### I FOUND THE ANSWER; I LEARNED TO PRAY!

In the very early days of what is now termed "the prayer seminar ministry", an invitation came from my very dear friend, Clint Brooks, to lead a revival in Yellow Branch Baptist Church, Rustburg, Virginia, March 21-24, 1982. A part of our time together was an area-wide prayer seminar on Saturday, March 23. The fellowship with Clint and his wife, Dorothy, was sweet, indeed.

I had driven down from Essex Fells, New Jersey, in the car provided for me by Northeastern Bible College, a Buick Century with a cassette player! Clint shared with me a number of his sermons on cassettes to listen to on the seven and one-half hour drive home.

God has given Clint the gift of preaching. His sermons are are often masterpieces, among the best I have ever heard and seldom longer than twenty-five minutes. Knowing that I like good gospel singing as well as good gospel preaching, he graciously prepared a cassette featuring hymns and spiritual songs. The song that became my favorite was one entitled "I found the answer, I learned to pray." I almost wore the tape out listening to this song over and over. For many years, I used the song frequently in the prayer seminars even including it in the **Prayer Seminar Workbook**.

Doorkeeper Josephine Fitzgerald's entitled her third book, written when she was 87, I Found the Answer, I Prayed. She felt that the phrase encapsulated her own Christian pilgrimage related to the place of the Word of God and Prayer. Without doubt, these are the two primary disciplines every Christian needs to to pursue--learning the value of the Word of God and a daily time listening to Him through His written Word. Once you do this, you will be in a position to benefit from a prayer life when you talk to God. Neither comes naturally.

#### **Perspective**

God has given us MEMORY that we can relive experiences. Memory is a great gift. Memories can be organized. Family: parents, siblings, spouse, children, grandchildren, and now, for us, great-grandchildren. Education: elementary, secondary, under-graduate, graduate, postgraduate. Profession: teacher, administrator. Church: member, pastor, para-church (prayer seminars, revivals, church growth seminars, evangelism clinics).

Although I have enjoyed each role that I have been called upon to play, none exceeds the blessings of the prayer seminars. Diverse ethnic groups/races; myriad denominational backgrounds; students of all ages and educational levels. Prayer seminars fit everyone. Some are mature believers; others are baby Christians.

Then there are the Doorkeepers. Your partnership means so much to us. Sue, the members of the JGHM Board of Directors, and I know that this has been from the beginning an "our" ministry. Not only the things that we do depend on our Doorkeepers, but "how" we do them. Your support has made it possible for us never charge a set fee nor "sell" our books and tapes. With the deepest gratitude that I can express, I thank you for the roles you play in helping us fulfill our mission. Being surrounded with kindred minds who provide the prayer and financial support to continue onward and upward means more than words can express.

Thank God for memories! Is today going to be a pleasant memory? By putting Christ first, we will stay on the right path with clear consciences and sweet rest at the end of the day.

Plan. It will be helpful if you will take time to think through how to approach the Scriptures for fuller, deeper understanding, experiencing first hand what God has said in His Word, and applying the wisdom and faith of the Bible in your daily life. Make a realistic Bible study plan and stick with it! Set aside a specific time each day for Bible reading. If your attitude is "I will read my Bible today when I get around to it," the devil will certainly see that you never "get around to it." Allow enough time for God to speak to you out of the Word before you start speaking to Him in prayer. Choose a time that can become a regular part of your daily routine. There is no question that you should begin your day with God. Don't wait until you have messed up your day and then bring the pieces for God to put back together. Read privately, by yourself.

Choose a guiet place to study, free from distractions such as television, radio, telephone calls. Have a cleared desk or table to work on, with references, notebook, and pen or pencil at hand. Choose a comfortable chair and have a good reading light. Determine to let nothing infringe upon your quiet time. Watch for distractions that will rob you of your concentration. Resist the devil when he brings things to mind which you need to be doing, now! God's provision is for us to first "submit to God" and then "resist the devil and he will flee from you" (James 4:7). Remember that "Greater is He who is in you [the Holy Spirit] than he [Satan] who is in the world" (1 John 4:4).

**Make a month's schedule.** As you approach the matter of daily Bible reading, you should develop a method

to guide your reading of the Scripture. Be flexible. Change your method from time to time to assure freshness. Be sure your method is working for you. Modify the method as needed.

You might begin by choosing a quantity of reading to be done each day. Select an amount small enough to avoid rushing. Make out a month's schedule at a time. The **Doorkeeper** Prayer Calendar includes the schedule of reading that I follow year by year that takes me through the Bible each year. You might want to follow it since it is seldom cumbersome and time consuming. I do not schedule systematic reading on Sundays since that is a day when one can be open to the leadership of the Holy Spirit as you prepare to assemble for worship (Hebrews 10:25). Sunday is a good day to review what you have read the week before.

Speak to the Author. All of us, in reading some book, have wished the author were present to answer and explain something; but that is seldom possible. Isn't it amazing, however, that we can speak directly to the Author of the Bible? The same Holy Spirit, who led these men to write, longs to lead us to understand. Always begin Bible reading with prayer for divine guidance. On the note sheets that I use each day during my Bible reading, the following verse is prominently displayed: "Open my eyes, that I may see wondrous things from Your law" (Psalm 119:"18). If you don't understand something, remember "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God" (James 1:5). God enjoys giving us wisdom and understanding, especially with regard to His Word.


John Newton, saved slave trader

Without the guidance of the Holy Spirit, our Teacher, we read the Scriptures in vain.

I particularly profited from the advice in the third stanza of "I've Found the Answer.: "Keep your Bible with you, read it ev'ry day, Always count your blessings and always stop to pray; Learn to keep believing and faith will see you through, Seek to know contentment and it will come to you."

Knowing that God is on our side keeps us confident in every time of sowing His word and "preaching the kingdom of God and teaching the things which concern the Lord Jesus Christ with all confidence ..." (Acts 28:31).

## God's Amazing Ways JGHM--EAST AFRICA BRANCH Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi

Never one time did I think about ministry in other nations at the level that God had planned and did not understand what He was doing until Sunday, August 12, 1990 in Semarang, Indonesia (over 10,000 miles from my Murfreesboro, Tennessee, home). By that time, I had conducted prayer seminars in India, South Korea, Japan, Nigeria, Philippines, Jamaica, Switzerland, Italy, and England using vacation time from the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS). That Sunday was one of the most amazing days in my life. My call was to bring the message at three services in the church in Samarang that had hosted the area-wide prayer seminars. At 6 a.m., 2,000 people gathered. Then at 8 a.m., another 2,000; at 10 a.m. another 2,000 for a total of 6,000 people.

My message was from Thessalonians 5:23 speaking of how God has made us. Man is a trichotomy, not a dichotomy. We are spirit, soul, and body. The real person lives inside the body. When Adam sinned, his spirit died to God. Everyone born since Adam has been born dead to God. When a person trusts God's provision for his salvation the Lord Jesus Christ who died on the cross shedding His blood to pay for our sins, there is new life as the Holy Spirit moves into our spirit. We are born again. Then I spoke of "death" which means "separation" when spirit and soul moves out of the body. The message was well received with a large number trusting Christ as Savior Many, including the church leaders, said that they had never heard what I preached before.

The light came on! God had brought into existence J. Gordon Henry Ministries to stand alongside indigenous churches already established, but who needed a teaching ministry just like the Great Commission says. As we have gone forth, I have never forgotten our task. Time after time, believers have said that there had never been an organized Christian-life ministry in their areas. The Indonsian church provided an excellent Indonesian edition of the prayer seminar workbook and taped each session to be used later promising to continue teaching the materials until the Lord Jesus returns.

**Kenya-Uganda**. When you receive this edition of the Reflector, Martin **Shikuki** and I are working in Uganda. After we conducted four seminars in west Kenya, we crossed the border into Uganda for prayer seminars in Tororo, Mbale, Kumi, Sorot, Lira, either Luwero or Gula, Kampala, Jinja, Iganga, Busia, and Bugiri. Certainly, this is a venture of faith. Continue to pray for traveling grace, health/physical stamina, participants with teachable spirits and willing hearts; unction of the Holy Spirit upon each word spoken, and spiritual awakening in each heart and church. Thanks for your prayer and financial support, we will come along side these pastors/churches to launch JGHM EAST AFRICA BRANCH. It is our goal to establish hundreds of Lighthouses of Prayer in **Tanzania**, Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, and **Burundi**. Pray for Martin and his team as they undertake a teaching ministry among the churches.

#### Thinking of Ken Miedema (8/12/1937--3/21/2013)

A man who caught the vision of the purpose and power of prayer was Ken Miedema, Grandville, Michigan, whom I viewed as the proverbial "man's man." He and his wife, Betsy, became Doorkeepers on March 3, 1996. One thing that I could count on was a note from Ken after his monthly **Reflector** arrived with the assurance that EVERY MORNING, he and Betsy prayed for me, for Sue, and the prayer seminar ministry. Often, there was a phone call from Ken with words of encouragement. One thing he said frequently was how much the **Reflecto**r meant to him. Sometimes he would say, "This is the best **Reflector** yet. I read every word and then later re-read it."

A few years ago, Ken shared that he had Parkinson's disease and often asked for prayer for God's grace and/or healing. Many of you were praying for him. As his health declined, Betsy stood by him providing for his every need. Through God's grace she was able to meet a challenge. His death announcement in the Grand Rapids Press continued his testimony: "On the first day of spring, March 21, 2013, new life began for Ken Miedema, age 75, of Grandville, Michigan, as he experienced perfect peace and rest with the Lord and Savior. Ken may have lost his physical battle with Parkinson's Disease, but Jesus had victoriously claimed his soul many years ago ... Ken loved his family, and his children are deeply grateful for the way Ken modeled his love for God and Scripture. Ken enjoyed Bible study, visiting and praying with people, and lay preaching at the jail. His desire was for people to know the love, joy, and forgiveness of the Lord that he experienced himself."

Although Ken was very physically challenged, his friends and wife said that when he learned about the prayer seminar in Kentwood there was no way that he could be kept away. There he was listening intently and agreeing with every word I said. We cherish the last picture that we had with him and the last notes and phone calls. He

and Betsy will continue to live in my heart until the Glad Reunion Day comes. "Absent from the body, present with the Lord ... enter into the joy of your Lord" (2 Corinthians 5:8b; Matthew 25:21b). His impact was tremendous.

## **NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER--MAY 2**

Many point out, rightly so, that some participate in public services related to the National Day of Prayer who are not on praying ground. The scripture that is often claimed is 2 Chronicles 7:14: "If My people who are called by My name, will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land." Certainly, America needs healing and only God can bring the healing. It is important to remember, however, that God is speaking to "His people called by His name" (since Acts 11:26 believers have been called "Christians"). Among the activities we promoted was an annual governor's prayer breakfast, attended by a large number from across the state. We worked with the Governor in proclaiming the day and issuing a resolution. We promoted the day with officials in every county. Year by year, the number involved increased.

Whether you attend a public prayer observance, you can have a part in this special day. My suggestion is a simple

one that we promoted throughout Tennessee:

#### TAKE 5 AT 12 NOON

Join thousands of others across America at 12 noon on Thursday, May 2, for at least five minutes of united prayer.

- Acknowledge our dependence upon God.
- Give thanks for the many blessings He has given us.
- Confess specific sins in our nation and ask for God's mercy upon us.
- Ask for a spirit of repentance among God's children.
- Ask God to guide our leaders and to bring healing and spiritual wholeness to our nation and all our people.

May this 63<sup>rd</sup> consecutive National Day of Prayer be special in your life and in the life of a nation that in many ways has forgotten God.
