Spiritual decisions in Venezuela

April 3-25, 2011

"Preaching the kingdom of God and teaching the things which concern the Lord Jesus Christ" Acts 28:31

Once again, **Adam Nathanson** (missionary to Venezuela and pastor Grace Community Church, Caracas) and I teamed up to teach and preach the things that pertain to the Lord Jesus Christ and His Kingdom in **Venezuela**. There were thirteen prayer seminars, two sermons, and one leadership session.

The seminars were in three areas: four in Caracas (capital city with five million people), two in western Venezuela (San Felipe and Tumero), six in eastern Venezuela (Boca de Urichae, Clarines, Cumana, Caripe, Anaco, and Barcelona). Each seminar was open to pastors in the respective areas and a large number participated. The people came--eager to learn, willing to be taught.

All 2,000 Spanish prayer seminar workbooks were used and we needed more. In each session, interest was intense and the response was strong. At least two hundred fifty trusted Christ as personal Savior following a thorough presentation of the plan of salvation. When the seed of the Word of God is sown, the result is spiritual children. Also, hundreds indicated that they had made decisions about their spiritual lives. Miles traveled totaled 7,113 (Air international and domestic 5,388, Ground 1,725) and twenty-three days on the road.

All in all, the unction of the Holy Spirit rested upon each seminar, each teaching opportunity, and each message delivered. There is an invitation to return in 2012 to conduct prayer seminars in February in the area where we were in 1992 (where new churches are mushrooming with many converts) and in April-May at the retreat center in **Caripe**.

On behalf of each person touched, we express thanks to the **Doorkeepers** who provided funds for this work. Eighty-seven contributed significantly over-subscribing the budget. "The Lord repay your work, and a full reward be given you by the Lord God of Israel, under whose wings you have come for refuge" (**Ruth 2:12**).



Perspectives

The theme of the prayer seminar ministry has always been "A Day in God's Courts" (**Psalm 84:10**). In contemporary America, few Christians can say that they have spent a day in God's courts at any time. Neither can they say that anyone has ever asked them to do so. The world is too much with us to take time to be holy. That is our problem.

You remember the story. After celebrating the Passover with His disciples in the Upper Room in Jerusalem, Jesus instituted the Memorial Supper (the bread and the cup) to be observed by His followers until His return from Heaven. The bread and wine of the Passover commemorated deliverance from Egypt. Jesus' body (Matthew 26:26) and blood (v 28) are now identified as the true Passover sacrifice of the new covenant (v 28) that brings deliverance from sins.

In His Upper Room Discourse (John 13-16), Jesus then gave His final instructions before He went to the cross. He taught them about the Holy Spirit and He taught them about prayer. Then He led them across the Kidron Valley to the Garden of Gethsemane on the side of the Mount of Olives. As He entered into the garden, He asked His disciples to "Sit here while I go and pray over there" (Matthew 26:36). He took Peter, James, and John with Him. Three prayers are recorded. After the first prayer, He returned to His disciples and found them sleeping. Addressing His remarks to Peter, He said, "What? Could you not watch with Me one hour?" (v 40).

One hour! How can we come to the point that we can watch with Jesus in prayer one hour? That is the question. Joshua understood when he said to the children of Israel, "Choose you this day whom you will serve ... '(Joshua 24:15). The prophet Joel talked about "multitudes, multitudes in the valley of decision! For the day of the Lord is near in the valley of decision" (Joel 3:14). We must realize that there is a Valley of Decision for

us, not only as we consider salvation, but as we consider following Jesus. Decisions determine destiny. **The beginning point of spending an hour in prayer is deciding to do so**. This is a decision that no other person can make for us.

When I was president of Northeastern Bible College, a student approached me in a hallway. His countenance was such that it was easy to see that he was full of joy. He shared that for the first time in his Christian life, he had spent an hour in prayer. Could you not spend one hour in prayer?

During 1976, I felt dissonance in my spirit. It was a year of significant progress at Liberty Baptist College, Lynchburg, Virginia, where I was serving as Vice President for Academic Affairs. It was a year of unprecedented blessings at Pleasant View Baptist Church, where I was serving as pastor. The dissonance was the realization that, although I was in "full-time Christian service," actually working for the Lord seven days a week, I did not know God very well. In doing some serious introspection, I began to realize that I was only in the Bible to get a message to preach, not to know God. The Holy Spirit guided me to see that this was the root of my problem. Even my praying reflected a superficial understanding of the Word of God. Sadly, my praying was telling God what to do, when to do it, and how to do it. I did not understand that there are five elements of prayer — adoration, confession, thanksgiving, petition, and intercession.

One Sunday morning, our soloist, **Dick Elmer**, sang "Teach Me to Pray" and the message penetrated. I began to pray, "Dear Father, will you teach me to pray, to really pray?" Clearly, this became a moment of decision for me. Since that day, everything that I have been involved in has included the area of prayer. What He has done for me, He will do for anyone who will let Him. The way to begin is to make a decision to do so.

Once I began to understand the purpose and power of prayer, I bought every book

I could find on the subject and began to read them studiously. They contained many excellent ideas on prayer that I incorporated in my personal praying. But I went a step farther. As I read the Word diligently, I asked Him to teach me to pray the way He wanted me to pray. I began to be alert to any Bible example of prayer that I read about in the Bible. Soon I had a long list of references for prayer experiences recorded in the Bible. I discovered that there are 650 recorded prayers excluding the huge number in the psalms. 450 have recorded answers.

Now when I go back to some of the books, I find them even more helpful. One thing that I observed was that there are common principles running through the books, even though they are couched in difference expressions. I began to form my own expressions to incorporate into my teaching and preaching that I felt would communicate to the average Christian.

There came a point when I saw that I needed to make an effort to teach formally what I had learned. The culmination was a decision to prepare lessons as preparation for a twenty-four prayer chapel ministry. The basic concept was to mobilize 168 people, each willing to pray one hour a week in the chapel. Week by week, I wrote a lesson that I taught to our people on Sunday nights during the Church Training hour. This material was organized into a prayer seminar workbook in 1980 and is now available in many languages. Thousands upon thousands have had an opportunity to profit from what the Lord taught me over thirty years ago and what He continues to teach me. Although I have taught thousands, the Holy Spirit has called forth a number of teachers in many countries to teach this material Praise the Lord!

Praying for our nation

To Daniel, discovering the promises of God was not an alternative to praying. Rather finding God's promises from Jeremiah's writings motivated him to prayer. As Daniel considered the promise in Jeremiah concerning the duration of the captivity, he responded to God in prayer (Daniel 9:3-19). Why should Daniel pray when God had already promised?

Daniel recognized that the captivity period had not accomplished its purpose. The people had continued in sin and spiritual indifference. In the spirit of humility and worship, Daniel confessed sin. Though blameless himself, the prophet identified with the nation's sins. He acknowledged the consequences of their sin the dispersion and God's curse (vv 7-11). After reflecting on God's past deliverance and mercies (v 15), he then based his petition on God's own character (v 16).

Wherever I go in the United States, I find people expressing concern about our nation. Let's pray as Daniel prayed.

PLAIN TEACHING

The **world** says: A rich man's wealth is his security; the Word says: He who takes refuge in God has security (Isaiah 57:10). The world says: Be sure to get all that's coming to you; the **Word** says: Life doesn't consist in what you possess (Luke 12:15). The world says: I'll be satisfied when I have more; the Word says, He who loves money will not be satisfied with money (Ecclesiastes 5:10). The world says: Spend and accumulate goods; the **Word** says: Give and you will develop character (Philippians 4:17). The world says: You can have a richer life with credit cards; the Word says: You will have a richer life through great generosity (2 Corinthians 9:11). The world says: Lend to those who can repay you; the Word says, Open your hand wide, for God will bless you (Deuteronomy 15:8). The world says: You deserve the best; the Word says: The Lord of hosts deserves the best (Malachi 1).

Jesus said: "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break through and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break through and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" Matt 6:19-10. I call this PLAIN TEACHING!

The Sword of the Lord

Through Jesus alone

On September 25, 1982, I was driving from the Northeastern Bible College campus in Essex Fells, New Jersey, to speak at a missionary conference in Mahopac Falls, New York. While crossing over the Hudson River on the Tappen Zee Bridge, I observed a bumper sticker on an automobile that defines a major problem for many of us as we approach the Word of God.

The bumper sticker said: "THE BIBLE SAYS IT. I BELIEVE IT. THAT SETTLES IT!"

Had I had opportunity to speak personally with those in the car, I would have told them that the message on their sticker was wrong. To be correct, it should have read: "THE BIBLE SAYS IT. THAT SETTLES IT!"

How very humanistic we have become. Whether "I believe it!" or not has nothing to do with the truth of God's revealed Truth. It does not matter what you believe, I believe, or anyone else believes. God's Word related to prayer is that we are to pray in Jesus/name. Jesus Himself could not have been plainer when He declared" "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life; no man cometh to the Father, but by Me" (John 14:6).

There is only one access to God the Father. You cannot come into the presence of God apart from Christ Himself. A person comes into the presence of God only if and when he breathes the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. Thus, a basic and essential prerequisite for effective prayer is for our spirit to reflect that we are coming through Jesus Christ, the Son. Perhaps, we can say something like this: "Thank You for Jesus Christ and in Him, in His name, I approach You, Father." Access to the Father is through Jesus alone.

Check out these Scriptures: John 10:7, 10:9, 14:13-14, John 16:23-24-26; Romans 5:2; Ephesians 2:13, 3:12; Hebrews 7:9, 7:25; 10:19; 1 Peter 3:18.

THOUGHTS CONCERNING THE NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER Thursday, May 5, 2011

"The wicked shall be turned into hell, and all the nations that forget God" (**Psalm 9:17**). "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people" (**Proverbs 14:34**).

Occasionally, we get a glimpse behind the scenes in the Bible. For example, Satan appeared when the sons of God gathered (**Job 1**). One can only wonder what he and his cohorts have planned for America. Is there any doubt who is behind the attack on Christianity that continues to accelerate? The battle that rages is not between flesh and blood; rather, it is a spiritual battle.

"Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places."

Ephesians 6:11-12

"For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds, casting down imaginations and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ."

2 Corinthians 10:3-4

For sometime I have been aware of an unmet need in the lives of many believers understanding spiritual warfare. It is imperative for us to be keenly aware that we are in a war, not on a holiday excursion. We have an enemy whose primary effort is to

defeat the cause of the Lord Jesus Christ. He is Satan. From the very beginning, his target has been God's highest creation, man. The conflict was set in place when Satan rebelled against God. (Isaiah 14:12-14; Ezekiel 28:11-12).

The account of the fall of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden records his first major assault (Genesis 3). He has been unrelenting in his effort to devour those who become followers of Jesus (1 Peter **5:8**). To accomplish his goal, Satan actually has stratagems (*wiles*=battle plans) to defeat us (Ephesians 6:11). It is necessary for believers to know his approaches and not be ignorant of his devices (2 Corinthians 2:11) in order to be prepared. In addition, we need to understand the provisions God has made for us. Above all, we must develop a mind set that we are going to follow fully the directives laid out in the Word of God for our defense and our protection. We must will to do His will. To do less is to beckon failure.

An effort has been made to encourage believers living in the United States to focus on our own nation. Perhaps no better model can be found than Daniel 9. As Daniel read the writings of **Jeremiah**, the Holy Spirit moved him to think about his nation. Israel. You can pretty well follow his thought pattern. Why are we in bondage? Specific sins came to mind. "We did not listen to the prophets." We went our own way." As he identified with the sins (note "we" are sinning, not "they"), he confessed specifically. Then he prayed for God's mercy. We can do the same, not only on this National Day of Prayer, but often as the Holy Spirit uses the Scriptures we read to provoke us to pray for our nation.

Parents have often asked my advice regarding their young children who have indicated a desire for baptism. Let me make several suggestions. A few days ago, Maggie (our great-granddaughter who will soon be five) said to me, "Granddaddy, will you do me a favor? When I am a little older, will you baptize me? I love Jesus. I am sorry for my sins."

We believe in believer's baptism, that is, in the baptism of individuals who have trusted Christ as Savior after learning that God sent Him into the world to die on the cross to pay for our sins because He loves us so very much. It is not enough merely to "believe intellectually" that this is true, which is easy for children because of their tendency toward faith. A person must for himself trust (put faith in) Jesus by an act of the will.

Before you talk about baptism with your children, be as sure as you humanly can that they are truly saved. Sometimes baptism of children can give them a false sense of security (which Satan would like to happen).

In the local church where Sue and I are members, our pastor, **Tyler Scarlett**, handles this matter quite well. Before being baptized, a child ought to be able to give a clear statement of his faith in Christ, and should be able to explain the significance of the ordinance of baptism.

While we would never want to discourage

a child in his desire to obey the Lord, we do want to be sure for his sake that he has as thorough an understanding of these matters as he ought to have. Since children have different levels of comprehension, it is impossible to set an age that he must attain before being baptized. Whatever the age, we want this event will be the significant time that the Lord intends for it to be.

A key to a growing faith

George Mueller (1805-1898), founder of orphanages in England, was known as a man of prayer and faith. There were amazing answers to prayer during his long life. What made him such a man of faith?

During his lifetime, Mueller read through the Bible over 200 times. In more than half of the readings, he read while on his knees praying over God's Word as he studied.

That kind of commitment leads to knowledge and confidence in the will of God. "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God (**Romans 10:17**).
