Perspectives

"Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people" (Proverbs 14:34). "The wicked shall be turned into hell, and all the nations that forget God" (Psalm 9:17).

"And that, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep: for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed. The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light" (Romans 13:11-12). "Therefore, He says, Awake, you who sleep, Arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light. See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is" (Ephesians 5:14-17).

Almost daily, examples in the media remind Christians that a spiritual war is being waged in the United States. Externally, we have enemies that are working openingly to destroy our free way of life. Sadly, there are serious internal attacks on America precipitated internally by the judicial branch of our government, almost monthly. The face of America is changing at an accelerated rate. A RALLYING CALL: EVERYTHING BY PRAYER

BIBLICAL BACKGROUND

God speaks to His children out of His Word. Read and consider each reference that follows. When you understand the implications of the text for your life, check it off. This exercise will provide heart preparation to engage in spiritual warfare for the nation.

- □ 2 Chronicles 7:14
- □ 2 Chronicles 20:3-30
- □ 1 Timothy 2:1-4
- Joel 1 & 2
- □ Ezra 8:21-23
- Jonah 3:5-10

GET ON PRAYING GROUND

Begin with worship. Praise the Lord. It is good to sing praises to our God, for He is gracious and a song of praise is appropriate. You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power, for You created all things, and by Your will they exist, and were created" (Revelation 4:11).

✓ Praise God as the Lord of history who is working out His plan according to His perfect will.

√ Praise the Lord that He is the God of revival, who revives His people in answer to their prayers in His perfect timing.

Heart searching. "Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me and know my thoughts; and see if there are any wicked ways in me, and lead me in the way everlasting" (Psalm 139:23-24). Do not try to search your own heart. Just pray honestly and expect God to search you and convict you as needed.

✓ Pray for yourself seeking a right attitude toward God, others, and our nation.

Confession. As you think about your life in the light of God's way, you may already know something you need to confess or may discern that the Holy Spirit has brought conviction regarding specific sins or failures to confront. Some common items to confess might be as follows:

- Let us confess that we tend to be self-reliant and fail to trust God totally;
- ✓ Let us confess that our commitment to follow God's way and to do His work is often half-hearted;
- ✓ Let us confess indifference and failure to pray regularly for our national and local government.

Accept His forgiveness. Confession brings forgiveness and cleansing (1 John 1:9) but we must be willing to receive the forgiveness. Take a moment to reflect on His forgiveness, thank Him, and receive this wonderful gift. You are now on praying ground.

Thanksgiving. Thank God for the privilege to worship Him freely in our country today following the dictates of our own hearts and consciences.

BEGIN INTERCESSION

<u>Pray for His children,</u> "called by His name".

- 1. That Christians may become sensitive to sin and freely confess and forsake all unrighteousness (Proverbs 28:13);
- 2. That God's children may repent and return to loving God with all their hearts (Matthew 22:37-38, Revelation 2:1-7):
- 3. That Christians may humble themselves and forsake the spirit of pride (2 Chronicles 7:14; I Peter 5:5-8);
- 4. That the spirit of prayer and humble repentance might be poured out upon all Christians;
- 5. That a mighty spiritual awakening will sweep through the entire Christian community regardless of denominational affiliation;
- That Christians may be cleansed and live in holiness:
- 7. That His church will repent and be restored to wholly following the

Lord in renewed love and devotion to Him, to fellow believers, to our neighbors, and to all people;

8. That the revived church may renew its efforts to fulfill the Great Commission with fresh vigor.

Pray for Christian families.

- 1. That they will realize afresh the power of God's grace for reconciliation, as needed, resulting in harmonious living producing a sense of security and love to maximize growth and development;
- That entire families may learn to find agreement with Christ in patient, united prayer (Matthew 18:15-20);
- 3. That Christian parents may learn to pray like Noah, whose intercession saved his entire family from perishing with a godless society in the flood.

Pray for our nation.

- 1. Pray that Christians will be inspired by the Holy Spirit to join in prayer for our nation on a daily basis;
- 2. Admit to God that we need His mercy and divine intervention on our behalf as a nation;
- 3. Ask God to restore righteousness and wisdom to those who govern (2 Samuel 23:3-4, Proverbs 29:2, and Daniel 2:20-22:
- 4. Pray for the President, Vice-President, members of the Supreme Court, U. S. Senators, your Congressman, state senators, state representatives that they may come to know God and perform their duties with honor to ensure we have good government that can be blessed by God;
- 5. Pray that the influence of Christian political leaders will be felt in a positive and strong fashion;

- 6. Pray for the families of the Christian political leaders who are under attack with very direct pressure to compromise their biblically based convictions and standards:
- 7. Pray for the salvation of government leaders;
- 8. Pray that the Bible study and prayer groups in our national and state capitols will continue to be a light and an inspiration to those who participate and that their co-workers will be blessed by the overflow coming from the groups.

Pray for your local church

1. Ask God to reveal what part your church is to take in the working out of His divine purpose for our nation;
2. Pray for your pastor and the leadership that they may provide needed guidance to the congregation;
3. Pray that the members of your congregation will be knitted together in love and become a mighty force to stand for righteousness in the nation starting locally.

ACTIONS TO TAKE

Offer yourself to God for any part He way assign to you in His plan to restore the United States to the moral ground set forth in the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution in the light of Proverbs 29:18; Matthew 6:10.

Contact your governmental leaders and your local media. Write personal letters to the president, members of Congress, members of the state legislature. Tell them that you are praying for them. Let them know your specific concerns.

Remember the following points as you compose your message:

- Use words that are gracious and Christlike;
- State specifically what you are concerned about. (Pastor Jack Barrett suggested to say plainly: "This really breaks my heart. I'm afraid of the consequences for my family & my nation,")
- State what you want done about it;
- Explain why you want something done now and how it affects you and your family in an immediate way.
- Keep the message as concise and brief as possible, preferably on one page.

THE CHRONICLES COMMISSION

Several years ago, Doorkeeper Suzy Kauffmann (Mrs. Howard), suggested that it is time for Christians who know the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) to commit themselves first to a Chronicles Commission (2 Chronicles 7:14). I agreed wholeheartedly and determined to include this paradigm in the prayer seminars.

Until the requisites of this text are met, we are unlikely to fulfill the Great Commission. She asked, "Do you think we, as Christians, are commissioned by God to obey the passage if we want our land healed?" Yes, I do think that and see the value to calling each Doorkeeper to accept the Chronicles Commission. It is high time to awake and to act! The most potent tool that God has given us to push against the spiritual darkness is prayer. Now is the time. If not you, who? If not now, when? If not here? Where? America, you're too young to die!

<u>Bill Bright</u>, one of the greatest evangelists of all time, said to <u>Armin Gesswein</u> "Don't be surprised if you hear one day that I have given myself to a ministry of intercession."

I Must Tell Jesus

One hymn that often comes to my mind was written by Elisha A. Hoffman in 1893. It is entitled "I Must Tell Jesus." Often I sit down at the piano in our living room or stand at the keyboard in the ministry office, turn in a hymn book to this hymn, and play/sing these wonderful words. These words and melody never grows old.

A minister's son, Hoffman attended Union Seminary in New Berlin, Pennsylvania, and was ordained in 1868. Afterward, he worked with the Evangelical Association's publishing arm in Cleveland, Ohio, for eleven years. He pastored churches in Ohio. in Michigan, and in Illinois. In his lifetime, he wrote over 2,000 Gospel songs including these that I have used in my own ministry for many years: (1) Are You Washed in the Blood? (2) Down at the Cross (3) Is Thy Heart Right with God? (4) Is Your All on the Altar? (5) Leaning on the Everlasting Arms, (6) No Other Friend Like Jesus and (7) Sing of Jesus.

Background. In his own words, Hoffman gave the background for I Must Tell Jesus. "There was a woman to whom God had permitted many visitations of sorrow and affliction. Coming to her home one day, I found her much discouraged. She unburdened her heart, concluding,

'Brother Hoffman, what shall I do?' I quoted from the word, then added, 'You cannot do better than to take all of your sorrows to Jesus. You must tell Jesus.'

For a moment she seemed lost in meditation. Then her eyes lighted as she exclaimed, 'Yes, I must tell Jesus.' As I left her home I had a vision of that joy-illuminated face ... and I heard all along my pathway the echo, 'I must tell Jesus, I must tell Jesus."

Hoffman wrote these words and the music after reaching home. File this away because, sooner or later, you will face burdens and will need to tell Jesus.

I must tell Jesus all of my trials, I cannot bear these burdens alone; In my distress He kindly will help me, He ever loves and cares for is own.

Refrain:

I must tell Jesus! I must tell Jesus! I cannot bear my burdens alone;I must tell Jesus! I must tell Jesus! Jesus can help me, Jesus alone.

I must tell Jesus all of my troubles, He is a kind, compassionate friend; If I but ask Him, He will deliver,

Make of my troubles quickly an end

Make of my troubles quickly an end. **Refrain**

Tempted and tried, I need a great Savior, One Who can help my burdens to bear; I must tell Jesus, I must tell Jesus, He all my cares and sorrows will share. Refrain

<u>EVERYTHING BY PRAYER</u>

Jesus said, "Men ought always to pray and not faint" (Luke 18:1). He expects His children to order

their lives around prayer. Use three levels of intensity: "Ask ... Seek ... Knock" (Matthew 7:7).

The role of music

Music is an excellent way to plant spiritual principles into our minds that will guide our responses to life's circumstances. Anyone who takes time to reflect on the truths embedded in the great hymns of the faith written by Elisha A. Hoffman would become an advocate of returning them to our worship services today. One of the mistakes that churches are making is to move away from the hymns of the faith in favor of what is known as "contemporary Christian music" that often exalts man, not the Lord. Clearly, the Holy Spirit often anoints the words, the music, and the singing that helps us remember that God is our strength, our song, and our salvation (Psalm 118:14, Isaiah 12:2). Sing the hymns-all the stanzas.

As I prepared copy for the July 2018 Reflector, I reviewed an article written on Tuesday, November 15, 1960, from the Rosedale Baptist Reflector (the seventh year of the Reflector). The article was in the "PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS," a section where I shared personal thoughts with my congregation. I was twenty-five years old. Now, almost sixty years later I read with interest what was on my mind so long ago. Here is the article that I shared that day.

"If when climbing up life's ladder you can reach a hand below, just to help the other fellow up another rung, or so. It may be that in the future when you're growing weary, too, you'll be glad to find there's someone who will lend a hand to you. The real measure of our Christianity is our attitude toward those about us. We cannot be right with the Lord and wrong in our attitudes and relationships with our fellow men. We sometimes forget this basic truth!

Many feel as long as "Me and my wife, my son John, his wife—us four—no more" are OKAY, then why be concerned about anyone else? Oh! dear friend, let us not take this attitude but let us determine to BE a blessing. 'If I can help somebody, as I pass this way, then my living will not

be in vain!" This is truth that **never** grows old.

Another article I reviewed was from the PASTOR'S PARAGRAPHS in the Kerby Knob Baptist Reflector in October 1964 (the Reflector's eleventh year). when I had just turned twenty-nine. "Draw nigh to God, and He will draw nigh to you" is the promise of James 4:8. HE DRAWS NEAR.

God came near to Adam to clothe him (Genesis 3:21) that he might be forgiven of his sin. He drew nigh to Enoch to walk with him in sweet fellowship (Genesis 5:24). He came to Abraham to befriend him (Genesis 18:17) and to Jacob to bless him (Genesis 32:30). On the Island of Patmos, Christ drew near to Zacchaeus to save him (Luke 19:1-10). He drew near to the Emmaeus disciples to enlighten them (Luke 24:13ff).

Let us bow down that God might come nigh to us here in the Kerby Knob Baptist Church this weekend. How we need this CLOSER WALK with our Lord. He is willingARE WE?

MINISTRY UPDATE

Almost one year ago, we asked for <u>prayer that God would raise</u> up a godly man to take the reins of the prayer seminar ministry in His timing. The Five-Year Plan adopted by the Board of Directors (October 1, 2015--September 30, 2020) has been modified. Adam Nathanson. long-time associate of Dr. Henry and a missionary to Venezuela, has been named Vice President/Senior Teacher for JGHM. He will continue his work as a "missionary," but will couple that work with teaching prayer seminars both in the United States and other nations. In addition, he will train others to teach the seminars. This approach will approximate what we have done in Nigeria, South Africa, Kenya, and other nations.

Dr. Henry will continue to provide

oversight and direction for the ministry under the new paradigm being followed, namely, establishing Ropeholder Doorkeepers for those who are teaching seminars in other nations. He is likely to maintain this senior role until September 30, 2020, when he reaches his 85th birthday.

Adam is developing a cadre of colleagues who will assist him in scheduling and providing prayer seminars in the United States. He is planning prayer seminars for **Chile** and **Cuba** later this year.

Martin Shikuku will lead a series of prayer seminars in Tanzania and Kenya this summer. Digmar Garcia continues to expand into other provinces in Cuba. Pakistan 2018 is underway with prayer seminars planned for four major cities.
