

Perspectives

Christmas 2007

Several years ago, I was touched by the message that was on a Christmas card sent by **Doorkeepeers Bob and Sandi Swain** (Newport News VA) and mulled over it for a long time. It was entitled "God Sent Us a Savior." Here it is: "If our greatest need had been information, God would have sent us an educator. If our greatest need had been technology, God would have sent us a scientist. If your greatest need had been money, God would have sent us an economist. If our greatest need had been pleasure, God would have sent us an entertainer. But our greatest need was forgiveness, So God sent us a Savior."

Of course, His coming into the world is the meaning of Christmas and we are wise to contemplate God's great gift in a special way on the day set aside to remember Christ's birth. "And [Mary] shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call His name JESUS: for He shall save His people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21).

Yes, Christmas day calls for special reflection; but how much better it is to spend time daily in adoration, praise, and worship. Many of you are doing this, already. Since this act brings much joy and peace, you will likely keep it up although your enemy Satan will try to thwart you. If you are not having a daily time of worship, there is no better time to begin than today. Don't waste time in regret, do it. Usually, we must make definite, concrete plans if we are going to make life-style changes.

Soul nourishment first

Encouragement is given to each believer to read the Word of God systematically and regularly. By reading three chapters a day and five on Sunday, you can read the Bible in one year. Until you are in the Word of God for yourself, you will never become a prayer warrior—the greatest need in the church today. One advantage of having a plan to read through the Bible is that you will know what you are going to read tomorrow and can stay on course. It is necessary to make an appointment with God on a daily basis and keep the appointment. Having a set, shut, secluded place to pray is helpful, as well. Jesus talked about closet praying. In His day, people kept their valuables in a closet so there was limited access to that place. Find a place that is as free from interruptions as possible and designate it your prayer place.

Long ago, I discovered that the best approach to my quiet time (which is early morning) is to spend a brief moment in acknowledging that I am coming into the presence of God. In my mind, I determine to wait before Him (Isaiah 40:31), to be still and know He is God (Psalm 46:10), and to take the initiative in drawing nigh to Him as He draws nigh to me (James 4:8). The result is an atmosphere of serenity, calmness, and excitement. Then I ask Him to open my eyes to be able to see wonderful things out of His Word (Psalm 119:18) as I open the Bible and begin to read. George Mueller termed this "soul nourishment first."

Then adoration

Seldom is it necessary to read more than a few verses until I see something revealed about God the Father, or the Lord Jesus Christ, or the Holy Spirit that brings me to an attitude of worship and praise. My prayer time begins with praising God for Who He is as revealed out of my reading. I read with a pen or pencil in my hand which produces a readiness in my mind to have a message from Him from a word, a phrase, a verse, or a passage. By taking a page of notes out of my reading each day, I remain focused and alert.

For many years, the worship aspect of my prayer time has never been stale. As "*His mercies are new every morning* (Lamentations 3:23-24), so is His Word. There is something new in the Word each day that will set your heart on adoration—praising and loving God for who He is.

Seek His face

Have you ever been in love? When you fell in love, the night didn't get too dark, the rain

too heavy, the snow too deep, or the fog too thick, to keep you from wanting to be with the one you loved. For what purpose? Being in the physical presence of the one you love is enough within itself. Lovers often gaze in to each other's eyes

The focus on praise is God Himself — and not what He has done. Thanksgiving in prayer is offering specific thanks to God for things He has done for us or others. There is a difference in thanking Him for what His hand of blessing has provided and in praising Him for Who He is.

Before you ask Him for anything, spend time in meditation. Praise Him! Bless His name! Think about His greatness and seek to understand Him. Delight in Him! Love Him!

A. W. Tozer prayed, "O God, I love Thee as Thou art. I would not have Thee other than Thou art. I adore Thee for every attribute that Thou hast shown Thyself to have, and long to behold Thee in the days of eternity to come and thus to learn more of Thy glory and Thy being."

The Names of God

There are nine special names of God in the Old Testament derived from His works. Each one provides insight into who God is and what He does for His children. There are occasions when it is proper to focus on His names in worship. Learn the name and the context of the revelation. Knowing His names will help us know Him better.

Jehovah-Jireh - "the Lord will see to it" or "the God who provides" (Genesis 22:14).

Jehovah-Rophe - "the Lord who heals" (Exodus 15:26).

Jehovah-Nissi - "the Lord our Banner" (Exodus 17:15).

Jehovah-McKaddesh - "the Lord our Sanctifier" (Leviticus 20:8).

Jehovah-Shalom - "the Lord our peace" (**Judges 6:24**).

Jehovah-Tsidkenu - "the Lord our righteousness" (**Jeremiah 23:6**).

Jehovah-Rohi - "the Lord my Shepherd" (Psalm 23:1).

Jehovah-Sebaoth - "the Lord of hosts [armies]" (**Psalm 46:7**).

Jehovah-Shammah - "the Lord is there" (**Ezekiel 48:35**; **Joel 3:21**).

The Lord is to us all that we need, no matter what that need may be. He will perform. "From the rising of the sun to its going down, The Lord's name is to be praised" (Psalm 113:3). Worship Him for all that He is. It will make a difference in helping you and me walk with Him in confidence.

His Character, Attributes, Essence

Adoration is looking at God and loving Him for who He is. Recall His character, attributes, and essence as revealed in the Word of God to guide your praise and worship. Who is God?

One way to think about who God is that has been beneficial to many is to find key words describing Him for each letter of the alphabet. I learned this in the early '80s and found it to be an exercise that keeps me focused.

For each letter, I endeavored to make a list of as many words as I could for what I already knew about God. Over time, I have added to the list. Although I did not use a concordance, it is obvious that one way to develop an initial list or add to a list would be to do that.

Not only have I periodically used this approach in prayer during my quiet time, I have found it helpful at other times during the day in praising the Lord. In fact, I have often driven down the highway praising the Lord looking at the letters of the alphabet on the license plates of automobiles. Why don't you see what words you already have in your repertoire or suitcase with which you can use to praise and worship the Lord? Worship is the loving ascription of praise to God for Who He is, both in Himself and in His ways. Key words will keep you focused.

The benefit of adoration is the confidence that it gives that there is one who cares and is ready to hear your petitions for yourself and your intercession for others.

"If I could do it over again"

Someone asked Dr. Carl F. H. Henry, the founding editor of *Christianity Today* (who is recognized as a foremost author, educator, lecturer, and theologian), what one change he would make if he could live his life over again. His answer speaks volumes.

"I think that I would spend more time in prayer. Prayer is critically important, and the patterns that one establishes early in life have a molding influence. I had good patterns in the early years with a disciplined quiet time with God. It included Scripture reading, prayer, and waiting before God for His rebuke of anything in my life that He was displeased with, for direction or for guidance about speaking to other people about a relationship with Christ. But the pressures increase as one gets more actively involved...one finds in the later years that time is a very precious commodity that one seeks to use in a disciplined way for completion of certain priorities among his projects..."

Dr. Henry's comment is clearly a message that is easily understood. If you identify with what he said as you examine your own prayer life, don't waste time in regret or in morbid introspection. Wisdom is making prayer a priority in our busy lives! The Lord Jesus Christ, Himself, is the best example of a life that made prayer priority.

I visited with **Dr. Warren Wiersbe** in his office at Back to the Bible a few years ago. He, too, said that if he could do it over again, he would spend more time in prayer, as he did in his early ministry.

To talk with God no breath is lost --Talk on! To walk with God no strength is lost--Walk on! To wait on God no time is lost --Wait on!

A Right Christmas

"For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11).

Christmas means many things to many people according to their backgrounds, ages, and interests: profits, presents, trees, toys, lights, wrapping presents, decorating homes, paying bills, working extra hours. What does Christmas mean to you? Are you ready to have a right Christmas?

For the born-again believers, Christmas means everything! It means that there is a Father Who loves us, a brother Savior Who shed His blood on the Cross to pay for our sins and make a way for us to be reconciled to the Father, and a Holy Spirit who is our Helper in every aspect of life. God regarded our lost condition and did something about it by giving the best Gift ever! Our Savior was born. That is the meaning of Christmas. Note how sharp is Dr. Luke's diagnosis! **"Unto You"**--that is personal; **"This Day"**—that is present; **"A Savior"**—that is precious!

Actually, three symbols show the real meaning of Christmas: a cradle (1 Timothy 3:16), a cross (John 19:18), and a crown (Isaiah 9:6). Incarnation—Jesus, God of very God in human flesh—was laid in a manger for His cradle (John 1:1, Galatians 4:4-5, 2 Corinthians 5:18-19). He came to die on our behalf on the cross (John 12:32). One day He will return and will be crowned King of kings with every knee bowing and every tongue confessing that He is Lord (Philippians 2:9-11).

Ingredients of a right Christmas

It is important for a Christian to have a **RIGHT CHRISTMAS!** Here are some ingredients to include in your celebration.


1. A Right Christmas Includes Making Room for Jesus. The inn keeper is a symbol of those who have no room for Jesus. Be sure your heart is not so full of other things that there is no room for Him this Christmas. Jesus is the reason for the season!

2. A Right Christmas Includes Worship and the Grace of Giving. Adoration is simply looking at Jesus and loving Him for who He is. Take time for special worship as did the shepherds and wise men. Since it is His birthday, shouldn't your most expensive gift be given to honor Jesus? The wise men "...fell down, and worshiped Him ... and ...presented unto Him gifts" (Matthew 2:11). Can we do any less?

3. A Right Christmas Includes Telling Others. The shepherds "made known abroad" what they had seen and heard (**Luke 2:17-20**). The need is great and the hour is late. How many on your street or in your neighborhood are waiting for someone to tell them about Jesus? We are not called to be lawyers, but witnesses. What an opportune time we have at Christmas to tell others its real meaning!

Peace on earth

Were the angels wrong when they talked about peace on earth and goodwill to men (Luke 2:14) since we have so much hurt today? No, the peace God offers is for those who will trust His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, as Savior and Lord. The best present you could give to Him would be yourself this Christmas Day. If you have not, do so now. If you have, reaffirm your dependence upon Him!

Dr. R. A. Torrey preached on **John 3:16** as "The Greatest Sentence Ever Written." **Martin Luther** called it the "Miniature Gospel" because it represents all the great truth of the Gospel and the meaning of Christ's coming into the world.

Dr. H. A. Ironside tells the story of a little girl in Martin Luther's day, when the first edition of the Bible came out.

The little girl had a terrible fear of God. God had been presented in such a way that it filled her heart with dread when she thought of Him. She brooded over the awfulness of the character of God and of some day having to meet this angry Judge.

But one day she came running to her mother, holding a scrap of paper in her hand. She cried out, "Mother! Mother! I am not afraid of God any more." Her mother said, "Why are you not?" "Why, look, Mother," she said, "this bit of paper I found in the print shop, and it is torn out of the Bible." It was so torn as to be almost illligible except for two lines. On the one line, it said, "God so loved," and on the other line it said, "that He gave." "See, Mother," she said, "God so loved that He gave."

"See, Mother," she said, "that makes it all right." Her mother read it and said, "God so loved that He gave. But," she said, "it does not say what He gave."

"O Mother," exclaimed the child, "if He loved us enough to give anything, it is all right."

Then the mother said, "But, let me tell you what He gave." She read, "God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotton Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." Then she told how we can have peace and eternal life through trusting Him.

PRACTICAL STEPS 8. Be Still Before the Lord

Someone has rightly observed that 'hurry is the death of prayer.' This is very true! Especially in this our jet and instant age, we have become slaves to time and we serve time instead of time serving us. We budget our day and allocate time for our overloaded schedules. The fine Christians among us also budget time to meet with God --a very commendable thing.

Since the time we allocate for our devotion with God is very limited, we come before God with a business man's mentality--straight to business even before proper exchange of pleasantries. We cannot come to God with that type of attitude and really meet with Him.

Year-end giving

As you plan your December giving, what are you giving Jesus for His birthday this year? What is under the tree for Him? Is He FIRST on your shopping list? There will be many reminders that the very best and most expensive gift we give should honor the Lord Jesus Christ since Christmas is essentially based on giving. Every gift we buy will be one reminder if we are thoughtful.

It very well may be that as you pray about your end-of-the year giving you will want to make your gift to honor Jesus in a special way through the prayer seminar ministry. Over the years, many have. If so, as a faith ministry Scripture says: "Be still and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations. I will be exalted in the earth." **Psalm 46:10.**

As you come before God in prayer, be quiet in your spirit and heart; remind yourself that you are before God. Calm yourself down, let your spirit connect with God and feel in your heart and all around you the presence of God.

Sometimes it could take just a couple of minutes for that to happen, other times it could take much longer. As long as you are in a haste to get into business with God, you will miss it. Try being still for a couple of minutes every time before digging into your devotions.




NOTES from my BIBLE
