

actions. It means a program of study and analysis of each candidate not only for the Presidency, the highest office in the land, but for all other offices where important issues are at stake. Your kingdom come and Your will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. We ask Your help in the name of Jesus and for Your glory. Amen."

Read your Bible daily. Expect the Holy Spirit to bring the Word you read alive and then apply it to the

issues of the day. Listen as you read with the intention of obeying the Word. Remember that prayer is the Lighthouse that pushes against the spiritual darkness. Don't forget to include your family and your friends. Before you finish your conversations, join hands and pray God's Choice for President be revealed as well as for other elected offices. Pray that the great American dream which drew our forefathers to this land be revived. Our freedoms were founded on their religious faith. The same religious faith can keep them alive! From their Bibles came the idea that each person is of infinite worth and that anyone may rise by faith and perseverance from even humble beginnings to positions of top leadership and service and even become President. ISRAEL = "Ruled by God"

"Thy name shall be called no more Jacob, but Israel" (Genesis 32:28).

There are two chapters in Genesis that are central to understanding the story of Jacob Chapters 32-33. In chapter 32, we are privileged to read of a night of struggle through which Jacob passed on his route home from twenty years in Haran. Actually, God had told him that it was time to return home. The background of Jacob's pilgrimage is summed up in Genesis 30:43: "Thus the man [Jacob] became exceedingly prosperous, and had large flocks, female and male servants, and camels and donkeys." The saga continues as chapter 31 is introduced: "Now Jacob heard the words of Laban's sons, saying, 'Jacob has taken away all that was our father's, and from what was our father's he has acquired all this wealth.' And Jacob saw the countenance of Laban, and indeed it was not favorable toward him as before. Then the Lord said to Jacob. 'Return to the land of your fathers and to your family, and I will be with you' " (31:1-3).

The night of struggle occurred at "God's camp" where an army of angels met him. "And he called the name of that place, Mahanaim" (Genesis 32:1-2). He had sent messengers to Esau, his brother, who lived in the land of Seir (Petra) in Edom to inform him that he was on his way home and to tell him that he hoped to "find favor in [his] sight" v 5). When the messengers returned they reported that Esau was coming to meet him accompanied by four hundred men" (v 6). It is easy to understand

why "Jacob was greatly afraid and distressed" (v 7).

The story continues. Jacob prayed to God that he might be delivered from Esau's rage. Jacob reminded God about the promises He had made to both Isaac and Abraham. Further, God had told Jacob to return home to his country and family and had promised to do well with him. He confessed his humility before God's mercy in these words: "I am not worthy of the least of all the mercies and of all the truth which You have shown Your servant" (v 10). Christians today can likewise base their prayers on God's proven character and His promises in the Bible.

Jacob arose that night and took his family over the ford at Jabbok. Then "he was left alone and a man wrestled with him until the breaking of day" (32:22-24). He said: "I will not let You go until You bless me" (v 26). The blessing was a new name. No longer would he be "Jacob" (supplanter), he would be ISRAEL. Israel is a compound of two words. Isr, which means ruled, and El, the name of God, and so means Ruledby-God. It was that night that he was delivered from a self-sufficiency that would have ruined him. That explains all the story of that night. G. Campbell Morgan explained: "God crippled him to crown him, revealed his weakness to teach Him the secret of strength, defeated him that he might find victory." Morgan went on to say: "From that day, Jacob halted in his walk, and that halt was the patent of his nobility. Whatever others thought of it, it was the abiding sign of God's victory, and that he was a man ruled by God."

The fundamental lesson of a walk of faith is that we must be ruled by God. It is significant that Jacob named the altar that he built at Bethel "El-Elohe-Israel." It means "God, the God of the one ruled by God" (33:20). A further lesson that needs to be learned is that it is only possible to be "ruled by God" when we walk in Divine strength. My greatest personal desire is to be "ruled by God" every step of the journey home. On the same level, may JGHM be "ruled by God!"

DR HENRY'S OBSERVATIONS

We introduced Martin Shikuku to the Reflector readers in 2006 as one of the four pastors who attended the April course on prayer sponsored by Dr. Jim Britt's Institute working in East Africa. Over 100 pastors were in the course at Brackenhurst but these four felt God's call to bring prayer seminars to their own areas. Through God's grace, we were able to begin work in west Kenya with Martin as the coordinator arranging the venue. He had translated the English prayer seminar workbook into Swahili in longhand, Dr. James Kaleli, at that time a professor at Liberty Baptist Theological Seminary (Lynchburg, Virginia) reviewed the manuscript and edited as appropriate. Then his two daughters typed the document following the format of the English workbook. A series of seminars were scheduled in west Kenva November 18-25, 2007.

Following the tradition in many cultures around the world, Martin's church presented their "teacher" with gifts including a beautiful carving of a Big Elephant with a small elephant attached. The symbolism was explained. I was the big elephant and Martin and other pastors were the little elephants, who pledged to follow my footsteps and provide prayer seminars for East and Central Africa. This indeed was both an encouraging and humbling moment. I shared a picture of the elephants along with the story of the Big Elephant and the Little Elephant in the January 2008 Reflector. Little did I know the events that would

completely devastate Martin, his family, and his congregation.

On Monday, January 7, 2008, I wrote to the **Doorkeepers** an urgent letter: "My heart is broken. The little elephants are in trouble!" Following a contested national election in late December 2007, a conflict broke out bringing unbelievable chaos and turmoil to the nation resulting in many people murdered and great destruction. In Martin's church community, few homes were left standing. Martin's father-in-law was murdered in a nearby field. His Associate Pastor's beautiful home was destroyed! The Shikuku family lived in two small rooms adjacent to the very modest meeting place the church gathered. He fled with his family including his wife and four children. Although the modest buildings were not burned, everything was taken. For several days we did not know whether Martin and his family were alive or dead. We did know that his area was devastated. Finally, an e-mail came on January 7: "Praise God that I am still alive and my family. Ran to the police state on 31st. Whole village burnt. We have been sleeping outside on the ground. No food, clothing, house. Everything looted from my house. My members are totally discouraged, hungry without a home, some with loved ones dead. My father-in-law was murdered in the field near the church."

In response to my letter, the **Doorkeepers** gave over \$13,000 to re-establish Martin's ministry. We were able to provide funds for a rental house in the city, purchase living essentials and clothing, and travel funds for a bus or taxi. Later, a small sedan was purchased

to enable the Shikukus to travel to and from church and for Martin to pursue his ministry. Later we were able to upgrade to a van (very much needed!). The progress has been thrilling to witness. God has blessed the building of the largest Baptist church building in the Rift Valley. Prayer seminars have been conducted in Tanzania, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

At the end of January 2016, Martin and his family are scheduled to move into a new pastor's home adjacent to the church compound. This saves rent and travel money! Glory Baptist Church, founded by Martin in 1997, has thrived. Not only are the facilities adequate for his growing congregation, they are beautiful beyond words. I wish that all the **Doorkeepers** could see for themselves what God has accomplished through a man named Martin Shikuku. Through the giving of the **Doorkeepers** we have helped provide funds to underpin this great work. All over Kenya, lighthouses of prayer are being established. The prayer seminars have gone into Tanzania, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. In 2008, Martin took his first plane ride going with me to the Burundi and the Congo for prayer seminars! Twice, he has been able to visit the United States where he won the hearts of many people and moved many to higher ground in their own spiritual lives and commitments! He is God's man and demonstrates by his walk and talk!

Based on Martin's commitment and exemplary leadership as pastorteacher-evangelist-missionary, the JGHM BOARD OF DIRECTORS has decided to focus support for the next few years on JGHM: EAST/CENTRAL AFRICA BRANCH, an entity launched with Martin the leader. The decision was based on the evidence that the needed work is being done; the results speak for themselves.

Martin needs new tires for his vehicle! Martin needs prayer and financial support for the upcoming Nairobi prayer seminars. He needs funds for Swahili and English prayer seminar workbooks and pens for the participants. One of the greatest expenses is to provide a basic, simple meal for the participants. Since some travel great distances at areat sacrifice to be in a seminar, we must provide food to sustain them. Thankfully, the Doorkeepers have continued faithful in their giving. As God has called home to Heaven some who gave liberally, others have come along side us to take their place. Since Sue and I do not look to the Doorkeepers for our own needs, we are able to continue to be a channel for the funds entrusted to **JGHM**. Truly, we are partners with God to make such a work possible. Thousands have been taught. Hundreds have come to Christ, In eternity, I believe we will all rejoice when some come to us and say, "Thank you for giving to the Lord!" We have the opportunity to be Ropeholders for one of the most fruitful work that is going on anywhere in the world today. Will you be a Ropeholder for this great work? Thank you for being partners with Martin and his team to establish Lighthouses of Prayer pushing against the spiritual darkness in East and Central Africa.
