

AMERICA IS IN TROUBLE!
"CONFUSION" "PERPLEXITIES"

Over the years I have used the July issue of the **Reflector** to celebrate America, the land of the free and the home of the brave. I gladly said "Happy Birthday, America" and felt good about it. I lauded our national motto, "In God We Trust." Sometimes an emphasis has been placed on the many tokens of acknowledgement of God in our Nation's capital. Any visitor would go away with not a doubt of hesitation that the intention of our founding fathers and national leaders was to acknowledge our belief and dependence on God. Further, I can testify from traveling almost three millions miles throughout the nations that the people of the world have long looked upon America as a "Christian" nation. Much of our success has been attributed to a strong foundation that was established by our moral character.

For most of my life, no person whom I know would have ever dreamed that a time would come when that very moral character would be openly and brazenly attacked as it has been the past few decades. I want to preface my remarks with a foundational Scripture: "Do not be deceived [man or nation], God is not mocked; for whatever a [man or nation] sows, that he [or the entity] will also reap." (Galatians 6:7)

In 1963, this prayer in schools was banned by the Supreme Court: "Almighty God, we acknowledge our dependence upon Thee and beg Thy blessing upon us, our parents, our teachers, and the country." Billy Graham, America's leading evangelist, at that time cautioned: "We are sowing to the wind and will reap a whirlwind."

For some years, the attack upon our moral structure has been subtle. Our forefathers would simply have not tolerated the open defiance of God and His Word that has transpired. What has happened the past few years is incredible to those of us who know our history. Much has transpired

AMERICA IS IN TROUBLE!

"Abomination" expresses the highest level of God's reaction toward wickedness. Included in the morally abominable practices to be totally rejected by believers are homosexuality (Leviticus 18:22; 20:13), engaging in occult practices (Deuteronomy 18:9-14), and conducting dishonest business (Deuteronomy 25:13-16). Proverbs 6:16-19 lists seven more abominations that will awaken God's wrath. It is most important to be repulsed by that which is repulsive to God.

Deuteronomy 22:5 considers cross-dressing as an abomination. The Bible teaching is plainly worded. The basic principle presented here is that males and females are to honor the dignity of their own sex and not attempt to adopt the appearance or role of the other. This verse clearly forbids transvestism, which is a deviant form of sexual behavior.

America was built on the teachings of the Word of God. When the foundations crumble, what are believers to do? Stand up on your knees! PRAY! The "nations that forget God will be turned into hell" (Psalm 9:17).

under the guise of "civil liberties," supposedly as mandated by the Constitution itself. The attitude of deliberately defying God in our judicial process is dangerous. The home is under attack. Traditional marriage is being laid aside. Same sex marriage is now the law of the land. What the Bible calls "abominations" are openly espoused and defended by our federal government in spite of the will of the people. Many "laws" have been created through administrative/executive orders, bypassing the constitutional authority of Congress and our courts. The most recent one has directed the nation's public schools to allow transgendered students use of restrooms and locker rooms based on gender identity, not biological sex. Open lawlessness is supported while our police are told to allow the overt defiance. The attack against the long-standing cultural mores is being led by a very small, highly vocal gay minority. Much chaos has been promoted by a very small number of people. The result is indecency, debauchery, open godless immorality, moral degradation. Our way of life is under attack.

Actually I have five pages of notes describing the chaos that prevails. Space will not allow me to elaborate with myriad examples of the state of affairs. Suffice it to say that America is being stripped of its biblical heritage. Christianity is under attack. Hostility is growing by the day. The defiance is so great that many do not want Jesus to reign over us. They do not want anything to do with Him or His Word. The name of Jesus and His followers are hated.

It is God who gave us freedom,

and if we ignore God and shake our clinched fists in His face, He will bring judgment on this nation. Many godly people firmly believe that we are close to that judgment. Some believe it has already started.

My advice to Christians is to read the Bible and determine to stand for what the Bible says. When you have any doubts, remember this adage: "When the Bible says it, that settles it!" Ask God to lead you to a church that has not abandoned evangelism and the old-time religion. Seek the old paths.

Intercession: Prayer as Work

Prayer is the work that must come before all other work (John 14:12-14). The greatest need is for intercessors. It is time Christians take prayer seriously and become intercessors.

Charles Stanley was right when he said: "Intercessory prayer is the most powerful thing a person can do for the nation. We need repentance, not just blessing. We need the kind of praying that moves the hand of God. We must pray that the Lord Himself will raise up hundreds of thousands of intercessors." God forbid that it should be said: "[He looked down] and He saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no intercessor" (Isaiah 59:16).

Do not forget that effective, strategic intercession takes time, is a tough, energy-consuming battle, and not simply some mystical enjoyment. As intercessors, we must surrender ourselves to God in humiliation and be united with Christ in the Holy Spirit. Intercessors must pray perseveringly and sacrificially. Such is possible only through living a Spirit-controlled life. A commitment must be made!

The Word of God

Caution! Please do not neglect the Bible in your prayer life. George Mueller tells us that he learned to pray effectively by meditation on the Word of God early in the morning which resulted in conviction, repentance, confession, thanksgiving, and supplication (petition for self; intercession for others). **Dr**. H. A. Ironside often said, "God has never promised to guide anyone into the truth, who neglects the Word of Truth. Therefore he who would pray in the Spirit must walk in the truth, for the Spirit and Word agree. The Word is Truth!"

It has been said that we should never pray without reading the Bible, and we should never read the Bible without praying. Surely we must learn to make the Bible our Prayer Book as we plead the promises for troubled nation.

A prayer guide for a nation

In the Word of God, two chapters in **Daniel** deal with prayer, **chapters nine and ten**. In **chapter 10**, we learn basic information about spiritual warfare. Key points are as follows: (1) Daniel prayed; (2) God sent the answer immediately; (3) the answer, however, was hindered for twentyone days; (4) by the prince of Persia. Satan is not omniscient, omnipresent, but he is organized. The battle is fought in the heavenlies. Over every geographical area, a mighty prince of Satan (not flesh and blood) is assigned. The places mentioned in this chapter are Persia and Greece both have mighty princes assigned. You will never win the war if you do not know where the battle is fought. The battle is fought in the place of prayer (Ephesians 6:18). It is in that

place that Satan is defeated and flees, along with his mighty princes. In **chapter nine**, we learn how to pray for a nation. Daniel confessed specific sins saying "we" have sinned, not "they." He names sins. His emphasis is on God's mercy. In our intercession for our nation, our church, our denomination (if such is applicable), may we say with the prophet Daniel: "O, Lord, to us belongeth confusion of face, to our kings, to our princes, and to our fathers, because we have sinned against Thee. To the Lord our God belong mercies and forgiveness, though they have rebelled against Him; neither have we obeyed the voice of the Lord our God, to walk in His laws, which He set before us by His servants, the prophets. ... Oh my God, incline Thine ear, and hear; open Thine eyes, and behold our desolations, and the city which is called by Thy name: for we do not present our supplications before Thee for our righteousness, but for Thy great mercies. O Lord, hear; O Lord, forgive: O Lord, hearken and do; defer not, for Thine sake, O my God; for Thy city and Thy people are called by Thy name" (Daniel 9:8-10, **18-19**).

Rubbled Remnants

In his book Glimpses of a Sacred Land, Carl F. H. Henry gives this clear warning for the United States: "Everywhere one travels in the Near East today he can find the rubbled remnants of great empires of the past. One by one they have fallen, either to extinction or second-rate powers.

"In some of these lands, the wonder of their past can be recovered only from the dust heaps disclosed by the archaeologist's shovel. The whole course of history pays its testimony to the nature and activity of God. He sends disobedient nations down to their doom."

To guard against our thinking that the United States might be invincible, Dr. Henry also said, "Let us guard against considering any nation, however great, as the prudential hinge of history." Of all nations, the Bible says, "Behold, the nations are as a drop in a bucket, and are counted as the small dust on the balance on the scales" (Isaiah 40:15).

Impending Danger

In **Business Week**, The Warner & Swasey Company of Cleveland, Ohio, issued from their executive offices this timely message of warning:

"Have you ever faced the possibility that your country could cease to exist? Nations richer and more powerful in their day than we are in this have been sabotaged, defeated, and enslaved.

"Babylon was the largest and richest nation of its time, but its lust for luxury made it an easy mark for the Medes and Persians who overran its land and enslaved people between them.

"Rome was a great military power; but when free bread and circuses became more important to the people than hard work and patriotism, Rome was invaded and looted by the tougher vandals.

"The Incas were the most civilized, richest people in the Americas; but ruthless, better-armed invaders destroyed them as a nation and looted everything they owned and had spent generations in creating.

"In every case it was the selfindulgent weakness of the victim which made the victory of the invader easy.

"How wise is a nation which gives away so much of its substance abroad and at home that it can no longer afford to keep its own strength and protection? How intelligent is a nation more careful to protect a criminal than the victim? How weak is a nation that allows bureaucracy and a socialist philosophy to run riot and squander billions?

"Undoubtedly there were Babylonians, Romans, Incas who warned against over-indulgence and weakness, who warned that each citizen is responsible for his nation, and that his responsibility cannot be shrugged off onto officials. But to those who warned of impending trouble, there was then as now the smug sneer, "It can't happen here! But it did!"

AFRICA, ASIA, AUSTRALIA, EUROPE, NORTH AMERICA, SOUTH AMERICA

Do you have the world on your heart yet? Our readers already know that the JGHM logo has three basic elements to guide our ministry. There is the world in the background, a cross, and a man kneeling in prayer. Everything that we have done the past thirty-two years has been to mobilize believers to pray. In a recent introduction, a pastor stated that JGHM has "traveled to all the continents." Frankly, I had not thought in those terms "all the continents." He almost got it right. We have been to six of the seven continents. Thanks to the **Doorkeepers**, we have touched lives in Africa, Asia, Australia, Europe, North America, and South America.

The first prayer seminars began in 1980 in conjunction with my work as president at Northeastern Bible College, Essex Fells, New Jersey. During that time, my vision for the world enlarged remarkably. My interest in prayer and the Word expanded exponentially.

The Lausanne Committee for World Evangelization and the Korean Evangelical Fellowship cosponsored the International Prayer Assembly for World Evangelization

in Seoul, South Korea, June 5-11, 1984. It was the first international gathering focusing on prayer for spiritual awakening and fulfillment of the Great Commission. It issued a "Call to Prayer" for all believers to become prayer warriors for spiritual awakening and world evangelization. Although I did not attend, a close friend, Glen Shepard, did attend and kept me apprised. He was a key leader in writing the "Call to Prayer." JGHM immediately became a participant in this movement. We placed the world on our hearts!

At that time, the prayer seminar ministry was only in the United States. That changed in 1985 when an invitation came from the late Dr. B. A. Prabhakar to "come to India and teach us how to pray." Sam Simpson





(pastor Bronx & Wake Eden Baptist churches in New York City), Sue and I were off to India November 13-December 2, 1985. Although we traveled to other parts of India conducting prayer seminars (New Delhi, Lucknow, Jaipur, Agra), the focus was Hydrabad-Secunderabad, twin cities in Andra Pradash State. Sam preached at the PEACE WITH GOD CAMPAIGN and I taught prayer seminars.

Fifty-eight nations and six continent later, we continue mobilizing prayer warriors touching the continents! Thank you, Doorkeepers, for making the prayer seminar ministry possible. To God be the glory. Great things He has done.

If I could hear Jesus praying for me in the next room, I would not fear a million enemies. Yet distance makes no difference. He is praying for me.
