



# Prayer support needed

God has been faithful to the prayer seminar ministry since its inception. Year by year, we have reported accomplishments that only could be explained by His doings. Your prayers have contributed to the blessings He has bestowed. Doors have been opened because you prayed. Prayer opens closed doors. Paul knew this and asked the Colossians to "continue earnestly in prayer, being vigilant in it with thanksgiving; meanwhile praying also for us, that God would open to us a door for the Word, to speak the mystery of God" (Colossians 4:2-3).

We have on file hundreds of testimonies as to the helpfulness of the prayer seminars. Many are from individuals. Others are from pastors and other leaders. Many churches have experienced renewal and revival. An example is Joe A. Williams, pastor, First Baptist Church, Vernon, Alabama. After an all-day Sunday seminar (SIX HOURS OF TEACHING = A DAY IN GOD'S COURTS), he wrote: "I am unable to find the words to express the joy and deep appreciation for the prayer seminar you conducted in our church Sunday, November 30. I do not believe I have attended any seminar, or training conference of any type, that was more helpful to me than your prayer seminar. I am confident I speak for our members as well." He later became pastor of the Middle River Baptist Church in Baltimore, Maryland, where he hosted two prayer seminars. Then he became director of the Baptist Association in Ocala, Florida consistently promoting the prayer seminars. When he moved to the pastorate of Wyomina Baptist Church in Ocala, he scheduled a prayer seminar.

The prayers for open doors availed much (James 5:16b) as is attested by a twenty-six-year Summary Report (1984-2011) that was prepared for the JGHM Board of Directors in early 2012:

For twenty-six years, the yearly averages were as follows:

# Seminars 52
States 16
Nations 4
Miles 74,398
Days on road 125

In addition to these statistics, thousands upon thousands came to Christ for salvation. Although compiling the "other ministry" for each year is a project that is yet to be finished, during 2011, I preached nine sermons, led four devotionals, two evangelism clinics, three leaders' conferences, and preached two funerals. My plans are to update the Summary Report adding 2012-2017.

Very frankly, sitting in a pew or a chair, is the most difficult task I have had in ministry. Changing the paradigm from going to holding the ropes for others to go is not easy for me. WE REQUESTED THE PRAYERS OF OUR DOORKEEPERS IN THE EARLY YEARS OF OUR MINISTRY FOR SPECIFIC ITEMS. Now pray for our teachers in other nations and for God to raise up a Godly man to lead the ministry by September 30,2020.

### Reaffirmation Fifteen Years Later

In April 2002, the Henrys relocated to Lynchburg, Virginia from their home in Murfreesboro, Tennessee (after nineteen years) in order to be near their two daughters and their families. The following statement from Dr. Henry appeared on the cover of the January 2003 edition of the monthly publication, The Doorkeeper Report:

# Submission to God afresh and anew

As the leader of the prayer seminar ministry, I hereby acknowledge complete dependence upon God and submit the ministry to Him afresh and anew. What a joy it is to be entrusted with the task of calling God's people to Biblical praying and to have **Doorkeeper** partners who make it possible, through their prayers and gifts, to touch lives around the world. My prayer is that 2003 will be the best year ever in seeing believers become prayer warriors. Without God's hand on the work we are doing, it is nothing.

Fifteen years and two months later, the time has arrived for REAFFIRMATION. When the Lord called me to provide prayer seminars wherever and whenever He opened doors, Sue and I discussed the implications for the lifestyle adjustments that would be necessary due to the travel demands. For example, it was necessary to learn how to schedule travel, pack boxes,

leave home, sleep in strange beds, eat a variety of food, and myriad other tasks. The itinerant ministry, which began in 1980 during my tenure as president of Northeastern Bible College (NJ), was demanding. By making the prayer seminar ministry a priority would compound those demands.

The response down through the years has been amazing. God renewed strength for every journey. The Doorkeepers provided the prayer and financial support. The unction of the Holy Spirit has rested upon each of the 1,730 sixhour prayer seminars. As I have reconsidered the 2003 affirmation in the light of the limitations imposed by aging bringing both Sue and me to the octogenarian years, both of us continue committed to the prayer seminar ministry. Paul asked that the believers in Thessalonica pray for him that the Gospel would have free course. This is our prayer request. A specific request has been submitted to the Doorkeepers and other friends: pray for a new leader.

# Keys to Revival:Surrender E. Stanley Jones

If I had one gift, and only one gift, to make to the Christian Church, I would offer the gift of prayer. For everything follows from prayer. Prayer tones up the total life. I find by actual experience I am better or worse as I pray more or less. There is no graduation into adequate human living without prayer.

Prayer is not only the refuge of the weak; it is the reinforcement of the strong. The idea that only weak people pray is false. The strongest Person that ever walked our planet prayed. His first public act was to stand on Jordan's banks, "and as He prayed the heavens were opened." His last public act was a prayer: "Father into Thy hands I commend My spirit." Between that first and that last act His whole life was saturated with prayer.

Prayer is not bending God to my will, but it is bringing my will into conformity with God's will, so that His will may work in and through me. Prayer is not trying to make God a cosmic bellhop for your purposes, but prayer is cooperating with the purposes of God to do things you never dreamed you could do. The highest form of prayer is that of Jesus in Gethsemane: "Nevertheless, not my will but Thy will be done." Prayer, then is primarily and fundamentally surrender. It is a surrender of your purposes, your plans, and your will into the hands of God to work them out with Him. But surrender does not mean weak negativism.

Prayer is the surrender of the wire to the battery; of the flower to the sun. The Gulf Stream will flow through a straw provided the straw is aligned to the Gulf Stream, and not at cross purposes with it.

You, as an individual, surrender to God and then shall I say it? God surrenders to you His power is at your disposal. You are working with an almighty purpose and an almighty purpose is working with you. Prayer is just that cooperation with God.

#### A MOVING LIFE LESSON

I am the beneficiary of an education at White Pine School (Tennessee). For twelve years (1941-1953), the school on the hill was a major force in my life. I could hardly wait to get to school. Teachers, classmates and EVENTS molded my life. I could "write a book" on many single incidents from those years. At the school, I was "James" Henry, although to my Mom and Dad and family members, I was "Jim" and to many others I was "Jimmy." "Gordon" did not enter the picture until I was advised by one of the members of the Board of Governors of Northeastern Bible College, who held a doctorate from Columbia University, that it was not proper for a college president in the New York City area to be known by his initials "J.G." as was common in the South. So it was that I became, under her encouragement, "Dr. J. Gordon Henry." That was in 1980.

Actually, I have one document from those days at WPS that I cherish, the first yearbook (commonly called the "annual") in the history of the school. It is aptly named the "Pine Cone." I was the editor. I suppose anyone wanting to know about these days in my life could uncover ample evidence and learn a lot especially from the fifty-eight personal notes..

Over the years, I have spoken of the two "master" teachers at White Pine, Dorothy Spickard Biddle and Deane Bell Harrison. Both were precious friends, as well as outstanding teachers. Mrs. Harrison guided us through meaningful literary experiences. We were to learn to express ourselves orally as

well as in writing. Having "won" the freshman oratory competition at the University of Tennessee in my freshman year and participating the next three years on the White Pine Debate Team that won its share of first place awards at that annual UT event, I learned communication skills that have served me well. Mrs. Harrison believed we should memorize poems, Bible passages, and essays to deliver before the class. Deep in my memory is etched Edna St. Vincent Millay's poem, introduced by Mrs. Harrison.

Recently I shared this poem with the family of Robert Dodd whose sudden death has deeply shaken the Beulah Baptist Church family. I want to provide a written copy. Many of you might want to clip this for your Scrap Book. If you haven't needed this life lesson yet, you will one day be glad you learned it.

Listen, children: Your father is dead. From his old coats I'll make you little jackets; I'll make you little trousers From his old pants. There'll be in his pockets Things he used to put there, Keys and pennies Covered with tobacco: Dan shall have the pennies To save in his bank: Anne shall have the keys To make a pretty noise with. Life must go on, Though good men die; Anne, eat your breakfast; Dan, take your medicine; Life must go on; I forget just why.
