

# Satisfied with Jesus



# "I am satisfied with Jesus" ... "Is my Master satisfied with me?" Time to take inventory!

In 1926, B. B. McKinney (1886-1952), one of my favorite hymnists. wrote a song entitled "Satisfied With Jesus." From the first time I heard it, the message lodged in my psyche and still enters my conscious thoughts often. When this happens, I even hear the melody! Apart from Jesus Christ no man, woman or child can ever be truly satisfied. Read the lyrics for yourself to remember what Jesus has done for you. Then focus on the questions: "Is my Master satisfied with me?" "Can He always count on me?" "Is He satisfied with me?"

What better time than preparing for a New Year is there to examine our lives? Let's take a look back over the past twelve months? Can you say without equivocation that right at this very moment that you are satisfied with Jesus? But that sounds impossible you say. It does, doesn't it? However if a Christian is out of fellowship with God, he or she will not be at rest. There will be no deep, settled peace of satisfaction

So what does it mean for a Christian to be out of fellowship with God? One way

to explain this state is to recall our childhood. When we were children and disobeyed our parents, dissatisfaction set in. It could have been from guilt, fear of being caught, dread of punishment, shame or perhaps something else. Regardless, we felt unsettled and had no satisfaction because we were out of fellowship with our parents. In other words, we were not at peace with ourselves. Our parents were still our parents, and we were still their child, but the line of communication was broken, and it could not be restored until the problem was rectified. Once everything was out in the open and the problem was resolved, satisfaction was restored.

This is why the Lord provided 1 John 1:9 for His children, which says, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." There is a land of beginning again!

Even Christians will try wrong paths to get to the place they need to be in order to have a restored satisfaction. "Things" won't satisfy; "new experiences" won't bring peace and happiness. When the "newness" fades the sense of dissonance rears its head again. Happiness comes only from a close relationship with Jesus Christ, and then satisfaction is found, true satisfaction that lasts. Then we can sing the song "Satisfied With Jesus" with joy, because peace has been restored within our soul.

# SATISFIED WITH JESUS

1 I am satisfied with Jesus, He has done so much for me: He has suffered to redeem me, He has died to set me free.

# Chorus:

I am satisfied, I am satisfied, I am satisfied with Jesus, But the question comes to me, As I think of Calvary, Is my Master satisfied with me?

2 He is with me in my trials, Best of friends of all is He; I can always count on Jesus, Can He always count on me? [Chorus]

3 I can hear the voice of Jesus, Calling out so pleadingly, "Go and win the lost and straying"; Is He satisfied with me? [Chorus]

4 When my work on earth is ended, And I cross the mystic sea, Oh, that I could hear Him saying, "I am satisfied with thee." [Chorus] Those who are not true Christians of course will never be satisfied with their lives because they do not know Jesus Christ. Until they come to Him in faith and accept His gift of salvation, they will always be reaching for something, but never satisfied.

Today, as never before, it is imperative to bring another point concerning satisfaction into the open. We are in a spiritual war. There are dark forces in this world that will never be satisfied until havoc is brought upon mankind. These forces always hunger for more, continuing to pull man on down to even darker areas of perversion. The principalities and powers Paul spoke of (Ephesians 6:12) are very real. A Satanic hierarchy or organization prevails: Satan is the commander-inchief. Under Satan there are mighty generals reporting to him. Then there are the other officers reporting to the generals. The lowest level of the Satanic hierarchy is the footsoldiers in the war (the demons and one-third of the angels). The evil heart of man is also very real. When the two get together, satisfaction is never found. In this dark world, only something more evil than the last action will do, but then that too must be topped with something else even more outlandish. Look around you to see the truth of this observation.

There once was a day when it was disgraceful to have a child out of wedlock, but today it is joyfully announced. There was a time when homosexuality was a perversion, but today it is an alternate lifestyle.

Once upon a time men showed respect toward women because they witnessed first-hand the respect their dad showed their mother.

Today that is laughable in some circles, and some women reject it, because they have no respect for themselves.

My early education was at the White Pine (Tennessee) School. During my twelve years there, I was never instructed [required] to read anything in school that was considered trash. Today, it has gone beyond trash. It's unspeakable what even very young children are required to read.

Are you getting the point? I could go on indefinitely, and so could you. This world is not getting better, because evil can never be satisfied to stay in one place. It must continue to grow and grow. It's like a cancer. It will never go away on its own. It will only increase in its perverted activities.

Jesus made it abundantly clear that evil in the world would increase and eventually get to the point that He would have to come and put a stop to it, just as He did in Noah's day and Lot's day. Maybe He knew something about being satisfied. Maybe He knew that evil can never be satisfied. Maybe He knew that with each passing year evil would just get more and more shocking, and society (as the frog in the slowly heated water) would hardly notice.

One doesn't have to go any further than Romans 1:18-32, or 2 Timothy 3:1-9 or 2 Peter chapters two and three or Jude to see a snapshot of our world today. You would think that Paul, Peter and Jude were given a birds-eye view of what we have become today. I could also mention Revelation chapters two and three. John must have been looking down on us too.

Friends, are you satisfied with your life? If you don't have Jesus in your life, you may think you're satisfied, but you're not. I'll prove it. You think you're satisfied now? Give it a little time and you will be yearning for something else.

Time is running out. From what I see in the Scriptures, we have just about reached the end of God's patience. Very soon, the Lord God is going to say, "It's time."

"5 Then the LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. 6 And the LORD was sorry that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in his heart. 7 So the LORD said, "I will destroy man whom I have created from the face of the earth; both man, and beast, and the creeping thing, and the birds of the air; for I am sorry that I have made them. 8 But Noah found grace in the eyes of the LORD." (Genesis 6:5-8)

Have you "found grace in the eyes of the LORD?" If so, you have found true satisfaction and you will not be disappointed. If you have not, don't laugh it off as they did in Noah's day. Those who laughed found no sanctuary in the Ark. They drowned while scratching on the sides of the Ark trying to get in. They could not get in though, because God shut the door (Genesis 7:16).

What will it be? Can you say with B. B. McKinney, "I am satisfied with Jesus?" Then move on to the other side of the question, "Is my Master satisfied with me?"

Take inventory. "Let a man examine himself" (1 Corinthians 11:28a), Paul instructed the believers

at Corinth. Be sure you are in the faith. Be sure you have moved from mere "intellectual belief" to "saving belief" by placing your faith and trust in the Lord Jesus Christ as your Savior. Be sure that you are not being molded by the world. Worldliness has been a battle from the beginning of your Christian life. James, the half-brother of Jesus and a leader in the church at Jerusalem, said bluntly, "whoever is a friend of the world is the enemy of God" (James 4:4).

When I became a Christian, the people in my church cautioned: "Don't go to the movies because the world is on display and we must guard against worldliness." Even today, I am uncomfortable in going to the theatre and feel out of place. I cringe when I hear a preacher use an illustration or quotes from a movie. But now, we have things coming into our homes that are 10,000 times worse than anything shown on the screen sixty years ago. We have sin coming into our homes in living color. Now the internet is the vehicle that is being used to defile and defeat the Christian walk.

Adults should remember that the children are watching. Satan must have been pleased at an incident that was shared in a prayer seminar. A fifth grade teacher said she was standing in her classroom door talking with three of her fifth graders when two teachers, a beautiful young lady and a handsome young man, came up the corridor. One student observed, "Look at them! Don't they make a pretty couple!" The second student responded, "Yes they do! They ought to get married!" The third student retorted, "Get

married? They can't get married! He is already married." The student who initiated the conversation came back with a statement, "Well, they could have an affair." There is a constant bombardment during our waking hours to be drawn into this insidious attack of Satan.

For the Christian, the main thing is to keep the main thing the main thing. I have found it helpful to use the five emphases of the early church in Jerusalem as a pattern to live by: (1) the doctrine (the Word of God); (2) Spirit-filled (controlled) living; (3) Prayer; (4) Witnessing (Psalm 126:5-6); and (5) Stewardship (managing what belongs to the Lord). The voice of God is heard in the Word of God. The will of God for every believer is that he/she be Spirit-controlled (note the analogy of the drunk person in Ephesians 5:18. Prayer is the work that must come before all other work. Witnessing keeps us depending on the Lord. Stewardship is acknowledging that we don't own our lives. He does.

If you seriously examine your life and find you are not as close to the Lord as you used to be, don't be mistaken as to who moved! God did not move away from you. In His sovereignty, He has provided a way to reverse the direction (James 4:8). If you are out of fellowship with Jesus, don't waste time in regret or in morbid introspection. Simply say, "Lord, I'm coming home" and do it. There is a land of beginning again. May 2015 be the best year ever as you walk with the King each day.
