SOLACE FROM THE PAST

When a card of condolence arrived from Doorkeepeers Gale and Nancy Wetzel, my heart was moved with a sense of solace from over six decades ago. A common feature of the children's Sunday school was sketches like this one. The thought of Jesus walking along with the children lifted my spirits. The accompanying thought was what I needed to remember: "One of the greatest privileges of knowing Jesus is going to Him in prayer. There's never a question about whether or not He's listening. He always is. There's never a question about whether or not He has our best at heart; He always does." This approach must work since well-fixed images planted in my Book of Memories evoked solace to my heart.

Peace The atmosphere of prayer

Available for believers. Do you have it? How to obtain it! Often in the Bible two thoughts are connected. It is easy to break them apart thus voiding the full impact of either part. When Paul wrote his "thank you" note to the Philippian believers who had stood by him with prayer and financial support, he talked about the peace of God. "and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus" (Philippians **4:7**). Our hearts yearn for such peace. What puts a believer into a position to have the peace of God a reality in his life? The answer is the preceding verse: "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be known to God" (v 6).

Is it really possible for a Christian to be anxious for nothing? It is possible as long as we have the resource of prayer. The rest of the verse goes on to explain how our lives can be free from sinful fretting. Everything should be taken to the Lord in prayer. Joseph Scriven had it right when he wrote the familiar words: "O what peace we often forfeit, O what needless pain we bear, all because we do not carry everything to God in prayer." "Everything" means everything. There is nothing too great or small for His loving care!

The Atmosphere of Prayer. Prayer is both an act and an atmosphere. We come to the Lord at specific times and bring specific requests before Him. But it is also possible to live in an atmosphere of prayer. It is possible that the mood of our life should be a prayerful mood. Perhaps the word prayer in this verse signifies the overall attitude of our lives, whereas supplication signifies the specific requests which we bring to the Lord.

Standing orders

Year by year, day by day, moment by moment, a Christian has standing orders concerning joy, prayer, and thanksgiving given by Paul and recorded in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18. They represent the will of God in Christ Jesus for us. The words in Christ Jesus remind us that He taught us these things during His earthly ministry and He was the living embodiment of what He taught. By teaching and example, He revealed to us God's will concerning the three standing orders.

5:16. "Rejoice always." Joy can be the constant experience of the Christian, even in the most adverse circumstances, because Christ is the source and subject of his joy, and Christ is in control of the circumstances.

5:17. "Pray." Prayer should be the constant attitude of the Christian not that he abandons his regular duties and gives himself wholly to prayer. He prays at certain regular times; he always prays extemporaneously as need arises; and he enjoys continual communion with the Lord by prayer as he moves through the day.

5:18. "Thanksgiving." Giving thanks to God should be the Christian's native emotion. Because everything works together for good (**Romans 8:28**), we can praise the Lord at all times, in all circumstances, and for everything.

But then we should notice that our requests should be made known to God with thanksgiving. Someone has summarized this verse by saying that we should be "anxious for nothing, prayerful in everything, thankful for anything."

Now go back to **Philippians 4:7**, which completes Paul's thought in verse six. If these attitudes characterize our lives, the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will quard our hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. The peace of God is a sense of holy repose and calmness that floods the soul of the believer when he is leaning hard on upon God. Frances Ridley Havergal caught the power of this truth when he wrote the marvelous words: "Stayed upon Jehovah, Hearts are fully blessed, Finding, as He promised, Perfect peace and rest."

This **peace surpasses all understanding.** People of the world cannot understand it at all, and even Christians possessing it find a wonderful element of mystery about it. They are surprised at their own lack of anxiety in the face of tragedy or adverse circumstances.

What better passage is there to prepare us for a new year and then sustain us for anything that tomorrow brings?

When I was writing copy to prepare our church for a 24/7 prayer chapel ministry, I came home one day to find my wife, Sue, teaching children who had recently trusted Christ as their Savior. Their hearts were tender; their minds were eager. When I listened in for a moment, I was struck by the lesson that she was teaching through memorization. It was a passage from Kenneth Taylor's **The Living Bible** (a

paraphrase). It was **Philippians 4:6**: "Don't worry about anything. Instead pray about everything. Tell God your needs and don't forget to thank Him for His answers." I went immediately to my desk and incorporated it as the lead verse in the study I was preparing--"Seeking for self: PETITION." Literally, there are thousands upon thousands of the Prayer Seminar Workbooks (in many languages) that carry this teaching to the hearts of my students (and others) around the world. I can think of no greater truth to teach "new Christians", either children, your people, or adults. We need the **peace** of God and Paul tells us how to get it.

A Growing Faith

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not of works, lest anyone should boast" **Ephesians 2:8-9.** "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him" (**Hebrews 11:6**).

Paul was always concerned about the faith of God's people. An example is his epistles to the church in Thessalonica. He remembered their "work of faith" (1 Thessalonians 1:3). That faith was also "spread abroad" (1:8). Paul spoke of their growing faith (2 Thessalonians 1:3). He wanted to comfort them "concerning [their] faith" (3:5). Indeed, he was concerned that their faith was "growing" and "showing" in tangible ways.

As a part of our self-examination as we enter a New Year, we need to ask ourselves whether or not we are making progress in our faith and trust of the Lord? Has it grown since we first believed? Has it grown during the past twelve months that we file under **2012**? In my seventy-seventh year, I must ask, "Is my faith growing?" I encourage you to ask the same question.

Frequently our faith grows and matures in the soil of suffering and adversity. On a recording, I have a beautiful rendition of Doug Oldham's Through it All, a song written by Bill and Gloria Gaither. One of the verses declares that "I thank God for the mountains, I thank Him for the valleys, I thank Him for the storms He has brought me through. For if I never had a problem, I would never know that God could solve it, I wouldn't know what faith in Him could do" Then the refrain: "Through it all, I have learned to trust in Jesus, I've learned to trust in God, I've learned to depend upon His Word."

Also, opposition tends to cause faith to become more deeply rooted and strong. During my sixty years in the ministry, I have learned to thank God for any person or any circumstance that drives me to my knees.



PRESSING TOWARD THE GOAL



REFLECTIONS FROM THE MAILBOX



A needed reminder

You and I will never meet a person whom God does not love. Therefore, whenever we see any man, we ought to see him through the eyes of Christ. The lost man is a man for whom Christ died, and the saved man is a man in whom Christ lives. We must accept and love both. There is a "royal law," so named because it rules over all other laws and fulfills them (Romans 13:8-10; James 2:8). We are to practice love toward everyone. Loving one another is the "royal law."

An appointment

Hebrews 9:27 assures us of two things. First, that man will died, and secondly, judgment follows. This is an appointment that every person will keep. How wonderful to know that because of His full and complete work for us, the fear of death is gone. Note, too, that after death there is not an intermediate state of purgatory; there is no second chance! Let every reader ask himself whether or not he/she knows the Lord and has the assurance of salvation.

Cultivate

Get to know the Holy Spirit. Welcome Him in your life daily. When you read Scripture, ask Him to give you insight and understanding so that you will become grounded in the Word, able to discern between what is true and what is false. Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you to pray, to worship, and to love the Lord Jesus Christ more deeply. Remember, the Spirit comes to reveal Jesus to us.

Let God

Wouldst thou be a teacher? Then let God teach thee. Wouldst thou be a leader? Then let God lead thee. Wouldst thou be a helper? Then let God help thee. The prepared soul must be of most exquisite sympathy and have a tenderness that is born of suffering and the compassion that is conceived in love. The effective instrument must be so attuned to the heart of Christ that he may be freely wielded.

A beautiful benediction "He is able"

Jude closes with a beautiful benediction. **Verse 24** is the ascription of praise and worship to Him who is able. He is able to save (Hebrews 7:25), able to establish (Romans **16:25**), able to aid (**Hebrews 2:18**), able to subdue (Philippians 3:21) and here He is able to keep. He is able to keep that which we have committed to Him until that Day (2 Timothy 2:1), He is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think (Ephesians 3:20), and He is able to keep us from stumbling. This latter promise is especially timely for the days of apostasy to which Jude is referring.

But the promise doesn't stop there. He is able to make us stand faultless in the presence of His glory with exceeding joy. This is truly stupendous!
