PREPARATION FOR PERSONAL PRAYER

There are two aspects of sin for a Christian. First, God says, "There are some things I do not want in the lives of My children." Second, God says, "There are some things that I want in the lives of all my children." What am I doing that God does not want me to do? What am I not doing that God wants me to do?

A practical suggestion is to get off by yourself with pen and paper. Ask God to show you any sins in your life. List them in order to deal with them through repentance and confession one by one. Begin by praying a prayer like David's prayer as he sought cleansing long ago: "Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me, and know my thoughts: and see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting" (Psalm 139:23-24). Until you confess and forsake known sin, you cannot have a prayer life: "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me" (Psalm 66:18); "Behold, God's hand is not shortened that He cannot save; neither is His ear heavy that He cannot hear, but your iniquities have separated between you and your God and your sins have hidden His face from you so that He cannot hear" (Isaiah 59:1-2).

The Word of God is a mirror

Conviction is the starting place of getting clean before God. Conviction simply means being conscious or aware of sin. Conviction is the work of the Holy Spirit (**John 16:8-11**). He uses the Word of God to bring conviction. One explanation for the lack of conviction in the lives of many Christians is that they are not in the Word of God. When a Christian is seeking God through the Word, the Holy Spirit often shows him how God sees Him.

A few years ago, my wife, Sue, and I were conducting a series of prayer seminars in several Latin American countries (Puerto Rico, Venezuela, Costa Rica, Mexico). We were having lunch in San Jose, Costa Rica. She said to me, "You have a piece of butter on your right check"—which I did not know. I said, "thank you," took my napkin, and wiped off the butter. Often, as we read His Word, the Holy Spirit says, "You've got a piece of butter on your right cheek" or WHATEVER. It is then that we can take care of the problem through repentance and confession.

The Check List

Under the leadership of the Holy Spirit, this Check List can be a tremendous help in identifying and confessing sins that often hinder genuine revival. Read the selected Scriptures that follow. Go through the questions one by one. Answer truthfully each question in the light of your life at this time. Every "yes" means a sin in your life. In reading these questions, as you are convicted of sin by the Holy Spirit, put the sin on your sin list. Once the list is completed, consider each sin one by one with a willingness to make things right. Think in terms of repenting (changing your mind) and confessing (agreeing with God, owning up to the sin and saying the same thing about it—one by one—that He says). Once you have confessed the sin, you can accept forgiveness

and cleansing because that is what God will give you. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).

Be sure to NAME YOUR SIN to God since that is what is required by the word "confess." Be specific. For example, you might need to say, "Lord, I have not put You first in my plans" or "I have neglected Your Word and prayer." Further, do not make even the least excuse for sin of any kind in your life. Remember "he that covereth his sin shall not prosper; but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy" (**Proverbs 28:13**).

No matter what others do, or do not do, leave nothing undone on your part. God wants to work through you to bring about a great spiritual awakening and a revival in your church. You can begin by fulfilling, with the help of the Holy Spirit, every requirement laid out by the Lord in His Word.

Conclusion

When you have been honest and truthful in the matter of admitting your sins (commission and omission) and have repented (changed your mind), then you are ready for cleansing. Sins that are admitted are sins that are confessed. "Who can understand his errors? Cleanse Thou me from secret faults" (Psalm 19:12).

Remember three things: (1) When the sin is against God, confess it to God, and make things right with God; (2) When the sin is against another person, confess it to God, and make things right with the other one; and (3) When the sin is against a group (including the church), confess it to God, and make it right with the group (church).

When there is FULL CONFESSION, there will be FULL CLEANSING. Then the joy of the Lord will follow. Then there can be testimony and prayer in the power of the Holy Spirit. The Check List will help Christians obey the command in **Ephesians 5:18**: BE SPIRIT-FILLED, which literally means SPIRIT-CONTROLLED. When our known sins are confessed [agreed to] and forsaken, the Holy Spirit can control our lives and use us to touch lives for the Lord Jesus Christ.

A message in seven words R. A. Torrey (1856-1928)

I bring you a message from God contained in seven short words. Six of the seven words are monosyllables, and the remaining word has but two syllables and is one of the most familiar and most easily understood words in the English language. Yet there is so much in these seven short, simple words that they have transformed many a life and brought many an inefficient worker into a place of great power.



You will find these seven words in **James 4:2**, the seven closing words of the verse, "Ye have not because ye ask not."

Secret of Christians Powerlessness. These seven words contain the secret of the poverty and powerlessness of the average Christian, of the average minister, and of the average church. "Why is it," many a Christian is asking, "that I make such poor progress in my Christian life? Why do I have so little victory over sin? Why do I win so few souls to Christ? Why do I grow so slowly into the likeness of my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ?" And God answers in the words of the text, "Neglect of prayer. You have not because you ask not."

"Why is it," both ministers and churches are asking, "that the church of Jesus Christ is making such slow progress in the world today? Why does it make so little headway against sin, against unbelief, against error in all its forms? Why does it have so little victory over the world, the flesh, and the devil? Why is the average church member living on such a low plane of Christian living? Why does the Lord Jesus Christ get so little honor from the state of the church today?" And, again, God replies, "Neglect of prayer. You have not because you ask not."

The Early Church's Victory. When we read the only inspired church history that was ever written, the history of the church in the days of the apostles as it is recorded by Luke (under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit) in the Acts of the Apostles, what do we find? We find a story of constant victory, a story of perpetual progress. We read, for example, such statements as Acts 2:47, "The Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved" and Acts 4:4: "Many of them which heard the Word believed; and the number of the men was about five thousand." Chapter after chapter, we find the same note of victory. Why was this true? The answer is "they gave themselves to prayer" (Acts 2:42; Acts 6:4) -- a praying church and a praying ministry can achieve anything that ought to be achieved.

Perspective

By studying prayers recorded in the Bible, we can not only develop a greater understanding of prayer, we can gain ideas to incorporate in our own praying. One helpful study would be the prayers of the kings of Judah as they faced crises that drove them to God. One example is **Asa** whose forces were outnumbered by a foreign enemy. He cried out to the Lord to help expressing complete trust in the Lord. "Lord, it is nothing for you to help, whether with many or with those who have no power; help us, O Lord our God" (**2 Chronicles 14:11**).

Another example is godly **Jehoshaphat** who appealed to God for help when invaded by the combined forces of Moab, Ammon, and Mount Seir. He asked God to act because (1) the enemy was intent on throwing Judah off the land that God gave them, (2) Judah had no power to resist, and (3) God's people were depending on Him. (2 Chronicles 20:5-12). The Lord responded to this prayer by turning the allies against each other. The enemy literally destroyed each other, and all the men of Judah needed to do was collect the spoil.

Then, there is **Hezekiah**'s prayer when Sennacherib, king of Assyria, and his army advanced on Jerusalem. His representative, Rabshakeh, demanded the surrender of Jerusalem, ridiculing the idea that Judah's God might save the nation. He was a good king, a reformer, and led a much-needed revival (2 Kings 18:3-7), but trouble came. Eleven chapters are devoted to this godly ruler who followed God more closely and sincerely than any other king of Judah or Israel. None of us knows the future. Since our nation is strong and prosperous, it is hard to conceive that we would ever face what Hezekiah faced during his reign. But we would do well to study his prayer when he went into the temple and spread the letter he had received before the Lord (2 Kings 19:14). He expressed his confidence in God, asking God to save the nation and demonstrate His power and authority. He knew that God was real and he asked Him to act to protect His own reputation. He was anxious that God deliver his people, but the deeper concern of his heart was for the honor of Jehovah God. He cried out, "Now, therefore, O Lord our God, I pray, save us from [Sennacherib's] hand" (vv 15-19).

The prayer. "O Lord God of Israel, the One who dwells between the cherubim. You are God, You alone, of all the kingdoms of the earth. You have made heaven and earth. Incline Your ear, O Lord, and hear; open Your eyes, O Lord, and see; and hear the words of Sennacherib, which he has sent to reproach the living God. Truly, LORD, the kings of Assyria have laid waste the nations and their lands, and have cast their gods into the fire; for they were not gods, but the work of men's hands-wood and stone. Therefore they destroyed them. Now therefore, O Lord our God, I pray, save us from his hand, that all the kingdoms of the earth may know that You are the Lord God, You alone" (2 Kings 19:15-19). He exalted God, the Creator. He acknowledged that God alone had the power to save them. He wanted God to have glory.

The answer. The prophet Isaiah was then sent to tell Hezekiah that not a single enemy arrow would fly over Jerusalem's wall (vv 20-34). God later sent an angel who killed 185,000 Assyrian soldiers in a single night (v 35). It is when the heart is purged from selfish motives that it reaches the true place of safety. God answered because Hezekiah prayed.

The lesson. God truly is concerned for our welfare. We need to be concerned for His reputation and seek to glorify Him. Although God knows everything that we face and need, His way is for us to come to Him and confess our situation and our trust in Him. God knows the battles that you and I face, and He will give us the help we need as we spread the matter before Him in faith, and seek to glorify His name.

Explanation of the check list

For the first two decades of the prayer seminar ministry, the basic teaching tool was a seventy-nine page workbook. Although I could never teach more than 30% of the workbook during a six-hour seminar, I felt it could be an on-going resource to those who made commitments related to their prayer lives during a seminar. Due to time pressures in seminars in other countries, I condensed the material into a thirty-page workbook including every subject that I cover. Another reason, it is easier to translate thirty pages than seventy-nine pages. In 2003, it became obvious that a wise move would be to use the thirty-page workbook in all seminars both at home and abroad. It is my conclusion that this edition is far more useful as a tool for teaching-learning than the larger

One challenge, however, was deciding what to omit. In session six, which deals with getting ready to pray, I included a very helpful inventory check sheet to enable a person to see himself as God sees him-using the Scripture itself as the mirror. There was no room in the thirty-page workbook, although I have included it in my book, Intercession: Prayer as Work. For sometime I have felt that it would be helpful for believers sincerely seeking personal revival to have access to the Check List. I encourage you to study it carefully and prayerfully. If you have the **Prayer Seminar** Workbook, you might want to insert the Check List in session six. If you do not have a thirtypage workbook, and would like to have one, please request one and we will get it to you.

In the following article, Armin reminds us that we have received a very wonderful gift from the Lord Jesus Christ. This gift is the privilege of prayer. In a sense, prayer is like being given a credit card that can be used, in accordance to God's will, for all kinds of needs not only in your life, but in the lives you can touch through prayer. Frankly, we would do well to read his article and then ask ourselves if we, too, love prayer.]

First, I love prayer because IF WHAT JESUS SAYS ABOUT PRAYER IS TRUE (and of course it is) I WOULD CONSIDER MYSELF A FOOL IF I DID NOT GET INTERESTED IN PRAYER! If someone offered me a million dollars, I would get interested in money—really fast! But what is a million dollars compared with what Jesus promises to do in answer to prayer? His promises are not only very precious, but very plain as well. Promises like John 14:14: "If you shall ask any thing in My name, I will do it."

Second, I love prayer because it brought revival to my life and ministry. We need to be motivated. What caused me to be motivated for prayer "in dead earnest" was when I found out it is the only way into the strong working of God. It is His way of doing things. Early, I

began to see that to seek revival is to seek God's VERY BEST. And that is what I wanted, no matter what. I soon learned that revivals do not come by weak, puny praying, but by strong prayer. Supplication. Intercession. Prayer got me into some strong revivals early in life. Since then I learned, both from Scripture and from history, that there is NO OTHER WAY.

Third, I love prayer because it is not only related to revivals and the powerful working of the Holy Spirit, but to EVERYTHING. What a new day when I saw that truth! "In everything by prayer ..." (**Philippians 4:6,7**). Big things. Little things. EVERYTHING! It is so exciting to see how the Lord loves to answer prayer and loves to enter into the thousand details of life, and answer.
