LAUNCHING JGHM--EAST AFRICA BRANCH

As you know, our interest in East Africa started in April 2006, when I taught a class on the purpose and power of prayer at Brackenhurst Conference Center outside Nairobi. There were over one-hundred pastors in the class. One was **Martin Shikuku**, pastor-founder, Glory Baptist Church, Eldoret in West Kenya (Rift Valley).. We became friends during the week. He, along with Andrew Sakari and Mulumba Placide Kituta, urged me to return and teach a series of prayer seminars in west Kenya and in the **Democratic Republic of the Congo** in 2007.

In preparation, Martin translated the English prayer seminar workbook into Swahili, With the help of Dr. Jones Kaleli (Professor, Liberty Baptist Theological Seminary, Lynchurg VA) and his two daughters (who typed the handwritten translation prepared by Martin, the Swahlli translation was completed. Martin and Andrew picked up the message and began to run with it. At that time, Martin shared his aspirations in written form. It was clear that he understood the importance of beginning his day with an extended period in the Word of God (reading systematically through the Bible following the Bible reading schedule provided for **Doorkeepers** in the monthly **Reflector)**. He further understood that prayer is the work that must come before all other work. He rededicated himself to prayer work and teaching his family, congregation, and others what he was learning. He often shares how lifechanging this practice has been in his life and ministryl

On my first visit to Glory Baptist Church in 2007, he and his congregation presented me a beautiful carving, a big elephant with a little elephant attached. In the presentation, he explained that I was the "big elephant" and that he and others would be the "little

Dear Doorkeepers,

Of the fifty-eight nations that have hosted prayer seminars, perhaps the greatest impact has been in Nigeria. Our work began in 1987 with the Baptists in Imo State (Ibo tribe).

In 1988, an invitation came from Ian Hay, the international director, Sudan Interior Mission and Panya Baba, president, **Evangelical Church of West Africa** (ECWA) for a series of prayer seminars in their seminaries and colleges. Out of this came a great spiritual awakening. A prayer ministry was developed that has impacted thousands upon thousands. The goal was that every church would become a praying church. From 2.2 million, ECWA has grown to 5.6 million. Praver is the work that must come before all other work.

Even then, I became aware that Islam is not a peaceable religion. The conflict rages. Once again, I ask you to pray for Nigeria. Please read carefully the prayer request from a Wycliffe missionary on page twelve.

Pray for prayer ministry leaders: Nuhu & Mercy Leo (Jos) and for Shem & Deborah Kamla (Gombe State). Since 1988, Shem has been conducting prayer seminars through northeast Nigeria where the Muslims are strongest.

elephants," who would follow me in providing prayer seminars throughout East Africa. It was a precious moment.

Then trouble came. I firmly believe that Satan himself understood the importance of Martin's commitment to mobilizing and training prayer warriors and the threat that it would pose to Satanic practices. Post-election violence pitting tribe against tribe became intense after the December 2007 election. Hundreds were killed (including fifty who fled to a church for safety only to have the church burned with them inside) and multiplied thousands (250,000) became refugees with 125,000 near Martin's church. He and his family fled to the Eldoret police station with only the clothes on their backs. Everything in his house and church were destroyed. He was left with nothing but his wonderful family and faith in God that He would rebuild his life and ministry. His fatherin-law was one of the ones that was murdered.

When we learned what was happening, we began an effort to make contact with Martin. We did not know if he and his family were dead or alive. Finally, an e-mail came. They were alive, but devastated completely with no food or clothing or shelter. When I wrote a letter to our **Doorkeepers** that the "little elephants are in trouble," you gave over \$13,000 to help Martin rebuild and reestablish his ministry. Since then, he has traversed his nation conducting prayer seminars. He and his congregation have erected the largest Baptist auditorium in West Kenya.

In a sense, you and I can feel that Martin belongs to us. We have provided funds for a van for Martin. He has started a preschool and a preachers' school. He and his team have conducted many prayer seminars throughout the nation and have established many lighthouses of prayer already. He arranged prayer seminars in 2009, 2010, 2011, and 2012 (119 days total) and served as my interpreter for seminars in Burundi, DR Congo, Rwanda, Tanzania, and Uganda. In a recent e-mail, Martin concluded that the prayer seminar "will live as long as I live."

To launch JGHM-East Africa Branch, our goal is to raise \$13,000, the equivalent amount to what we gave to enable Martin to reestablish his ministry after the devastation caused by the post-election violence. Above all, we ask each of the **Doorkeepers** to make a commitment to provided the crucial prayer support needed for any new venture. Our model will be Nigeria. JGHM will provide funds for workbooks, for travel and food. When the leadership deems it necessary, I will be available to go. Our goal is to have thousands of lighthouses of prayer penetrating the spiritual darkness. Our aim is to challenge pastors and leaders not to rest until their local churches are lighthouses of prayer. Consequently, we are expecting great things to happen in the five East Africa nations through

Intercession

Never underestimate the possibility of a reversal of God's judgment through a loving intercessor. Aaron had made the golden calf for the people to worship, and God had promised the judgment of death of him. As a result of Moses' intercession, his life was spared.

Is there a more awesome role than being an intercessor? It has happened in the Bible and numbers of times since. Take note how the early disciples prayed during the night for Peter when he was in prison. Their intercession resulted in an escape with an angelic escort. Their praying fetched an angel; the angel fetched Peter who was soon knocking on the door where the prayer meeting was in progress (**Acts 12:7-12**).

Prepare to pay a price in intercession when friends, family members, or leaders are in crisis situations. We are always to pray for the seemingly impossible and never to limit God's ability or minimize the effectiveness of our partnership with Him in prayer.

John Newton's example

Interesting reading! Various social laws were laid out for the Israelites to be practiced when they were settled in the Promised Land (**Deuteronomy 24:5 25:4**). Justice was to be shown to the stranger, the fatherless, and the widow. A field was not to be completely harvested. Gleanings were to be left for the poor and the helpless. The same applied to the harvesting of olive trees and grapes. Ronald Sider comments:

The memory of their own poverty and oppression in Egypt was to prompt them to leave generous gleanings for the poor sojourner; the widow and the fatherless

When John Newton (author of "Amazing Grace") was born again, he printed **verse 22** in large letters and hung it over his mantelpiece, where he would be constantly reminded of it: "And you shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt; therefore I command you to do this thing."

The Matter of Other faiths

sowing and reaping

We praise God for the opportunities that He has presented JGHM to touch lives at home and abroad — all possible because of the faithful prayer and financial support provided by our **Doorkeepers**. The story of **Young Min Pee, Th.D.** illustrates what I am talking about.

Young Min Pee served as our interpreter for South Korean prayer seminars in May 1986. With his help, Sue and I saw 106 adults from Buddhist backgrounds trust the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior, mostly in home visitation. Each witnessing session took around one hour and our brother faithfully took what was in our hearts and minds, and placed it in the hearts of those to whom we witnessed.

The Word of God came alive. Great conviction fell and the Holy Spirit moved mightily to exalt the Lord Jesus Christ as the only Savior provided by the only true God. On Saturday afternoon, Young Min Pee returned to his home community, Daejon, and using the method of witnessing (that is a part of our present evangelism clinic) won four men to Christ. When Sue and I heard what had happened, we rejoiced with him knowing that he was to be a very special instrument in God's hand.

When we learned that Young Min Pee's dream was to earn a doctorate in the U. S. and return to Korea to teach in the Baptist seminary, we were eager to see it happen. The difficulty was that he was being refused a student visa. Before we flew to Japan for seminars on Saturday, I went to the U. S. Embassy in Seoul to find out why his student visa was being denied and was assured there was no way that I

could have an audience with the embassy agent in charge (a lady from Texas). I insisted and persisted as other supplicants (perhaps a hundred) were heard. Most walked away downcast. Finally, I was called to the bullet-proof window. After some time, I went away with a step-by-step list, which I mailed to Young Min Pee from the airport. Within a month, he had his visa. When he arrived to study at New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminar, JGHM supported him \$100 monthly until he was called to become pastor at the Korean Baptist Church, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

Young Min Pee, his wife, and his son, returned to Korea. He became an assistant professor of church history at the seminary. Over the years, he moved upward in his career--"Distinguished Professor of Church History" and the "Academic Dean" for the college. Then he became Vice President for Academic Affairs for the seminary in Daejon, South Korea. A few years ago, he accepted the pastorate of the 8,000 member Central Baptist Church in Seoul where he is ministering with excellence.
