

PRESSING TOWARD THE GOAL

Christ's last word to both individual Christians and Churches Acts 1:8: "Be a witness!"

Acts 1:8

Perhaps Acts 1:8 is the most important call for believers today as far as carrying out the Great Commission is concerned. Forty days after His resurrection, the Lord Jesus Christ gathered His followers on Mount Olive. His final words were His directive to the disciples to carry the Gospel to everyone everywhere. The sense is that Jesus told them to "be witnesses" in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and to the uttermost part of the world. In essence, He said, "Don't even think about witnessing until the Holy Spirit comes."

800 years before this event, the prophet Joel looked into the future and said that one day the Holy Spirit would make His residence on earth and would be available for everyone who trusted Jesus as their Savior and Lord. Before He was crucified. in the final hours, He was in the Upper Room giving final instructions to those whom He loved. His own chosen disciples who would carry on His work. Every believer should master John 13, 14, 15, 16, 17. His very words were "I am going to ask the Father to send you another Helper (the Holy Spirit); He will abide with you forever" (John 14:16). Clearly, the time was drawing near for the Holy Spirit to come.

Why should the disciples await the arrival of the Holy Spirit before beginning their task of witnessing? Simply, they needed "power" that they did not have. The needed "power" that would come from the Holy Spirit.

The word "power" means ability or capacity. Jesus promised when the Holy Spirit came His followers would have a new ability. The ability had more to do with being than doing. The believers would "be witnesses," not just "do witnessing."

TIME FOR SELF-EXAMINATION If not you, who? If not now, when? If not here, where?

The power came from without, not from within. The believers were not to manufacture their own ways of proclaiming the gospel but to look for supernatural ability from the Spirit to make them effective in gospel presentation. The power came when the Holy Spirit arrived, not before. Finally, the believers were to be witnesses to Christ, not to themselves. They were to make disciples not to themselves, but to the risen Lord (Matthew 28:18-20).

There was a time in a typical Baptist congregation that there was great emphasis on bringing others to Christ. During my tenure as Vice President for Academic Affairs at Liberty Baptist College (now Liberty University), I served as the Director for Evangelism for the Strawberry Baptist Association for several years. Initially, there seemed to be some resistance to suggestions for the churches to become evangelistic. However, it was not very long until the "burden for evangelism" came. To promote evangelism, the Evangelism Committee scheduled evangelism rallies challenging each church to be represented. The last rally I attended before leaving the pastorate at the Pleasant View Baptist Church and my position at Liberty was at the Bedford Baptist Church. Over 700 attended on a Sunday afternoon! Frank Crumpler, who quite effectively led the Evangelism Department of the Home Mission Board (now the North American Mission Board), and I often exchanged ideas about building evangelistic churches. A number of the ideas that were developed in the Strawberry Baptist Association were carried over into the work that the Home Mission Board was promoting.

One of the saddest verses for me that is used in the prayer seminar is Isaiah 59:16: "And He saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no intercessor." God looked down in Isaiah's day and did not find intercessors. I wonder what His written assessment of what is happening in our churches today would be. Likely, the statement would be "And He saw there was no man, and wondered that there was no witness." Seldom is evangelism mentioned in most of our Baptist churches today. I speak of "Baptist" because I know "Baptists" like the back of my hand! Surely, the "power" is still available! Let's be Acts 1:8 believers! Let's be Acts 1:8 churches.

Grace first, then peace

Paul greets the saints in both Rome and Galatia with the lovely salutation; "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 1:7; Colossians 1:2). In fact, this was his customary greeting in his epistles. One variation is in the pastoral epistles written to Timothy and Titus, he adds "mercy."

"Grace." "Peace." No two words could better embrace the blessings of Christianity. Grace (charis) was a common Greek expression, while peace (shalom) was the common Jewish greeting. Grace pictures God stooping down to sinful, lost humanity in loving and tender compassion. Peace summarizes all that results in the life of a person when he accepts God's grace as free aift.

The order of the words is significant: grace first and then peace. If God had never first reached out in love and mercy toward us, we would still be in our sins. But because He took the initiative and sent His Son to die for us, we now can have peace with God, peace with man, and the peace of God in our souls. What a wonderful provision!

As you step into 2016, our wish for all our Doorkeepers and readers is God's abounding grace and peace for you and your family.

The **Reflector** began as one $8\frac{1}{2}$ x 14 inches sheet (front and back) to serve as a regular contact with the families of Liberty Avenue Baptist Church, Berea, Kentucky. The postage was one penny. I was a student at Berea College committed to high academic standards. Study time was long and demanding. As did every other student at Berea College. I worked on campus ten hours a week. The congregation had gone through an upheaval that caused a lot of wounded believers. To help in the healing process, I wanted to "pastor" the flock, but understood that I had limited time. In addition, I wanted to be in every home including the unsaved. The Reflector provided a vehicle to make the weekly contacts that I could not make personally.

As the years progressed, it became clear that all printed materials, including the Sunday bulletin, should not only provide information about activities, but each issue afforded a time for inspiration. The following is from the January 1992 issue: "The Reflector will help you in the discipline of daily Bible reading and daily praying. Many of the articles will be useful for both private and family devotions. We want to be helpers of your joy by encouraging and challenging you. If something

touches your heart devotionally, be sure to share it with others. Share the studies, the quotes, Notes from My Bible, Scriptures." We pray your lives will be enriched in this new year of publication.

For sixty-one years, I have had the readers on my mind. Myriad times I have asked the readers to pray for me as I compose the articles as well as chose nuggets from others to share with you. Many of you have said that you pray for Sue and me every day. I can tell you without equivocation that God has heard and answered those prayers. We are grateful. Thank you for receiving us into your homes.

On the road

For the past thirty-five years, I have been "on the road" carrying out the work that the Father has assigned to me. In the annual reports, "days on the road" included days requiring overnights and days that did not require being away from home the former greatly outnumbering the latter. Although my wife, Sue, has accompanied me as often as her hospital schedule allowed her, she has "held down the fort" and "stayed by the stuff."

one resurrection. At the rapture, only believers will be raised (1 Corinthians 15:23; 1 Thessalonians 4:16). The wicked dead will be raised at the end of the Millennial, the thousand-year reign of Christ (Revelation 20:5).

His resurrection is the pledge and proof of ours. 
Morbid Introspection
