65th Annual National Day of Prayer Thursday, May 5, 2016

Theme: Wake Up, America! Shout it aloud, do not hold back. Raise your voice like a trumpet! (Isaiah 58:1)

God is able! God is willing! God is waiting! The Almighty God is waiting for Americans to turn back to Him in a posture of prayer and repentance. May we, this day, determine to surrender our ways to Him as did our forefathers, giving God the honor He deserves so that, as Psalm 85 states, "His glory may dwell in our land."

UNCHANGED: God's call to holiness

A believer who desires a "closer walk" would do well to ponder both Peter's teaching and Paul's teaching on this subject. Both are calls to holiness or holy living. Peter expresses God's call to holiness in these words: "Therefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and rest your hope fully upon the grace that is to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ; as obedient children. not conforming yourselves to the former lusts, as in your ignorance; but as He who called you to be holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, because it is written, 'Be holy, for I am holy'" (1 Peter 1:13-15). Peter goes on to say, "conduct yourselves through the time of your stay here [on earth] in fear; knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot (vv 17b-19). For Peter, the call to holiness is the call to holy living.

The call to holiness is found and developed in many of Paul's epistles. Colossians is a good example. After presenting Jesus as the center of our lives and our Christian experience, Paul looks at empty avenues to spiritual development (achievement). He dismisses ritualistic and ascetic religious practices as lacking any value (Colossians 2:20-23). Instead he describes the holy life as one involving an inner separation from those passions that bubble up from our sinful nature (3:5-11). What marks believers as "God's chosen

I'd Rather Have Jesus

When word came that George Beverly Shea had gone Home to be with His Heavenly Father and His Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, I could only imagine his welcome. As I prayed for "the Team" who were left (Billy Graham, Cliff Barrow), I could hear Bev singing, "I'd Rather Have Jesus." In my tape library, I have a large number of his songs that I keep nearby. Several times a week I listen to one of the cassettes or CDs. I never grow tired of the hymns and gospel songs in his repertoire.

God used "I'd Rather Have Jesus" to move Bev Shea into Christian ministry. Perhaps you have heard the story shared by R. Barclay Warren: "Forty years ago Bev Shea was attending the Bible School in Ottawa (Ontario) where I was teaching. He loved to sing. After more training in New York City he was given an audition at one of the radio stations and was offered a contract. He asked that he might sing Gospel songs. He was told that he might use one occasionally, but he would have to use the songs on Hit Parade. What would he do? His mother was praying.

On Saturday night she placed a poem on the piano. In the morning, he composed a tune for it. One verse was: 'I'd rather have Jesus than silver and gold: I'd rather have Jesus than worldwide fame; I'd rather be true to His holy name!' Bev turned down the contract. A short time later he was offered a position with a Chicago radio station where he might use the Gospel songs he loved. While there he met Billy Graham. The rest of the story is well-known."

people, holy and dearly loved" (v 12) is their commitment to compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and

patience. It is these things, with mutual forgiveness and deepening love, which express the reality of holiness (3:12-14). As did Peter, Paul's call to holiness is a call to holy living.

It was in 1976, while serving as Vice President for Academic Affairs at Liberty University, Lynchburg, Virginia and as pastor for the Pleasant View Baptist Church, that I began to sense that I did not know God very well. This led to a transformation that I have called my spiritual "metamorphosis" that happened in 1977. The realization came that the key is the Word of God. The Source of the realization was the Holy Spirit graciously opening the mind of my understanding to a reality that had to be faced. The Word of God is not simply a message to be preached, but my spiritual food. Later when I wrote a book encouraging believers to get into the Word of God I chose the title "A Christian's Necessary Food." As I incorporated this testimony into the prayer seminar content, a participant in a 1992 Venezuela seminar wrote on his response card that he wanted a "77" in his life.

The key to a holy life is walking in the Spirit, not in the flesh. Thanks to the prayers of Richard and Ruth Elmer, I began to develop an interest in the Holy Spirit. When our daughter, **Mona**, went away to Converse College (Spartanburg, South Carolina), I asked Ruth to come to Pleasant View as our organist and Richard to come as our soloist. Later, they shared with me that as they listened to my sermons that there was little emphasis on the work of the Holy Spirit in the life of a believer. This sweet couple did not speak to others, or even to me, about this omission, they spoke to God and I began to preach sermons about the Holy Spirit as our Enabler.

The will of God for each believer is stated by Paul in **Ephesians 5:18**. We are to be "Spirit-filled." The analogy used to explain this is in the same verse a "drunk." The issue is never receiving more of the Holy Spirit because at the moment of salvation each believer receives all the Holy Spirit that He will ever have. God does not give the Holy Spirit in installments. Paul is not speaking of quantity (more of the Holy Spirit); rather he is speaking of being controlled by the Holy Spirit. It would be unfair to teach this truth with teaching HOW TO be controlled by the Holy Spirit. We must ask God to show us sins in our lives. Once He does, a mind change related to the sin is required. That change of mind is called **repentance**. Following repentance, God requires us to **confess** the sin specifically to Him (1 John 1:9). Then comes forgiveness, cleansing, and a change of direction. Then we yield to the Holy Spirit. "Spirit-filled" is not a one-time experience as is "Spirit baptized" (1 Corinthians 12:13).

As I wrote my section of The Enabler, a book co-authored by Dr. Robert Witty, I found that almost every mention of the Spirit includes the word "Holy" thus, "Holy Spirit." This title is more than a reference to the Spirit's deity; it is more specifically a reference to the nature of His work in the lives of believers. It is He who enables us to experience holy living day by day.

National Day of Prayer

Many point out, rightly so, that some participate in public services related to the National Day of Prayer who are not on praying ground. The scripture that is often claimed is 2 Chronicles 7:14: "If My people who are called by My name, will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land." Certainly, America needs healing and only God can bring the healing. It is important to remember, however, that God is speaking to "His people called by His name" (since Acts 11:26 believers have been called "Christians.") Until God's children meet His requirements, there will be no healing in the land. As we meet God's conditions, there will be healing.

At the same time, I concluded a number of years ago that a National Day of Prayer is a good thing for several reasons. On one day, across the nation in cities, towns, villages, and rural areas, God is acknowledged. For eight years, JGHM (at considerable expense of time, energy, and resources) served as the Tennessee state coordinator for the National Day of Prayer.

Among the activities we promoted was an annual governor's prayer breakfast, attended by a large number from across the state. We worked with the Governor in proclaiming the day and issuing a resolution. We promoted the day with officials in every county. Year by year, the number involved increased.

Whether you attend a public prayer observance, you can have a part in this special day. My suggestion is a simple one that we promoted throughout Tennessee:

TAKE 5 AT 12 NOON

Join thousands of others across America at 12 noon on Thursday, May 5, for at least five minutes of united prayer.

- > Acknowledge our dependence upon God.
- > Give thanks for the many blessings He has given us.
- > Confess specific sins in our nation and ask for God's mercy upon us.
- > Ask for a spirit of repentance among God's children.
- > Ask God to guide our leaders and to bring healing and spiritual wholeness to our nation and all our people.

May this 65th consecutive **National Day of Prayer** be special in your life and in the life of a nation that in many ways has forgotten God.

For the May 5th observances, Dr. Tony Evans, the 2016 Honorary Chairman, has written a special prayer to be simultaneously read throughout the nation at noon (ET). A special place for the seniors

In reading Paul's letters to Timothy, it is obvious that there is a special place in the church for the godly as they grow old. Actually, a pastor is to treat each member as family, but is to show proper respect and regard for the older men—"exalt him as a father" (1 Timothy 5:1); the older women should be treated "as mothers" (v 2).

In writing about this Walter B. Knight noted: "What great things some men have done in the later years of their life. Michelangelo painted the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel lying on his back on a scaffold when almost 90; Paderewski at 79 played the piano superbly; at 88 John Wesley preached every day; Tennyson, when 88, wrote "Crossing the Bar." Booth Tarkington wrote sixteen novels after 60, some of them when he was almost totally blind"

A number of years ago, I traveled from our home in Murfreesboro, Tennessee to conduct a prayer seminar in the Blue Ridge Mountains in Nelson County, Virginia. That was the seminar when I became friends with one of the most remarkable "seniors" whom I have known, Josephine Fitzgerald, then in her mid-seventies. She shared that she felt God wanted her to write a book. My response was, "then you had better write a book." Her response was, "I can't write a book, during the

remaining years of her life (and she died soon after she celebrated her 100^{th} birthday), she wrote five of the most interesting books that I have ever read. My copies are deposited in the "J. Gordon Henry Collection" room in the Northeastern Baptist College library on Main Street, Bennington, Vermont.

Josephine taught herself to type. Sue Bell, my able assistant for nineteen years, and our daughter Mona, worked with her on the first few books. But Josephine not only became an author of note, she became my mentor teaching me lessons on what walking by faith alone really means in everyday life.

To the pastors, my advice is don't do all the praying and all the talking during a worship service. Call on seniors to participate and see the blessing that comes to all ages. To the choir directors (if there are such positions existing today), call on the seniors and see what a blessing the Lord gives through their musical renditions.

Some years ago, I conducted a prayer seminar in the Red Bank Baptist Church, in Kansas City, Missouri. A few days later, I received a letter from a lady who had attended the seminar. She told me about the special ministry that she had with retired missionaries in that area. She noted that some felt that their ministry was over. When she understood what she was observing, the Holy Spirit led her to organize them to become intercessors. She shared amazing

answers to the prayers of the saints who had felt that their ministry was over. From time to time, I have shared this example with others in similar circumstances.

Here in our city resides one of the most interesting men of God you can find anywhere. I first became familiar with Dr Robert Sumner who worked with Dr John R. Rice in producing the **Sword of the Lord**, a publication full of sermons from leading preachers whom God has used mightily. As a young pastor, I looked forward to receiving the paper. I had expected **Dr. Sumner** might be the successor to Dr. Rice. Instead. he founded the Biblical Evangelist, a publication that I recommend to every pastor. Now, when I receive a copy of this paper, I don't begin reading the excellent, powerful sermons from some of the masterful preachers. Rather I start with Dr. Sumner's keen observations of the times in which we are living from a Biblical perspective. I am literally amazed at his gift of communication and his understanding of the times. . **Dr. Sumner** recently entered his ninety-third year of living!

Don't forget to remember that there is a special plan in the work of the Lord for the godly as they grow older!

COME THOU FOUNT OF EVERY BLESSING

The name **Robert Robinson** is not a familiar one to many people, but the song he wrote, "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessings," has been sung in churches this world over.

"Come Thou fount of every blessing Tune my heart to sing Thy grace: Streams of mercy, never ceasing, Call for songs of loudest praise."

George Whitfield was preaching and young Robert Robinson seemed unimpressed. He felt pity for the fiery preacher, but he couldn't help admire him and his followers for their happiness.

While his parents had been members of the established Church of England, Robert had never made a decision in religious matters. His only ambition was to acquire more knowledge and improve himself. At age six he attended a Latin school. Later, due to the death of his father and subsequent obligations at home, he went to work as an apprentice to a barber. Listening to George Whitfield, Robinson heard of the true remedy for a sin-sick soul. At first his heart seemed unresponsive to the message.

Two years later the Holy Spirit spoke to his heart and he was converted in a Methodist meeting.

"Jesus sought me when a stranger,

Wandering from the fold of God; He, to rescue me from danger, Interposed His precious blood."

It was evident immediately that the Lord had something very special for him. He left his job as a barber and began to preach. While he had a special place in his heart for

his Methodist friends who had pointed him to the Lord, there were serious questions as to whether or not he ought to stay with this group. A decision was made to break from the Methodists and form an independent church. After some serious reflection, he felt his convictions were the same as the Baptists. He was ordained and began to pastor a church. God's hand of blessing was evident. His tireless work and straightforward preaching interested students. His message was that of grace.

"O to grace how great a debtor Daily I'm constrained to be! Let that grace now, like a fetter, Bind my wandering heart to Thee."

Now married with a family, his life seemed to be just beginning its fruitfulness. However, he was found dead at the age of fifty-five.

Only Heaven can truly evaluate the life and ministry of this man. His well-known hymn seems to be the heritage he left from his faithful life of service. But such is purely not the case. During his ministry he had a profound effect on the life of his successor, Robert Hall. Among preachers, Robert **Robinson** is hardly known. But almost every preacher indirectly reaps the benefits of the ministry of this man. Robert Hall, the man indebted to Robert Robinson, was to have a major part in the life and ministry of another preacher known to all of us - CHARLES HADDON SPURGEON. Man may not know, but God knows & remembers.
