"Do you understand what you are reading?" (Acts 8:30b)

As we come closer to Easter each year, I am deeply moved and amazed that God would give us such a gift of love and forgiveness in Christ. The death and resurrection of Christ are at the heart of our Easter celebration, and at the heart of the message we preach at home and abroad. Christ is risen!

On the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35). When the two disciples walked on the road to Emmaus, they were discussing Jesus' death. Suddenly Jesus Himself was walking with them, but they didn't recognize Him. When He asked them what they were discussing that made them so sad, they told Him about Jesus of Nazareth, whom they thought was a great prophet and the Messiah. Now their hopes and dreams were dashed. He had been crucified and buried. Some of their group claimed that He had risen from the dead, but they could not believe it.

Jesus then told them, "O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe in all that prophets have spoken! Ought not the Christ to have suffered these things and to enter into His glory?" Then Jesus quoted from the Scriptures beginning with the writings of Moses, explaining what the passages meant and what they said about Himself.

The two wanted this Stranger to join them for some food in their home. He did. When He took the loaf of bread, broke it and passed it to them, suddenly their eyes were opened. They recognized Him, and then He disappeared. They started telling one



another how their hearts felt strangely warm as they talked with Him. "Did not our heart burn within us while He talked to us on the road. and while He opened the Scriptures to us?" (v 32). Within the hour, they were hurrying back to Jerusalem, where the other disciples of Jesus were waitig. We would do well to go once again to the Bible and reflect on the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus for our sins, which is the crux of the GOSPEL that we preach (1 Corinthians 15:1-8). As you study, the Holy Spirit will certainly see that your heart will burn within you as you come to fresh understanding.

Were you there when they crucified my Lord? Before crucifixion, criminals were commonly scourged with a whip made of leather thongs weighted with pieces of sharp metal until the flesh on their backs was all torn open. Sometimes death resulted from scourging alone. After the beating, the victims were led to the place of execution through the city market place. When they arrived at some easily accessible knoll, they were made to lie down while they were bound to the cross-bar and their hands nailed. They were then lifted up by ropes or ladders and the cross-bar was attached firmly to an upright that had been driven into the ground. The crucified's crotch rested on a round peg driven into the upright. The feet were nailed to the upright, and the victim left hanging not more than two feet from the ground.

There was great mental anguish in hanging practically face-to-face with the curious and the sadistic that might mock and scorn at the cries of the dying.

Crucifixion was regarded as the most disgraceful, as well as the most excruciating manner of execution. The torture of the cross began with the pain of the unnatural position of sitting on the peg. The swelling wounds on the hands, feet, and lacerated back, the torn tendons and nerves, and the insufferable thirst under the hot sun combined to bring torture beyond imagination. Arteries of the head and stomach would become surcharged with blood, causing a terrifying throbbing sensation.

The Lord Jesus Christ suffered one of the most ignominious, savage kinds of death known to man. But He died standing up in symbolic defiance of the powers of sin and Satan, crying with a loud voice, "It is finished!" He was made a curse for you and me that we might not have to bear God's curse on sin ourselves (Galatians 3:13).

Were you there when they laid Him in the tomb? Sue and I have had the privilege to lead tour groups to the Garden Tomb in Jerusalem. We have taken turns entering the tomb and pausing before the ledge upon which a body was placed. But the tomb is empty! What happened?

Were you there when He rose up from the grave? "And the angel answered and said unto the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. And go quickly, and tell His disciples that He is risen from the death; and indeed He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him. Behold, I have told you" (Matthew 28:5-7).

Up from the grave, He arose. He lives. Christ is risen indeed. When the glorious sunrise of Easter morning comes, we shout, "He is risen." The resurrection of Jesus Christ is what gives us hope as we look to the future.

NOTES from my BIBLE


Note 3086. The greatest ability in the work of the Lord is availability.

THE POWER OF THE PREACHED WORD

As our pastor, **Dr. Dennis Hollandsworth**, preached during a recent Sunday night service at Beulah Baptist Church, my spirit was so stirred that tears came. My heart is broken! His text was **Ephesians 4:17-32** and his outline was one he had prepared for **Pulpit Helps**, but had never used in a sermon. He pointed out that in **one moment of time**, salvation comes and the believer is a new creature right then. The new life is the indwelling Holy Spirit. At that moment, you and I received all the Holy Spirit we are ever going to have! His three points were as follows:

1. Prior to the changed life (vv 17-19). A pagan lifestyle (v 17); a darkened mind (v 18); a heart of stone (v 18), and a sin-filled life (v 19). Think of your own life before Christ!

 Passage into the changed life (vv 20-24). Jesus Himself is the Life-Changer. Remember the very moment and place where you trusted Christ.
Principles of the changed life (vv 25-32). We put on truth, peace, generosity, grace, and kindness as we lay aside lying, anger, stealing, evil speaking, and conflict.

Pastor spoke of the spirit of worldliness that characterizes the lives of most Christians that renders the church powerless. We have listened without heeding the Word until we have become overly familiar with the holy. That is what broke my heart. If it is true, and it is, that we become a new creature the moment we are saved, how do we explain that most churches are in serious need of a genuine revival?

When one comes to Christ, he is a "new-born babe" that requires the milk of the Word. A major reason the church does not experience revival is the neglect of the Word of God. We simply do not understand the place the Word of God has in our lives. The pastor cites specific Scriptures to peg down his points. He mentioned Isaiah 66:2b, a key verse in the prayer seminar. Do you want God to look your way? God explains the requisites for such a look. First, we are to humble ourselves and there were numerous verses cited at this point. But the second requirement is definitely stated as **trembles at My Word**. In the May **Reflector**, my plan is to develop the role of the Word in bringing revival to an individual believer and a local church.

The second obstacle to revival is the failure to focus on prayer. First, let God speak from His Word; then you will be ready to speak to Him and that is prayer. When there is failure in the area of prayer, there will be failure. There will be defeats, discouragements, disheartenness, fruitlessness, coldness. The result is spiritual inertia on every hand. The wheels of Zion bog down as folks PLAY CHURCH. Power has been absent so long that the Holy Spirit could remove Himself and churches would not miss Him and still continue their BUSINESS AS USUAL. Through the Word and through prayer, indifference and inactivity will disappear. Revival will come. Souls will be saved.

Adam Nathanson's Journal Notes From Santa Clara Province Prayer Seminars January 2017

Monday, January 9

Thanks to Pastor Juan Carlos and his wife Mayerlin, we were able to host the **DEDICATION SERVICE** and teach the first half of the prayer seminat at First Baptist Church, Santa Clara. This is the second time the church has hosted a prayer seminar.

Forty members from the church attended and each was given a commemorative gift from **JGHM**, one of the first Spanish prayer seminar workprints printed in Cuba in Placetas, Villa Clara, the same city where Dr. Henry ministered fifty-seven years ago. God is good to show His mercy and kindness to us as we look to extend His kingdom's work.

We were privileged to have Pastor Jorge Diaz and pastors from the Assemblies of God who co-hosted the June 2016 prayer seminars. These brothers gave testimony on how their church prayer meetings have doubled from 30-60 persons due to the impact of the prayer seminars. Their church is only four years but is now one of the largest evangelical congregitons in Santa Clara.

One of the main leaders of the Assemblies of God churches for three states in central Cuba, Guillermo Fernandez, attended and gave testimony of God's goodness and how the seminar has united other pastors from these states to share and reproduce the prayer seminar for their churches. He also made copies in English for 100 pastors in Trinidad who attended their prayer seminar. They used power point slides to minister to those who did not have access to the workbook.
