BASIC REMINDERS TO ENTER 2013

So much of what is said has already been said. Great truths and great principles bear repeating. Frankly, it is easy (even for a mature Christian) to forget. When this comes about, he/she will begin to drift and become at ease in Zion.

You may wonder how I can make this statement with certainty. Simple. I've been there! I've done that although I knew that the closer walk with the Lord (which He desires) was possible. As we enter 2013, a new year that brings a new, fresh beginning, a few reminders of things we already know are in order.

Prayer is the work that must come before all other work both in our individual lives and in our churches. Study once again the Greater Works passage in John 14:12-24. Remember this is from the **Upper Room Discourse** section of Scripture that records Jesus' final instructions to His disciples. He is leaving and they will be left on earth to carry out His work. They will be able to do Greater Works than He did while on earth. How can this be possible? He told them the secret would be coming to the Father and asking things in His name. Ask in Jesus' name is an expression that can be translated simply as A very helpful thing to remember is what prayer is. Prayer is coming to the Father through the Son in the power of the Holy Spirit. You are wise to address your prayers to the Father of the Lord Jesus Christ who is now your Father based on your placing your trust and faith in Jesus. When a Christian begins to pray, he is not going to a stranger! You are going to your Father whom Jesus called Abba. And look what happened when vou became a Christian: And because you are sons, God has sent forth the Spirit of His Son into your hearts, crying out 'Abba, Father' (Galatians 4:6).

Exceeding Abundantly


Now to Him who is able to do exceeding abundantly above all we ask or think, according to the power that works in us (**Ephesians 3:20**).

When I was president at Northeastern Bible College (Essex Fells, New Jersey), I became acquainted with the late **Dr.** Donald Grey Barnhouse, pastor, Philadelphia's Tenth Presbyterian Church, a mentor and close friend of Dr. Charles Anderson, founder of Northeastern and pastor of the great Brookdale Baptist Church in Bloomfield, NJ. As Dr. Anderson shared many experiences from his time with Dr. Barnhouse that had influenced his life and ministry, my interest in this man of God was peaked. I began to listen to taped sermons of this great man of God and noted something about his approach to God when he prayed, both at the beginning and ending of his messages. He first acknowledged the Father, then the Son, and then the Holy Spirit. I loved this approach. After a time, I felt an impression from the Holy Spirit urging me to emulate this approach in my own praying and teaching. Then one day my wife, Sue and I, were sharing the prayer seminar in Zambia. When I was teaching what prayer is coming to the Father, through the Son, in the power of the Holy Spirit, she said that I should always anchor this truth/principle of praying with Paul's word to the Ephesian believers: For through Him [Jesus] we both have access by one Spirit to the Father (Ephesians 2:18). Excellent! We need to be reminded of that

We need to be reminded of that which we already know. Then we need to practice what we know. We know that the Father is on His throne in Heaven's Throne Room with His Son seated in the position of honor and authority at His right hand. We know that the Son is making intercession for us (Hebrews 7:25, Hebrews 9:24, Romans 8:34). Mercy and grace are available to us when we come to the

Father through the Son in the power of the Holy Spirit (**Hebrews 4:16, 10:19**). Not only would this approach keep our mind from wandering as we remember we are in the very presence of our Heavenly Father, having an audience with Him, our tendency to ramble would soon dissipate.

We need to be reminded that we will never win the war if we do not know where the battle is being fought. We definitely need to remember that we are literally engaging in nothing less than spiritual warfare when we pray. This leads us to the **Spiritual Warfare** passage in **Ephesians 6:10-18**.

Paul admonishes us to put on the whole armor of God in order to stand against the forces of hell. It is clear that our warfare is not against physical forces, but against invisible powers who have clearly defined levels of authority (Ephesians 6:12, based on the words used there are four layers of power). Paul, however, not only warns us of a clearly defined structure in the invisible realm, he instructs us to take up the whole armor of God in order to maintain a battle-stance against this unseen satanic hierarchy of organization. All of this armor is not just a passive protection in facing the enemy; it is to be used offensively against these satanic forces.

Note Paul's final directive; we are to be 'praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit (**Ephesians 6:18**). Thus prayer is not so much a weapon, or even a part of the armor, as it is **the means by which we engage in the battle itself and the purpose for which we are armed**. It is the place where the battle is fought! Remember the axiom that was postulated earlier, You will never win the war if you don't know where the battle is being fought.

To put on the armor of God is to prepare for battle. Prayer is the battle itself, with God's Word being our chief weapon employed against Satan during our struggle.

Thus, the other major area in which we need reminding is the role of the Word of God in our lives and in our prayers. There is no substitute for the Word of God. In fact, my strong recommendation is to begin your Quiet Hour letting God speak to you from His Word. Although any Word is good, reading systematically is a wise approach for a steady diet. Just how important is the Word related to prayer? The direct words of Jesus will reflect the importance of both the Word and Prayer: If [when] you abide in Me, and My words abide in you (that's Bible reading!), you will ask what you will (that's prayer!), and it shall be done for you (that's a promise!) (John 15:7).

One could only wonder what would happen in 2013, in our lives and in our churches, if individual believers would implement in their lives two major provisions that God has provided His children the written Word of God and prayer? My invitation to our readers is the same as the one given in **Zechariah 8:21b:** Let us continue to go and pray before the Lord, and seek the Lord of hosts. I myself will go also. With the Spirit's help, we can become mighty in prayer resulting in seeing many peoples and strong nations seeking the Lord and praying before Him (v 22).

- **6. Watch your heart.** Set your affections upon things above.
- 7. Watch your will. Watch your will. Be sure it is Spirit controlled.

From the outset of my pastoral ministry in 1953, singing with the children was an integral feature of each worship service. Recently I ran across the binder that contained the choruses/ music that we used. It holds precious memories. One of the songs was Oh be careful little hands what you do, Oh be careful little hands what you do, For the Father up above is looking down in love, So be careful little hands what you do. Then little feet where you go,little ears what you hear, little mouth what you say, and little eyes what you see.

The power of music to teach great moral lessons is undeniable.

As you enter 2013, don't forget Paul's reminder to the Corinthian believers, Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore, glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's (1 Corinthians 6:19-20). Through the Holy Spirit's help, we can so glorify Him.


My decision was to do something about my situation. I developed a plan, an approach a daily, systematic through the Bible in a year reading program. After reading the Bible through in 1977, my life changed! Each year for the past thirty-five years, I have repeated the journey always using a new study Bible, taking a page of notes out of my reading every day, adding to my knowledge and spiritual understanding. I begin my day reading the Word. Once I have heard God speaking to me through His Word, I am in a position to speak to Him from my heart.

Knowledge, then Understanding

An excerpt from Dr. Henry's book, A Christian's Necessary Food (available upon request from JGHM).



When we read the Bible, we are placing ourselves before God for Him to work in us! We simply must place ourselves in the path of His grace, and seek Him. Physical exercise promotes physical strength. Bible reading is spiritual exercise and promotes spiritual strength. As you and I would go to gym and use a weight machine, we need to go to our appointed place and engage in spiritual exercise and promote spiritual strength. As I write this copy, my wife, Sue, is using an exercise machine. The results are dramatic!

In **1 Peter 2:2**, Peter depicts the **attitude** of a newborn baby. Peter notes that our attitude toward the Word should be the same that a baby has toward the milk. Just as the baby reaches for the source of his milk, we

need to reach for the Book. Milk is necessary to sustain life physically; the Scriptures sustain life spiritually. Our **appetite** should be for the Word which is what **desire** means long for crave the spiritual milk of God's Word. The **aim** is that we may grow toward spiritual maturity. There is no substitute for the Word of God in Christian growth!

- 2. Bible study is essential to **spiritual maturity.** What an amazing summary is found in Hebrews 5:11-**14**! The key word in the passage is time. Underline it in your study Bible. By virtue of the passing of time, the writer says, the believers should be teachers. Instead, they have to go back to kindergarten and learn their ABCs all over again. When they should be communicating the truth to others as teachers someone must communicate the elementary truths to them. Truly, the believers still needed milk not solid food which is for the mature. The mature believer, according to the text, is one who has trained himself through constant use of Scriptures to distinguish good from evil. The mark of spiritual maturity is not how much you understand, but how much you use. In the spiritual realm, the opposite of ignorance is not knowledge, but obedience.
- **3. Bible study is essential to spiritual effectiveness.** According to Paul, "**All** Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work" (**2 Timothy 3:16-17**). Note the "how" of the equipping: through **teaching**, tells us what to do; through **reproof**, tells us what not to do; and, through **correction**, tells us

what to do when we have done what we were told not to do. You will note that covers about everything. The content of the Scripture is what will structure your thinking. That's critical, because you will not live correctly if you don't think correctly. What you put into your mind will determine how you behave. You and I are to "renew" our minds by putting the Word of God into our minds (**Romans 12:2**). There is no substitute for the Word of God.

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
