# PERSISTENCE: "And it happened after ten days ..."

"And it happened after ten days that the word of the Lord came to Jeremiah" (Jeremiah 42:7). "Jesus spoke a parable... that men ought always to pray and not faint" (Luke 18:1). This is PERSISTENCE!

If one thing is clear in the Bible. God wants His children to pray. Prayer is not new. Early in the recorded history of man, it is noted, "then men began to call upon the Name of the Lord" (Genesis 4:26b). Jesus explained to the woman at the well in Sychar that God is seeking those who worship Him in "spirit and in truth" (John 4:23). Prayer is a time for us to worship. He invites us to draw near. When we take the initiative to obey this injunction, He then promises to draw near to us (James 4:8). But prayer is more than worship, it is a time to ask Him to do things in our lives. Not only has He "commanded" that we draw near to Him. He has commanded us to "call upon" Him (Jeremiah 33:3). The language used in James 4:8 is a command; the language used in Jeremiah 33:3 is also a command. God's promise in James 4:8 is that He will draw near us; the promise in Jeremiah 33:3 is that He will "show us great and mighty things that we know not."

While teaching in Peru a few years ago, the Holy Spirit brought into my mind a cluster of words to use to teach that God wants us to pray. "God is able!" "God is willing!" "God is waiting!" He is waiting for His children to call on Him. If you are a Christian, the question is "Do

you believe this? Do you believe that God expects you to call on Him." Sometimes we declare with our lips that we do believe this and turn around and prove that we really don't believe this because we don't pray! The song writer pinpointed this need when he said, "Before you left your room this morning, did you think to pray?" Not only are we to pray, we are to be persistent in our praying.

A young man approached Sue and me during a break in a prayer seminar in Bombay, India, asking if a Christian is showing a lack of faith, and thereby sinning, if he repeats a request to God when praying. My response was to tell him to give careful attention to my teaching from Luke 11:5-8, a passage that teaches bold praying, specific praying, and persistent praying. In fact, the reason that the man got up from his bed at midnight to provide three loaves of bread was because of the persistence of the one knocking on the door. Both John 14:13 and Matthew 7:7 have the same Greek tense properly translated to "ask and keep on asking."

When the remnant remaining in Judah after others had been carried away into captivity in Babylon asked Jeremiah to pray for them that God might show then the way they should walk and the thing they should do related to going down to Egypt (Jeremiah 42:2), Jeremiah agreed to do so. After clarifying clearly that he would report whatever the LORD answered (vv 4-6), Jeremiah prayed. It is interesting to note that the answer came "after ten days" of praying. Simply, it is important for us to remember as we pray that God's timing is often not ours. Until

He answers or lifts the burden, we keep on asking.

Jesus Himself taught that "men ought always to pray and not faint" (Luke 18:1). Sadly, many of us don't even think to pray until we do faint. When we receive no answer after praying for a brief time, we often cease praying. When we persist in this behavior, it is not very long until a pattern of praying becomes fixed that always leads to failure and discouragement. A "stronghold" of prayerlessness engulfs us and we become prayerless. Remember, prayerlessness is a sin (1 Samuel 12:23). Prayerlessness does not mean that we are not praying. Rather, prayerlessness means that we are not praying like we should be praying. We should be praying about everything and persist until the answer comes or God lifts the burden that evoked praying. It is always too early to guit when there is a prayer need and burden! It is important for believers to understand the place of persistence in prayer because that is what is taught in the Scriptures.

### The Parson Says

On Mother's Day, the tradition where I grew up in east Tennessee was to wear a red rose to honor a mother still living or a white rose in memory of a deceased mother.









My mom was a reader. Watching her read made me want to read. We lived in East Tennessee, near Knoxville, the home of the Knoxville Journal. She subscribed by mail and I devoured each daily issue. Two features grabbed my attention. On the editorial page, there was always a Scripture verse chosen by a reader whose name and location were provided. After I became a Christian, I submitted Scriptures. The other feature was entitled "The Parson Says." A bearded man with a black hat was the facsimile of a "parson." A short, wise, pithy saying accompanied him in his box. I began to cut these out and keep them. When we started the **Reflector**, I included this feature, which later became NOTES FROM MY BIBLE.

At some point, my filing system was to use a standard envelope. During the past few months, I have been an activity that librarians term "weeding." I recently came to a box that housed these files. One labeled "PARSON SAYS" was an envelope with the letter head: Kerby Knob Baptist Church, Kerby Knob, Kentucky 40441. For seven years, beginning in 1961, Sue, Mona, Mark, Melody and I worked with this wonderful congregation. Of all the envelopes in the box, this one was stuffed full of clippings. I have

selected a few samples:

"Opportunity is often disguised as hard work."

"Love does to hate what light does to darkness—Simple makes it disappear."

"Anxiety does not empty tomorrow of its sorrow; but it empties today of its strength. It does not make you escape evil, but makes you ill prepared to cope with it."

"Let's not pray for lighter burdens, but for broader shoulders."

"It doesn't require a trained nurse to nurse a grudge."

"When men speak ill of you, live so that nobody will believe them." "Be patient with the faults of others; they have to be patient with yours."

"One cannot be right with God and wrong with his fellow men."

"This would be a better world if every man were as good as he wants his neighbor to be."

"We make progress by what we do, not by what we leave undone."

Pulling these ten sayings out made no dent in the "PARSON SAYS" envelope. Hopefully, I will be disciplined enough to go through the sayings and retrieve many for future use.

### The Domestic Ministry

Of the 1,627 prayer seminars, 869 have been in the United States (forty-six states and the District of Columbia). Some have been in large churches with hundreds in attendance; others have been in smaller churches or settings. The smallest that I remember was a seminar in a public meeting room in the Estill (KY) County Courthouse with five in attendance. Frequent questions over the years have been how many do you have to have in attendance and how much money will it cost. The answer is that no number is required and no amount of money is expected. In fact, from day one, we have operated as a faith ministry trusting God to provide the financial needs through love offerings. Most of the support has come from Doorkeepers, those men and women (and churches) whose hearts the Lord has stirred to stand with us to provide both prayer and financial support. Therefore, it is not necessary for us to charge a set fee. Consequently, we have repeatedly said that every church, regardless of size, can have a prayer seminar. # The International Ministry

Of the 1,627 prayer seminars, 758 have been in other nations. The international ministry actually began as an evangelistic crusade in First Baptist Church, Placetas, Santa Clara Province, Cuba January 13-20, 1960. Seventy came to Christ. Fifty years later, September 25-26, 2010, Adam Nathanson and I returned to Placetas. Nine of the seventy converts were present. The international prayer seminar ministry was launched in November 1985 with prayer seminars in Secunderabad, India. Dr. Sam Simpson, pastor Bronx and Wake Eden Baptist churches in New York City, joined Sue and me. Sam served as the evangelist for an evangelistic crusade sponsored by JGHM and ASIA FOR CHRIST. Dr. B. A. Prabhakar, director. Thousands attended seminars in Nigeria, South Korea, and Indonesia-Malaysia, and Colombia. However, **JGHM** has chosen to schedule seminars throughout regions where we were visiting majoring on local churches joining together in their areas. This has been our approach in fifty-seven nations. Through the Doorkeepers, all expenses have been paid and workbooks have been provided for each participant in their own language.

For many years, we included time in each international seminar for the participants to tell us what God had taught them and what their next step would be to put into practice what they had learned. In our monthly publication, we shared these thrilling testimonies. We have often provided a supply of workbooks to those who

went forth to teach others. The fruit of our labor has inspired our **Doorkeepers** time after time. An integral part has been the spiritual preparation to be ready to teach. Many times, I have simply written my thoughts and filed them in the binders with my daily **SPIRITUAL JOURNAL** Bible study notes.

# Thoughts on the way to Venezuela (April 1, 2007)

"Proclaim the goodness of His salvation from day to day. Declare His glory among the nations, His wonders among all peoples" (1 Chronicle 16:23b-24). During these days in Venezuela, there is a CLEAR MISSON: building the KINGDOM by MOBILIZING and EQUIPPING prayer warriors.

Help each participant understand (1) how to come to Christ for salvation and (2) how to get on praying ground. TEACH carefully so that my students can teach others what they learn during the prayer seminars. (3) Review Biblical teachings and then present them in a usable fashion following proven teaching techniques. Keep putting the "cookies" on a low enough shelf that everyone present can reach them. From time to time, put some on a shelf that requires some effort on the part of the learners to reach them. RELY on the Holy Spirit to break down barriers to open up learning.

Here are some key ideas to present clearly and concisely in each seminar.

- ✓ Prayer is not new (Genesis 4:2b).
- ✓ A believer is to order his life around prayer praying about everything!
- ✓ Prayer is both WORSHIP (Seeking His Face) and WORK (Seeking His Hand)!
- Prayer's two directions: Toward Self PETITION is asking for self as did JABEZ (1 Chronicles 4:9-10); Toward Others INTERCESSON is praying for others. God wants us to pray!

# Jehovah-Jireh, The God who will see to it!

God reveals Himself in His names. The basis of worship is to praise God for who He is. Only in the Bible is the revelation that enables us to know who He is. A common translation of Jehovah-Jireh. one of the seven compound Hebrew names for God, is "the Lord who provides" based on the incident of Abraham's sacrifice of his son, Isaac, on Mount Moriah long ago. There was wood and there was fire for the sacrifice, but no lamb. God was then revealed as "the Lord who provides." God would provide the lamb, a foreshadowing of Jesus, the "Lamb of God" who will take away the sins of the world. I heard Dr. Warren Wiersbe give his exegesis of this Scripture saying that it means "the God who will see to it!"

Not only is it helpful to learn God's names, it is vital that we implement their meaning in our daily living. Thirtyone years ago, May 29, 1984, JGHM was founded. A bank account was established from a gift from a couple in New Jersey who accompanied us on a holy land tour. Malcom Troutman, Sue's brother, graciously provided funds for the first printing of the prayer seminar workbooks. We determined to operate as a faith ministry, depending on the Lord to stir hearts of His children to stand with us. He has been faithful because He is Jehovah-Jireh, the Lord who provides, the Lord who will see to it!

The first time the Doorkeepers and I began to "pray in a car" was for **Onesimus Sule** for the prayer seminar ministry in

Nigeria. Later, we "prayed in a car" for Leslie Motsalane and the prayer seminar ministry in South Africa. A few years ago, it became apparent Martin Shikuku desperately needed a car for the work in Kenya. God answered each time as we waited upon Him to provide. For the past few months, we have been praying for a replacement of the van in Kenya. A text message came from Martin Shikuku that the van was in his possession. The dealer had agreed that the remaining \$10,000 should be paid as soon as possible.

We have had no colleague that has poured himself into the prayer seminar ministry work more than Martin has done. He is a busy pastor in Eldoret in west Kenya for a growing congregation. He is a leader in the Baptist Convention of Kenva and the local ministers' association. He has recently returned from a series of prayer seminars in Mombasa, the resort city on the Indian Ocean where many Christians have been martyred. He traveled by bus since he had no van! When you sit before the Father in prayer, please join us in asking God to provide the funds to clear the van. He is the God who is able to see to it! Praise His holy name.
