

PERSPECTIVES

For the past twenty-eight years, the theme of many issues of the **Reflector** has been Bible study and prayer two primary disciplines in a successful Christian life. During the remainder of 2020, it is my desire to again deal with these two issues. Clearly, the main thing is to keep the main thing the main thing. During a prayer seminar, attention is given to the five emphases practiced by the early believers and the Jerusalem church: (1) the doctrine (the Word of God), (2) Spirit-filled living, (3) prayer, (4) witnessing, and (5) stewardship.

In talking to Christians around the world. I have discovered that their greatest desire is to know how to pray. When a survey was conducted on Sermons Americans Want to Hear, it was discovered that the people's first choice was How can I make prayer effective? Christians want to pray, but don't seem to know how. Subsequently, our spiritual lives are often at a low ebb. Hard work. Why is it so difficult to pray? Satan does not want you to pray. In fact, he would rather you do anything than pray because prayer is the point where he is defeated. His favorite word seems to be tomorrow. He is always trying to keep us from praying today. In fact, that must be one of main jobs to keep all Christians off their knees. He knows we already belong to God and there is nothing he can do about that. But he can do everything in his power to keep us from becoming effective, believing, praying Christians. He knows the power God has made available to us through prayer, and he does everything he can to keep it from us. He is always saying, You can pray tomorrow. You're so busy today. And when tomorrow comes, it is the same old story, Pray tomorrow. It's always tomorrow with the devil. Tomorrow and the next day and the one following, until we reach the end of our lives and find we have missed much that God had waiting to give to us.

The flesh (the continuing influence of the old man who was crucified with Christ when you trusted Christ as your Savior and Lord) does not want you to pray. The flesh says that you are too tired to pray. You need a break from you heavy duties of the day. You deserve a break. And so it goes. The flesh wars against the Holy Spirit continually. Maintaining a daily, consistent prayer life is HARD WORK.

Understanding prayer. What exactly is prayer? Is it really so complicated that Christians must spend a life time search for an answer? Or are we making something confusing out of what God intended to be beautiful in simplicity?

In basic terms, you can think of prayer as the talking part of relationship. It is a conversation between two friends who love each other a friend talking to a friend (John 15:15). Another way is to think of prayer as a servant talking to his master (Colossians 3:24). Further, prayer can be seen as a bride talking to the bridegroom (Romans 7:4) and that's lovers' talk full of intimacy. It is through prayer that we see God's love and power at work in our lives and in the lives of people for whom we are praying. As a result, prayer makes us come alive spiritually. Everyone knows that verbal communication is necessary

to develop positive relationships, so therefore, when you are praying you are developing your relationship with the Lord. You will never know God if you don't spend time in His presence.

Prayer is the key that opens the door to a whole new world a world lived in active, conscious pursuit of the living God. It becomes the foundation of everything we do. We are to order our lives around prayer and pray about everything. When we pray, we see great things happen for God; when we don't pray, we don't see much happen.

The sin of prayerlessness. Many Christians acknowledge that they should pray more, but say they are simply neglecting it. God's position, however, is that prayerlessness is a sin (1 Samuel 12:23). Prayerlessness characterizes the life of many believers. It is that state in which one prays less than he ought, less than the Father desires, and less than that one himself knows that he should. Some studies have indicated that many Christians pray less that four minutes a day, if at all.

Did you ever think of not praying as a sin? We all know we should pray and yet so few of us do. The Bible plainly says that when we know to do right and fail to do it that the failure is a sin (James 4:17). A Christian living a prayerless life is robbed of all the power God intends for him to have. So, you see prayerlessness is more than an area of neglect. It is a sin. If I don't talk to God, then it is an indication that He is really playing a secondary role in my life and a result of this, I will never be the person that God wants me to be.

Prayerlessness is costly. It costs the individual who isn't praying because prayer is what God has provided to help us grow, along with the Word of God. Through the Word of God, God speaks to us; through prayer, we speak to God. Prayerlessness also costs God because this is His ordained way to get His work done. Finally, prayer costs others who do not benefit from prayers that are not prayed.

God's plan. God has chosen to limit Himself to working through us. He has made us His partners and has even entrusted the lost into our care. Apart from us, He has nobody in the world no hands and feet or heart and voice to bring His message to a dying world. God wants to save the whole world, but He will only accomplish that goal through His children. God wants to answer prayer, but He doesn't unless we pray. All God wants to do in this world through His children, including you, can only be done through prayer. This is the one, unchanging condition that must be met if we want to see God move. Everyone agrees that God is able and willing. We must add waiting to the list. He is waiting for us to call upon Him (**Jeremiah 33:3**, James 4:2b, Luke 18:1).

Why should we pray? Because God answers prayer! Do we really believe that? Do we live as though we believe it? If we did, I think we would be spending more time on our knees in prayer. Our time with God would be the most important thing we did all day. Unfortunately, most of us do not live that way. Year after year we pray only little prayers and get little answers.

The first step. Why do we pray so

little? It isn't because we don't want to pray, because I believe most of us do. One reason is that we try to fit God in our schedule between other activities. We try to fit Him into our schedule rather than fitting our schedule around Him.

The first step on the learning-to-pray ladder is simple: we must make time to pray. Don't expect to awaken one morning and say, Oh, great! I have time to pray today. It just doesn't happen that way. Our lives are so full of activities (many of them good), there just doesn't seem to be any time left over to pray. That's the first problem that must be overcome.

No one has any more time than anyone else. You and I have all the time there is. We must decide how to use our time. It boils down to deciding what is essential in your life. The reality is that we manage, always, to do the things we really want to do. We do what we think is important. A helpful exercise is to do a time study to see how we are using our time. Without fail, people who are willing to do this are surprised at how much time is spent on minor pursuits. Include attending to basic needs of grooming, eating, sleeping, working, but don't forget to include talking on the telephone, watching television, and such.

A study of the life of the Lord Jesus Christ during the three years of His active ministry will establish that He made prayer top priority in His life. To prioritize is to order according to importance. That is what we must do. To pray well, we must make time to pray. We must set aside a time for prayer each day. We should try to make it as regular as possible

because we all work better and are more efficient when we are on some sort of schedule. Our physical bodies work best when we eat at a regular time each day and when we go to bed at a regular hour. Our spiritual lives work best when we have a regular time to be alone with God each day, reading His Word and praying.

The ideal time is the early morning. A principle is simply to start your day with God. Don't wait until you have messed up your day and then bring the pieces to God to put back together. Jesus Himself followed early morning praying arising long before day for prayer (Mark 1:35). His teachings in the Model Prayer include praying for daily bread and to not be led into temptation. In His day, folks did not have refrigeration. Rather, the custom was to go to the market and get enough food for the day. When a person waits until night to pray, he could have gone hungry all day. Temptation does not come when we go to bed to sleep. Temptation comes when we are in the world. Look through your daily schedule and find the best time for you to pray. Then make an appointment to meet God; keep the appointment.

Being with Him. Remember this: Our highest calling in life, when all is said and done, is not in serving Jesus, but in being with Him. Our effective service and love for others can only come from being alone with God in prayer and in fellowship and in the reading of His Word. Isn't this what Jesus told Martha in Luke 18:38-42? Martha was busy rushing around the kitchen, trying to get things ready. Mary was simply sitting at the feet of Jesus. Martha couldn't understand this and

went into the living room to complain. Do you think it is fair for Mary to be sitting there with You when there is so much work to be done? And Jesus said to her gently, Martha, Martha there is really only one thing worth being concerned about, and Mary has discovered it. Have you learned, as Mary did, what is really of lasting value in your life?

No matter how busy and full your day may be, the most worthwhile thing you can do is to sit alone at the feet of Jesus. Sitting means taking time to be relaxed. Prepare your mind. Think. This is the most important part of your day. Don't rush. Determine to wait upon the Lord (Isaiah 40:31), to be still and know He is God (Psalm 46:10-11), to take the initiative to draw nigh to God knowing that when you do He will draw nigh to you (James 4:8).

Spiritual discipline. We have become a generation of soft, weak, undisciplined, prayerless Christians. Spiritual discipline is the key to growth in the spiritual life. It is the only key that will open the door to a full and joyous life with Christ. Why are there so many weak, frail, stumbling Christians today? Because we have ignored the only Source of our strength and power the Lord Jesus Christ and the importance of being with Him, loving Him, and sharing our lives with Him in prayer. God being our Helper, we want to do something about this matter.

Future studies. It would be unfair for me to urge you to set aside time for daily prayer, without sharing some practical things you can do to make it so. For many years, I preached the Word of God telling people what to do,

never sharing how they could do it. I simply sent them away on a guilt trip. Now I know better. My prayer is that the remaining 2020 PERSPECTIVES will make a tremendous difference in the spiritual lives of many people.


a number of years, the **Reflector** mailing list was over 13,000 for each issue.

PRACTICAL STEPS TO GROWING YOUR PRAYER LIFE A Devotional By Sunday & Grace Bwanhot

6. Create a Prayer Closet.

Prayer is such a discipline that unless we observe it as Scripture commands, we are certain to run into major obstacles. Except for the fact that God has promised to hear and answer us, there is nothing anyone of us could do that will make God hear us. Jesus' teaching on personal prayer in Matt. 6:6 instructs us to go into our closets to pray. Personal prayer is different from corporate prayer. The lack of personal prayer time affects corporate prayer time. You have got to be alone with God with no one else or anything that will distract you; no one to impress by your language, vocabulary and tone of voice when praying. Being alone with God is a reality check of our concept of who God is and the unveiling of our motives as we pray. In the closet God is saying: I have been waiting for you to hear and answer your prayer; but tell me, why I should answer you! Only closet prayer brings us to this point with our Lord. The problem when we come to pray is not with God but with us. Show your seriousness with God by the discipline of reporting to your

prayer closet regularly to meet with God.

SATAN AND THE WORD

The very moment you came to Christ Satan began to devise ways to defeat you and keep you from becoming what God wants you to be and doing what God wants you to do. It is obvious that he will strike the very core of your growth, the Word of God (God speaking to you) and Prayer (You speaking to God). Satan does not want a believer in the Word and in prayer and will do everything he can do to discourage a believer from reading the Bible and praying. The phone will ring or ping! Someone will knock at the door or enter the room. An intense feeling that something needs to be done immediately will distract you. There will be an urge to turn the television on or check the e-mail. Or you will get so sleepy that you can hardly keep your eyes open.

It is important, by the way, to remember that the devil has no place to stand in Christians unless we give him a place (Ephesians 4:27)! Prioritizing and discipline are life skills to learn and put into practice when Satan begins to do his work. Keep 1 John 4:4 at the forefront of your mind: Greater is He who is in you [the Holy Spirit] than the one who is in the world [Satan]. You and I do not have to be defeated. When you are ready for your Quiet Hour, be prepared for the battle to begin in your mind. Be sure that you take time each morning to put the whole armor of God on (Ephesians 6:10-18), God's protection for you when you go to battle. Since the first activity listed after your get your armor on (v 18) is prayer keep in mind that is where the battlefield will be.

There are times when the unrest. unsettleness, is not Satan, but the Holy Spirit. If freedom and release do not come it will be time to review and put into practice **James 4:8**: Submit ourself to God; resist the devil and he will flee from you. Follow David's example in Psalm 139:19-20 and ask for a full-scale investigation: Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me, and know my thoughts; and see if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting. When a believer sincerely asks God to show any sins in his/her life, He will. There will be a consciousness of sin(s). The result is conviction, knowing there is a sin. It is at that time we humble ourselves and repent (change our mind and direction about the sin), confess it specifically, and receive forgiveness and cleansing (1 John 1:9), It is only then that you have submitted to God. You have the authority to resist the devil and he will flee from vou. READ THE WORD FIRST. After God speaks to you, you will be ready to speak to Him. Start with praise and worship as often as possible. Remember in the first half of the Model Prayer, the focus is the Father Himself. Check the pronouns. It is not until the second half that the pronouns become us and our. The Model Prayer is not so much a prayer to be prayed as a prayer to teach us how to pray. It IS important how we order our praying!

JGHM has given away hundreds and hundreds of George Mueller's Soul Nourishment First. In the pamphlet, Mueller, who took care of orphan children in Bristol, England in the first half of the 1800's, wrote: "It has pleased the Lord to teach me a truth ... that the first and primary business

to which I ought to attend every day is ... how I might get my soul into a happy state ... by means of the Word of God, whilst meditating on it, my heart might be brought into experimental communion with the Lord ... that I might be comforted, encouraged, warned, reproved, instructed ... and my soul led to confession or to intercession or to supplication. I speak to my Father and to my Friend about things that He has brought before me in His precious Word." The best praying is that which comes out of the Word of God.

A major emphasis of the prayer seminar is coupling the Word of God and prayer. For sixty-six years, I have used the Reflector and other printed materials to call attention to our readers the importance of daily Bible reading and have provided practical suggestions to guide you. Many carry a copy of the Bible to Sunday school and church weekly who do not consult it for guidance in living. One reason is that Satan does not want us to see life from God's point of view. Certainly, he does not want us to know the provisions God has made to help us be victorious and walk in the Spirit. He does not want us to use the Word of God in our battle against his wiles and devices as the Lord Jesus Christ did during the temptation period in the wilderness. Since the devil's misuse of Scripture is a major ploy to defeat us when we do not know the Word of God well, it is to his advantage in spiritual warfare to keep believer's ignorant.

What are some of the techniques Satan is using to achieve his goals? One is to let books replace the Bible. Many revere the Bible more than they read it. We somehow have concluded that it is more expedient to digest the thoughts of others about Scriptures than to digest the Scriptures themselves. Such practice is a mistake! Instead of taking time in His Word, many contemporary Christians have developed the habit of following daily devotional guides that require only a few minutes in "spiritual exercise." The daily devotion usually consists of one verse and some thoughts. Sometimes there is a poem and a prayer that can be read in a couple of minutes.

I used to think that this kind of devotional life was better than none at all, but I've changed my mind. Our spiritual needs are too great and the task is too large to settle for anything less than a solid time in the Word. For the past few years, JGHM has been blessed by letters from many believers in developing nations asking for books and study materials. Some include a long book list. In my reply, I point out that it is vital to spend time daily in the Bible itself not in books about the Bible. I always remind them to "stay in the Word until you know God has spoken to you from the Scriptures. You will then be in a position to have a meaningful prayer time built on an attitude of dependence and faith which comes from the reading of His Word." I firmly believe this is the way to go.

Anything that is a substitute for God's Word, including the Reflector, Prayer Seminar Workbook and other books that I have written is bound to result in retarded spiritual growth. I'm not suggesting that devotional guides and books about the Bible are wrong. My personal library, now deposited in the Northeastern

Baptist College, Bennington, Vermont (as well as Sue's library) was filled with guides and books that have been tremendously helpful and encouraging to me and often spend time with them to great profit. But these must be supplements to God's Word, not substitutes for God's Word. There are times when picking up a devotional guide or Bible study book is appropriate, but it should always be after you have spent time in the Word and prayer.


