Bertha Smith A woman of faith

In God's goodness and providence, I had the privilege of coordinating a speaking engagement for Miss Bertha whose ministry I had learned to appreciate in various venues over the years and through her books and tapes. When she learned about the prayer seminar ministry, she became an encourager. She gave me some tips about arrangements for my own speaking engagements. She encouraged me to request a motel room as my accommodation to ensure privacy for my own spiritual preparation before teaching. While I modified her advice, I soon learned to specify a private home minus any elaborate entertaining.

In her biography Go Home and Tell she shared how she handled a mandatory retirement age at seventy set by the International Mission Board (SBC). She came home and became a friend and teacher for pastors who, themselves, needed a spiritual awakening to become effective leaders. Pastors, evangelists, missionaries and other leaders by the thousands were touched who in turn touched thousands upon thousands of their own people. Some of the leading men whom God used to influence my life and ministry--Jack Taylor, Ron Dunn, Stephen Olford, Peter Lord (to name a few) were first influenced by Miss Bertha.

In her biography, Miss Bertha tells of traveling by rickshaw to a primitive village in China to devote several days to evangelistic work. Her living conditions were squalid; she shared a stall with an ox, with lice, and with a swarm of flies.

When she retired the first night, Miss Bertha wrote, "I soon found more living creatures than just the ox in that room. What my fellow missionary Dr. Jeannette Beall calls 'China's millions,' were crawling from the bed below, all over me, biting as

Keep on course

For forty-eight years, Miss Bertha Smith (1888-1988) served as a missionary in China and Formosa (now Tawain). Communism forced her to leave China in 1948 and she relocated in Formosa. She was forced to retire from her appointment in 1959. Until her death in 1988, she ministered in the United States, especially to pastors. Her influence in calling pastors to a deeper spiritual life was profound.

As a young pastor, Dr. Jim Britt sought Miss Bertha's counsel on how to build a church. Her response was simply, "Tend to the prayer God will tend to the rest." Why is it that so many pastors and church leaders have forgotten this fact? Could it be that Satan, our archenemy, knows the power of prayer and makes it a goal to keep us from praying? Isn't it time that we reverse this neglect? Through the prayer seminars, many individuals have come to an understanding of the purpose and power of prayer.

they crawled. What could I do about that number one enemy of China's poor? For a moment I was tempted to be upset; then I prayed, 'Lord, I am not here on a pleasure trip; I am here to tell these people about You. I cannot see them tomorrow unless I rest. Down in Egypt, You sent the very small animals scampering at Your rebuke. Now just turn the heads of these lice in another direction and let me sleep.' In a moment I was fast sleep and never saw another one in my bedding."

Later, as far as the flies, she prayed, "Lord, I am one of Your spoiled children. All my life I have been accustomed to screened houses and clean food. Now, I just can't eat with those flies all over my food. Down in Egypt You had flies come and go at Your word. You are the same today. ... Now please do one of two things for me: either take the flies away, or enable me just to go ahead and eat and not mind them. You then take care of any disease germs which they may put into my body. ... Whichever You wish to do will be good enough for me!"

Which do you think God did?

"Not a fly flew into that ox stall the remaining five days that I was there witnessing and teaching!" wrote Miss Bertha. "You will agree that was a miracle." That was a "nofly zone" in the truest sense of the phrase.

We could well learn lessons from Miss Bertha. Nearly 100 years old, she was prepared to leave her home in Cowpens, South Carolina, to speak at the Annual Meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention. But God had a different venue for the person Stephen Olford called, "the woman of revival" and that was to bring her home to Heaven where she now resides.

Many of the truths that I emphasize in a prayer seminar are from Miss Bertha's teaching. From the days of the Shantung Revival in China, her commitment to a life of prayer was deep and enduring, She would exclaim, "Have you made your sin list yet? Until you deal with your sins, you cannot claim God's promises." Then, "No prayer, no revival!" That is why she established her prayer center in Cowpens. To pray with Miss Bertha was to touch the hem of God. Her favorite text on revival was 2 Chronicles 7:14 "If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land."

George Taff, Sr. was born in Hampshire County, Virginia, December 19, 1762. Sarah Wiley was born in 1765. They were married in 1787. They were my great-greatgreat grandparents. He fought in the Revolutionary War Peter Taff, his father and my great-great-greatgreat grandfather, was born in 1720 and died in 1792. George and Sarah migrated to Jefferson County. President Abraham Lincoln understood the legacy that was won and passed on during the War for Independence. He wrote the words in his own handwriting and delivered them in his Gettysburg Address (November 19, 1863. "Four score and seven years ago. " My greatgrandfather, Harvey Covington (1833-11/20/1896) was a Tennessean who fought in the War between the States for the Union (as did many other young men from East Tennessee, a section of the state that did not secede).

My brothers, son, and nephew were veterans (army, navy, air force, marines). "Boots" (12/14/25-5/6/61) World War II; Lee 3/11/31-1/12/95) Korean Conflict: Al (4/20/32-1/30/88) and Doug (1/4/45-9/19/2012). Vietnam Conflict. Our son Mark (10-2-59), a graduate of Hargrave Military Academy (VA), served in the U. S. Marines for four years. My nephew, Lyle Jones (2/30/33-1/13/96) was retired from

Seven frames of mind

Dr. A. T. Pierson points out that there are seven distinct frames of mind in 1 Thessalonians 5:15-22). Check yourself as a Christian and determine where you are in regard to each frame of mind. One of the most important attitudes toward the Word of God is allowing it to serve as a mirror held up by the Holy Spirit to let you see yourself as God sees you. This should be done every time you read or hear the Word of God.

- 1. The praiseful frame (v 16). Finding all God's dealings to be infinitely grand;
- 2. The prayerful frame (v 17). Prayer should never be unsuitable or unseemly.
- 3. The thankful frame (v 18). Even in circumstances not pleasant to the flesh.
- 4. The spiritual frame (v 19). He should have full victory in and through us.
- 5. The teachable frame (v 20). Any channel which God chooses to use.
- 6. The judicial frame (v 21). Test all by the Word of God. (Compare 1 John 4:1).
- The hallowed frame (v 22). If evil takes shape in your mind, avoid that evil.

The modern-day tragedy

A carnal Christian is a Christian where self is in control, not the Holy Spirit. Some have surmised that as many as 95 out of every 100 Christians are carnal. We can only imagine how pleased our enemy, Satan, is when this is the case.

The author of **Proverbs 24:30-34** passed by a sluggard's vineyard and saw that it was overgrown with thorns. Plants with stinging hairs or nettles were everywhere to be seen. The stone wall was in ruins. There is an object lesson in this scene. When a person is too lazy to care for his vineyard, he will not do well. Is there a message to carnal Christians? I think there is.

When we succumb to laziness in spiritual matters, our lives (vineyard) become infested with the works of the flesh (thistles and nettles). There is no fruit for God. Our spiritual defenses (the wall) are down, and the devil gains the desired foothold. The result of our coldness and backsliding is poverty of soul. The tragedy is in place!

Four generations

"I will give them singleness of heart and action ... for their own good and the good of their children after them" (Jeremiah 32:39).

Each morning when Sue and I gather around our dining room table for our "family altar," we intercede for four generations living in Virginia, Tennessee, Mississippi and Oklahoma.

PETITION PRAYING: We each pray for ourselves, as did Jabez (2 Chronicles 4:9-10). INTERCESSORY PRAYING: We pray for each other. Then following the Biblical pattern mandated by the Lord Jesus Christ Himself, we pray in agreement (Matthew 18:19) for the next three generations that make up our nuclear family: our three children whom we affectionately call our "3 Ms" (Mona, Mark, and Melody), our six grandchildren (Beau, Jeanne, Emilee, Kimberlee, Wendy, and Jamey), our five great-grandchildren (Caleb, Maggie, Willow, Lillian, and Stone). We thank God for giving us a family. We ask for God's amazing grace, mercy, and watch-care for each by name. We ask that He will give each of them a heart for Him.

Intercession is standing between God and others as did Abraham long ago. Intercession is focusing the power of God on a person or a situation. Often during a day, the Holy Spirit stirs our minds to send out an arrow prayer for one of our family members. Since we live in a community that is conducive to walking, there are sometimes representative of our four generations walking together. God is good.

I have made it a point to encourage the participants in a prayer seminar to pray diligently and fervently for their own family members (including their salvation and service), I often say, "If you are not praying for your children, grandchildren, greatgrandchildren, brothers, sisters, nieces, nephews, no one else is."

Just as you need the prayers of those you love, those you love need your prayers. I have on my typing table a DVD, the story of Doorkeepers Wilbert & Almaretta Hupp (Milton, Pennsylvania) celebrating their 60th Wedding Anniversary, entitled "Loving God, Loving Each Other." That is what I am saying for your family members love God and love each other. If you visit our home at 1127 Lakeview Drive, Lynchburg, Virginia, you will find many photos including a hallway with one wall covered with family photos. Don't forget to pray for your family! In times like these, we need an anchor the Lord Jesus Christ is the only sure anchor.

Lord, Speak to Me

Lord, speak to me, that I may speak In living echoes of Thy tone; As Thou hast sought, so led me seek Thy erring children lost and lone.

O lead me Lord, that I may lead The wandering and the wavering feet;

O feed me, Lord, that I may feed The hungering ones with manna sweet.

O teach me Lord, that I may teach The precious things Thou dost impart;

The hidden depths of many a heart.

O fill me with Thy fullness, Lord, Until my very heart o'erflow In kindling thought and glowing word, Thy love to tell, Thy praise to show.

Until Thy blessed face I see, Thy rest, Thy joy, Thy glory share.

If we are not thoughtful, we could easily miss the deep meaning of the first two lines of the hymn written by Frances Ridley Havergal: "Lord speak to me, that I may speak in living echoes of Thy tone." That is far more than a prayer that we may be able to deliver the Lord's message. It is rather that we may do so in His tone, with His temper. This is Meribah, where Moses failed when he spoke "rashly [unadvisedly] with his lips" (Psalm 106:33). This refers to the day when Moses sinned against God by not following His command "to speak" to the rock (Numbers 20:1-13). Moses had not modeled proper obedience and respect for God's command. For this failure, he was excluded from entering the Promised Land.
