

60 YEARS HONORED

On Thursday, April 18, 1957, Sue Troutman became my beloved bride. On Tuesday, April 18, 2017, we thanked God for 21,900 days (actually 21,915 adding in fifteen leap-years with an extra day). One of the three cards that I gave Sue had this theme: "TOGETHERNESS: FOR ALL WE'VE SHARED TOGETHER. FOR ALL THAT'S YET TO BE . . . " The inside design featured many lines arranged so that I could easily put a date, a person, a place, or an event to remember events from the sixty years. One expression that would tie all these listings together is "PRECIOUS MEMORIES." Some of the listings represent mountaintop experiences; others walking in the valleys—and there have been both pretty much reflecting Solomon's declaration that there is a season for all things.

The Diamond Anniversary Celebration took place on Saturday afternoon, April 22, from 2 o'clock until 4 o'clock. The event was staged in Memorial Christian Church, Perrymont Avenue, Lynchburg, Virginia. Our granddaughter, Jeanne, and our daughter, Mona, attended to the details of the gathering to make this a very special occasion. Mona is Minister of Music at Memorial and Jeanne sings in the choir, often featured as a soloist. Baptist College then Liberty Baptist College (LBC), now Liberty University (LU) where I served as the first Vice President for Academic Affairs. In those days, I never dreamed that the stone building would hold any special significance for the Henry clan.

The ambiance of the Fellowship Hall with its carefully placed floral arrangements (many in Ball glass jars), beautifully decorated tables, and plenty of food and drinks, was just right for a serious celebration of sixty years. **Jeanne** and her helpers did a great job. Over one hundred guests attended. John Holland, Yorktown, Virginia, who along with his wife, Glenda, serve as Honorary Board members for J. Gordon Henry Ministries, represented the board and served as the Master of Ceremonies. The celebration theme was "LOVING GOD AND LOVING EACH OTHER FOR SIXTY YEARS." Roger Minney with his guitar honored us with a rendition. Mona presented an original tribute to her parents. Of course, the highlight was her singing, "Day by Day," the same selection used during my Presidential Inaugural Service at Northeastern Bible College in 1980. Then Mona and Jeannie's duet, "Until Then," was used as a remembrance of Carter Mylam, our long-time friend and other family and friends who are now in Heaven. Then our pastor Dr. Dennis Hollandsworth, Beulah Baptist Church, Lynchburg, brought a message from the Word of God and prayed a dedicatory prayer of renewal for Sue and me. The backdrop for the time of fellowship was a slide presentation of our life together arranged by Jonathan Matos.

The result of sixty-years of family life and over sixty-three years of ministry is a photo collection totaling in the thousands. During the time of selecting pictures for the occasion, I ran across the card signed by leaders of Liberty Baptist College that was presented to Sue and I at a farewell dinner in 1978. The card was signed by Jerry & Macel Falwell ("May God use you"), Russ & Joann Fitzgerald, Dick & Ruth Elmer, Mac & June McHaney, Don & Joyce Leslie, Boyd & Norma Rist, Woodrow & Linda Kroll, Garth & Laura Runion, C. Sumner & Celeste Wemp, Eddie & Lorna Dobson, Tom Diggs, Al & Evelyn Snyder, Amos & Joyce Wipf, Maury & Lenore Stone, Ora Max & Betty Wellman, Ruth L. Chamberlain, and Ed Donald. The faculty and administrators presented us a silver tea serving set on a beautiful tray.

The decision to leave Liberty was not easy. The years had been quite demanding but the work culminated in our being approved by the Commonwealth of Virginia to grant degrees and Candidacy Status with the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). The self-study and the self-study report were highly complimented by the Accreditation Commission. The two areas cited as needing further development were faculty credentials and the library. Dr. Falwell invited me to a luncheon that would provide the two of us with privacy and some time of debriefing. He began by questioning my decision to leave noting that "if we voted you would have 98% of the votes." One of the stipulations Dr. Falwell made upon accepting my resignation was that I return each

month until the full accreditation was granted. I agreed to that request. He presented me with a check drafted for \$1,000 (a lot of money in 1978), a ten-day trip to Israel and Jordan, and an invitation to a farewell dinner. He ended the luncheon with an invitation (that he often repeated as the years went by), "Anytime you want to return, the door is open and you can name your position."

The message on the card centered on friendship. The card had been secured safely in one of the albums and I had not looked at it for almost forty years. The selection on the card brought back PRECIOUS MEMORIES of professional colleagues who were friends, as well, from long-gone years. Sue and I recognize that we could pull out similar events from churches, hospitals where she worked, educational institutions, and family gatherings. We are blessed with memories. Many of you readers are in our **Book of Memories**. God has been so very good to us.

During my recent absence, Sue organized the incoming mail in an effort to make the transition back to normalcy easier. She slit open the correspondence ready for my review.

I did not touch the mail until Saturday morning after my personal devotions. The first card was from my friend and long-time Doorkeeper Dr. Harris Verkaik. No pastor has been any closer to my heart than this great man of God who is now eighty-five years old. He and his wife, Jane, live in Bradenton, Florida (during the winter months) and in Hudsonville, Michigan (during the summer months).

Our prayer and praise go continually to Heaven's Throne for you both, and especially for the prayer ministry, your family, coworkers, people in the Reflector and Doorkeepers.

This year has been something of a milestone for us. January 2017 has been twenty years since we concluded our pastoral ministry at the Fellowship Reformed Church in Hudsonville, Michigan. After much prayer the Spirit has released me from preaching the Gospel and Word. This was not easy after sixty-five years, but the body is not so cooperative. The last time in our Park, I almost fell. I am just

Our children also have had some health issues. Our oldest son, David, has "Essential Tremors" like Parkinson's disease. Our son-in-law had a liver transplant last year (Deb's husband). He's doing better and has begun work this month.

The other daughter and family are busy with many mission trips during year as does David and Carolyn to Kenya. She just returned from Vietnam speaking to a conference of 2,000 women. Jane Ann has gone to be with the Lord Jesus as of 10/29/15. I can't remember if you know this.

Now I have one ministry: PRAYER. I was encouraged by a remark in the Reflector, "Jesus did not teach us to preach; rather, He taught us to pray." Until Jesus comes. Today?

I simply could not control my sobs evoked by thoughts my brother shared. The Holy Spirit took what was in his heart and placed it in my heart.

THE TWO THOUGHTS THAT TOUCHED ME DEEPLY WERE (1) HIS SHARING THAT THE SPIRIT HAD "RELEASED HIM FROM CONTINUING TO PREACH THE GOSPEL" AND (2) HIS NEW ASSIGNMENT FROM THE LORD—TO BE A "PRAYER WARRIOR."

For over 1,400 Sundays, I served as a local church pastor. Sometimes I preached three sermons a day, always two. In addition, I have "preached" many revivals (sometimes five two-week revivals in a year). I was reluctant to miss a Sunday for vacations or time-off days. It felt strange, indeed, the first Sunday at Northeastern Bible College, Essex Fells, New Jersey when I did not go to the pulpit to preach. But at that time God had "released" me from a pastoral ministry to an itinerant teaching ministry. To me, this concept has a tremendous message. Anyone of us in a preaching or teaching ministry will one day be "released" from the task that He gave to us. The time and circumstance are in His hands

Argentina/Brazil Report

March 16-March 31, 2017

Hundreds attended the prayer seminars in beautiful Porto Alegre, Brazil, a city of four million in eastern Brazil in Rio Grande DoSul Province. Several of the seminars were streamed live with a very large audience. The moving of the Holy Spirit was memorable in intensity. It was obvious that there was a determination not to let one word fall to the ground. **Pastor Olavo Nunes Neto**, Brazil for Christ Church—Porto Alegre,, who coordinated the Brazilian seminars, shared that pastors had expressed to him an amazement in how well the prayer seminar was received and the number that attended. Several of the members served as my interpreter and did a tremendous job. **Brazil for Christ** is an indigenous body of believers that has 2,200 churches scattered across Brazil.

The work in **Argentina** picked up from a 1999 visit to the Transparent Church and the large 4,000 student Christian school. The founder, **Pastor Bongarra**, was used mightily to bring evangelical Christianity to Argentina. Since our first visit, he has been promoted to his eternal home, but his sons are carrying on his work. As the week progressed, it was quite apparent that the Holy Spirit was restoring a sense of unity in all facets of this extraordinary ministry. Seldom have I seen revival and renewal take place so openly. A highlight was God's call to **Lusiano Baneges**, a twenty-year old teacher from one of the five rural schools planted across Argentina, to preach the Gospel. He announced this call on March 28, 2017, following a prayer seminar for a group from the rural schools. During the trip, twenty-two trusted Christ as Savior.
