach and are very careful to follow it. When someone prays and does not mention Jesus it strikes us as serious. When a pastor prays before his congregation, he can be sure the pattern of his praying will be a model.

The Journey Begins



God Opens and Closes Doors

When God opens a door no man can shut it. Do you believe that is true? God opened the door for the prayer seminar in September 1980. At that time there was no **J**. Gordon Henry Ministries (JGHM). The point was Northeastern Bible College in Essex Fells, New Jersey across the river from New York City. Although I did not have a clue to what God was doing, four years before the Holy Spirit began to stir the inner core of my being to become interested in what is sometimes called the deeper Christian life in the Keswick tradition holiness unto the Lord!

Basic steps in those early years included leading me to a serious daily study of the Word of God for my food, rather than a message to preach. He brought a godly couple, Richard and Ruth Elmer (Wesleyan background) into our lives and ministry at Pleasant View Baptist Church. Prior to this, I hired Mr. Elmer as Director of Library Services at Liberty Baptist College. When our daughter, Mona, went away to Converse College in Spartanburg, South Carolina, Mrs. Elmer agreed to take her place as organist at PVBC. Mr. Elmer assisted us in developing a new church library and often favored us with solos in the worship services. The Elmers were impressed at how God was blessing PVBC. Although I preached the Word of God, they discerned I did not understand the role of the Holy Spirit as the power behind the Lord's blessings. Instead of sharing their insight with others, they began to pray for their new pastor. At that point, I began to preach messages about the Holy Spirit. Since I used rather copious notes for my sermons, one can trace the growth of my interest.

This led me to become deeply interested in prayer which culminated in a 24/7 prayer chapel ministry in our church. To prepare the prayer warriors I wrote lessons on prayer and taught them during the training union hour on Sunday evening. Mimeographed copies of the lesson were prepared for several months. The prayer chapel opened. The power of God came down as we prayed. As evidence of the power of prayer, nineteen people were saved during the first worship service after we prayed one week.

A call came from New York City asking if I would

be interested in the presidency of Northeastern Bible College. After much prayer and deliberation, both Sue and I acknowledged that this move was the will of God for us. Our home church became Madison Baptist Church, Madison, New Jersey. An invitation came from Howard Kauffmann. president of Exxon whose wife. Suzie, was on Northeastern's Board of Governors, to be his guests at a luncheon at Waldorf-Astoria Hotel as a part of launching National Bible Week. Howard was the chairman for that event. Our pastor, Jim Hooten, was with us and we talked about Northeastern and my interest in prayer. "Why don't you lead a conference on prayer at Madison Baptist Church?" My response was, "Yes. I have the stencils from the prayer chapel in Virginia, the printing equipment, and staff to prepare a study booklet." The ground was laid!

Exposure was provided during the month of August when family radio WFME gave me an hour each morning to introduce me to the Greater New York City family of believers. My theme was the Christian Life and invitations were extended for the prayer conference at Madison Baptist Church in September. Invitations to conduct prayer seminars began to pour in each week. Even then, we had no idea that God was opening the door for a worldwide prayer ministry.

By accepting an invitation to lead Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools, my weekends/vacation days could be used for prayer seminars. God blessed TRACS and JGHM was established as the umbrella organization for prayer seminars. Prayer seminars were conducted in forty-seven states and the District of Columbia. In 1985, we began to take the prayer seminar to other nations, now touching over sixty nations. As of September 30, 2020, I had conducted 1,739 prayer seminars and had traveled 2,851,422 miles in the ministry.

The Doorkeeper Program began and God began to touch the hearts of brothers and sisters to provided prayer and financial support.

Based on the limitations imposed by advanced aging, along with some personal wellness issues in our family situation, it became obvious that time had arrived to identify a successor for the prayer seminars. A Five-Year Plan was drafted to guide our work. After much prayer and consideration, Adam Nathanson was chosen to carry on the prayer seminars. A number of ideas were considered as to how to achieve a successful transition to new leadership.

The bottom line is agreement that the paradigm proposed by Adam is the one that will meet the days ahead. Adam will be responsible for the prayer seminars under the umbrella of an entity called "The Prayer Seminar." He termed it as <u>one</u> of the tools in his chest of tools for ministry. This includes providing information about the prayer seminar (general promotion and answering questions related to scheduling) and conducting prayer seminars both in person and virtually. JGHM will promote "The Prayer Seminar" through the Reflector and other means as described in the minutes of the Executive Committee. We have provided Adam \$10,000 for support in conducting the prayer seminars. JGHM will assist by providing prayer seminar workbooks and Dr. Henry's books. All finances related to the "The Prayer Seminar" will be handled by the Salvage Church in Maine whose budget has a line item for this ministry. This approach will enable Adam to continue his relationship with the missions agency under which he has ministered the past few years.

GOD CONTINUES TO WORK

During the days when we were intensely seeking the Lord's will related to the future of the prayer seminar, **Terry Bernardi**, one of our **Doorkeepers** from Illinois, sent an e-mail based on an experience she had during her devotions. Interestingly enough, her prayer picture has become a reality.

We have been praying for your successors. One day, while praying, I saw a picture in my mind of your sitting at your desk and reaching across the seas eastward and southward. With extended arm you were hand picking people, like picking up toys - and bringing them to you. Take this for what it's worth. Blessings and guidance.

Some months later, Terry sent another email that is serving as a guideline for a fresher approach.

I just finished reading the Reflector. Inspirational and motivational, as usual. Thank you. I got the feeling 2020 would be the last year... sigh. I have saved every issue, so I can have inspiration when I'm immobile - some day. I hate to see it end. A thought came to me. Could you save money getting the Reflector out if you sent some by email? I realize not all of your recipients can do email, but there are probably many like me, who can do it just fine. Perhaps, even a phone app (for younger people) would help. (that would not include me). Another thought. I am on a list to receive Health related webinars now and then. They are broadcast for nine or ten days - one hour-long episode each Could the prayer seminar use this format? It could widen the reach of the material - in the developed countries for sure. Praying for Nigeria and Sue. Blessed holidays.

Paraphrasing what Paul said to the Romans, I am ready to preach the Gospel [and teach prayer seminars] as God opens the doors. Wherever He leads, I will go.

Dr. Henry often speaks of the prayer covering provided by the **Doorkeepers** as one of the factors that has attributed to the very life of his ministry. Paul himself asked for prayer support for himself and his ministry. So, I ask the same for myself. Please pray for my wife, Dianna and my sons, Daniel and David. Pray for my work both as a missionary and the leader for The Prayer Seminar. I am eager to establish a personal relationship with as many of you as possible. Working with churches affiliated with ABWE and other groups, the seminars were well-received. Many invitations came urging Adam to come back.









GLIMPSES CUBA NEWS

Cuba is very special to Dr. Henry. In January 1960, as a twenty-four year-old pastor, he led an evangelistic crusade in Placetas, four hours east of Havana. This was his first overseas ministry. Seventy were saved. When he returned in to First Baptist Church in Placetas in 2010, nine of the seventy were present.

At its August 12. 2016 meeting, the JGHM Board of Director decided to allocate funds to support the newly formed JGHM: CUBA BRANCH, Digmar Garcia, Director. At that time Digmar wrote: "Here we are feeling the impact of the prayer seminars. We have invitations from Las Margaritas and the province of Sancti Spiritus."

JGHM provides Spanish workbooks and support funds. Prayer seminars have been conducted in many of the provinces with great excitement demonstrated. In spite of the COVID-19 pandemic and the unrest (many Christians arrested and persecuted) hard times have returned. Food and medicine is scarce. Many are dying in the halls of the hospitals. In recent communication with Adam Nathanson, Digmar shared "You would not believe what your eyes see." PRAY THAT CONDITIONS WILL CHANGE. Cubans receive gladly the prayer seminar ministry.


seminars - 21; # churches - 630; # pastors - 525; professions of faith -371; miles traveled - 2,438; days on road - 27.

Although we do not know the exact number, there is no doubt that well over 2,000 prayer seminars have been conducted since the first one in 1980. Dr. Henry has personally conducted 1,740 prayer seminars in 47 states, district of columbia and fifty-seven other nations and has logged 2,855,022 miles to carry out the original mission of jghm mobilizing prayer warriors to become lighthouses of prayer throughout the world through a six-hour prayer seminar.

The essence of a prayer seminar is to teach the purpose and power of prayer, along with practical suggestions on how to and how not to pray. A prayer seminar workbook is the basic tool that organizes the content to guide the teachng-learning experience, used for note-taking and becomes a way to review multiple times what is taught as well as being a guidebook to share with others what has been learned.

Thousands upon thousands of

prayer seminar workbooks (in many languages) have been distributed around the world. A cadre of other teachers have answered god's call to teach seminars. We maintain that prayer is the work that must come before all other work.


In all probablity the most prayer seminars in any one nation would be in nigeria located in west africa and the most populous nation. As far as i can determine, the impact of the prayer seminar in this nation likely exceeds any other nation. We praise the lord!

GOD'S AMAZING WAYS IN NIGERIA



Nigeria. As far as I can determine, the greatest impact from the prayer seminars has been upon Nigeria, Africa's largest nation. FIRST TRIP. (1986) One of the first international ministries was to Imo State, Nigeria, West Africa to minister to the Ibo people, one of the three major tribes in that nation. It was exciting because the pastor of First Baptist Church, Owerri, had studied at Carson-Newman Baptist College in my home county in East

Tennessee. There was opportunity to go into the countryside to preach. The people were summoned via drums. When we arrived, there was no one at the church building. Within a short time, the building was packed. Several came to Christ.

An invitation was delivered from the chief to visit his home following traditional protocol. One of his gifts was a coco nut, a high honor. Shavings from the nut was proffered. Thankfully, a friend had warmed me





to exercise caution since the nut was loaded with caffeine. So I held the shavings to my mouth but did not ingest. I have kept one of the nuts on one of the office desks.

The actual prayer seminar was all-day Sunday. The temperature was over 100 degrees but I had been presented with a white linen outfit that absorbed my perspiration. My interpreter was excellent. The workbook was translated into the tribal language. My students sat on benches without backs. The interest was high all during the seminar.

A highlight was presenting a prayer seminar to their Bible school students. Coupled with prayer seminars in India and South Korea, the international phase of our ministry was off to a very good start. The Nigerian venture was under the auspices of Baptists with a number of Southern Baptist missionaries involved.

SECOND TRIP. (1988) The next trip to Nigeria was under the auspices of SIM (then Sudan Interior Missions, now Serving in Mission) and **ECWA** (then Evangelical Church of West Africa, now Evangelical Church Winning All). Ian Hay, SIM Director, asked if I would bring the prayer seminar to the colleges and seminaries across Nigeria. Panya Baba, president ECWA, traveled all night from Port Hartcourt to Jos, Plateau, ECWA's headquarters, to attend the prayer seminar. The Holy Spirit moved mightily sparking high interest. From the Jos prayer seminar, the Lord impressed upon Onesimus Sule, pastor of the Seminary Church and chaplain of the seminary at Jos,



to resign his positions and begin a prayer ministry based on the JGHM seminar. Sunday Bwanhot joined him and the result was a very strong prayer ministry in Nigeria. Their goal was every church become a praying church. ECWA reported 2.2 million members at that time. Before the year was over, headlines in Nigeria newspapers reported Spiritual Wakening Sweeps Nigeria.

Onesimus provided leadership until his retirement. He is now with the Lord. Sunday, his associate, wrote a book entitled **Lord**, **Teach Us to Pray**. In 1995, Sunday and Grace along with their twin sons, Henry and Jerry and their son Kelly, moved to Chicago serving as a missionary to West Africans.

Our agreement was that I would go to other nations. Only when Nigeria needed me there would there be a return visit. The prayer ministry was so effective that year after year I did not need to return to Nigeria. When Sue and I returned, we had 20,000 prayer workbooks printed (10,000 in English and 10,000 in Hausa). Thirteen thousand attended the prayer seminars. Many of the ECWA church pastors and leaders come with their 1988 prayer seminar

workbooks and certificates saying their

lives completely changed in 1988. At that time ECWA reported 5,000 churches and 5.6 million members. Some churches had grown by 40% the past few years. The most recent report is that ECWA now has 10 million member and over 10,000 local churches.

New Leader Announced for the Nigeria Prayer Ministry. We are thrilled to announce that the prayer ministry, which has touched so many lives and churches since its founding following the 1988 prayer seminar in Joss, has appointed a new leader. His name is Sunday Congo. His wife is Martha.

Sunday has a tremendous background that equips him for his new position, which I will share later.

At this point, I will share a part of his testimony:


"My passion for prayer started in the year 1988 when Dr. J. Gordon Henry visited Nigeria. During that visit, he came to the Kufai Bible College in Billiri where I was then a student. To the glory of God I was able to sit under Dr. Henry to receive the seminar on prayer. I have practiced what I learned and over the years have taught others. The very material that Dr. Henry gave me is still with me until today.

It was after the seminar that I felt challenged, inspired, encouraged, interested and motivated for prayers. The seminar created passion for prayers in my life and since then I have become a prayer wardrior and have developed a prayer chain in my life.

After the seminar in 1988, the

college built a prayer room for all staff and students. I strongly became a member of the prayer group, and to the glory of God today the prayer room in Kufai has become a full prayer ministry with staff and students praying and motivating people to cultivate the habit of prayers." [JGH: Actually the prayer chapel ministry has become well-known. People come from all over Nigeeria Nigeria to have the students pray for them with amazing answers.]

Sunday continues: "Today to the glory of God prayer has become a major factor in my life. I have experienced tremendous change through prayers. I walk and breath through prayer. Prayer is depend on prayer and all things depend on prayer. I love spending time with the Lord on a daily basis and my desire is
