Perspectives

"Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people" (Proverbs 14:34). "The wicked shall be turned into hell, and all the nations that forget God" (Psalm 9:17).

"And that, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep: for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed. The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light" (Romans 13:11-12). "Therefore, He says, Awake, you who sleep, Arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light. See then that you walk circumspectly, not as fools but as wise, redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is" (Ephesians 5:14-17).

Almost daily, examples in the media remind Christians that a spiritual war is being waged in the United States. Externally, we have enemies that are working openingly to destroy our free way of life. Sadly, there are serious attacks on America precipitated internally by the judicial branch of our government, almost monthly. The face of America is changing at an accelerated rate. Christians were incensed a few years ago when a theologian declared that God is dead and expressed concern for the spiritual condition of our nation. Many began to pray and to return to the Word. The concern did not last, however, and soon we were drifting along once more. 9/11 moved us to understand the need for God and for His blessings upon us as a people. Hope was expressed that once again we were moving back toward God and the principles detailed in His Word. In a sense, the sleeping giant simply awakened briefly, turned over, and went back to sleep. The moral erosion continues. For many, morality is relative and there are no absolutes to guide behavior.

Biblical background

God speaks to His children out of His Word. Read and consider each reference that follows. When you understand the implications of the text for your life, check it off. This exercise will provide heart preparation to engage in spiritual warfare for the nation.

- 2 Chronicles 7:14
- 2 Chronicles 20:3-37
- 1 Timothy 2:1-4
- Joel 1 & 2
- Ezra 8:21-23
- Jonah 3:5-10

Get on praying ground

Begin with worship. Praise the Lord. It is good to sing praises to our God, for He is gracious and a song of praise is appropriate. 'You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power, for You created all things, and by Your will they exist, and were created' (**Revelation 4:11**).

- Praise God as the Lord of history who is working out His plan according to His perfect will.
- Praise the Lord that He is the God of revival, who revives His people in answer to their prayers in His perfect timing.

Heart searching. "Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me and know my thoughts; and see if there are any wicked ways in me, and lead me in the way everlasting" (Psalm 139:23-24). Do not try to search your own heart. Just pray honestly and expect God to search you and convict you as needed.

• Pray for yourself seeking a right attitude toward God, others, and our nation.

Confession. As you think about your life in the light of God's way, you may already know something you need to confess or may discern that the Holy Spirit has brought conviction regarding specific sins or failures to confront. Some common items to confess might be as follows:

- Let us confess that we tend to be self-reliant and fail to trust God totally;
- Let us confess that our commitment to follow God's way and to do His work is often halfhearted;

• Let us confess indifference and failure to pray regularly for our national and local government.

Accept His forgiveness. Confession brings forgiveness and cleansing (1 John 1:9) but we must be willing to receive the forgiveness. Take a moment to reflect on His forgiveness, thank Him, and receive this wonderful gift. You are now on praying ground.

Thanksgiving. Thank God for the privilege to worship Him freely in our country today following the dictates of our own hearts and consciences.

Pray for Christians—"His people called by His name"

- 1. That Christians may become sensitive to sin and freely confess and forsake all unright-eousness (**Proverbs 28:13**);
- 2. That God's children may repent and return to loving God with all their hearts (**Matthew 22:37-39**, **Revelation 2:1-7**);
- 3. That Christians may humble themselves and forsake the spirit of pride (2 Chronicles 7:14; I Peter 5:5-8):
- 4. That the spirit of prayer and humble repentance might be poured out upon all Christians:
- 5. That a mighty spiritual awakening will sweep through the entire Christian community regardless of denominational affiliation;
- 6. That Christians may be cleansed and live in holiness:
- 7. That His church will repent and be restored to wholly following the Lord in renewed love and devotion to Him, to fellow believers, to our neighbors, and to all people;
- 8. That the revived church may renew its efforts to fulfill the Great Commission with fresh vigor.

Pray for Christian families

1. That they will realize afresh the power of God's grace for reconciliation, as needed, resulting in harmonious living producing a sense of security and love to maximize growth and development;

- 2. That entire families may learn to find agreement with Christ in patient, united prayer (Matthew 18:15-20);
- 3. That Christian parents may learn to pray like Noah, whose intercession saved his entire family from perishing with a godless society in the flood.

Pray for our nation

- 1. Pray that Christians will be inspired by the Holy Spirit to join in prayer for our nation on a daily basis;
- 2. Admit to God that we need His mercy and divine intervention on our behalf as a nation;
- 3. Ask God to restore righteousness and wisdom to those who govern (2 Samuel 23:3-

4, Proverbs 29:2, and Daniel 2:20-22);

- 4. Pray for the President, Vice-President, members of the Supreme Court, U. S. Senators, your Congressman, state senators, state representatives that they may come to know God and perform their duties with honor to ensure we have good government that can be blessed by God;
- 5. Pray that the influence of Christian political leaders will be felt in a positive and strong fashion:
- 6. Pray for the families of the Christian political leaders who are under attack with very direct pressure to compromise their biblically based convictions and standards:
- 7. Pray for the salvation of government leaders;
- 8. Pray that the Bible study and prayer groups in our national and state capitols will continue to be a light and an inspiration to those who participate and that their co-workers will be blessed by the overflow coming from the groups.

Pray for your church

- 1. Ask God to reveal what part your church is to take in the working out of His divine purpose for our nation;
- 2. Pray for your pastor/leadership that they may provide needed guidance to the congregation;
- 3. Pray that the members of your congregation will be knitted together in love and become a mighty force to stand for righteousness in the nation starting locally.

Actions to take

Offer yourself to God for any part He may assign to you in His plan to restore the United States to the moral ground set forth in the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution in the light of **Proverbs 29:18**; Matthew 6:10.

Contact your governmental leaders and your local media. Write personal letters to the president, members of Congress, members of the state legislature. Tell them that you are praying for them. Let them know your specific concerns. Remember the following points as you compose your message:

- Use words that are gracious and Christlike;
- State specifically what you are concerned about; Pastor Jack (see **p 12**) suggested to say plainly: "This really breaks my heart. I'm afraid of the consequences for my family and my nation."
- State what you want done about it;
- Explain why you want something done now and how it affects you and your family right now.
- Keep the message as concise and brief as possible, preferably on one page.

A Chronicles Commission

Doorkeeper Suzy Kauffmann (Mrs. Howard), Atlanta, suggested that it is time for Christians who know the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) to commit themselves first to a Chronicles Commission (2 Chronicles 7:14). I agree wholeheartedly. Until the requisites of this text are met, we are unlikely to fulfill the Great Commission. She asked, "Do you think we, as Christians, are commissioned by God to obey the passage if we want our land healed?" Yes, I do think that and see the value to calling each Doorkeeper to accept the Chronicles Commission. It is high time to awake and to act!

Spirit indwelling

For many believers, the concept that comes to mind when they heard the expression "Spiritfilled" is getting more of the Holy Spirit. That is wrong because the moment that you get saved, you have all the Holy Spirit that you are ever going to receive. God does not give His gift in increments. The moment that you come to Christ, you are indwelt by the Holy Spirit. The new life that you have is the presence of the Holy Spirit. The will of God for every believer is laid out in **Ephesians 5:18**. We are to be "Spirit-filled." The analogy that is used to explain the meaning of this expression is a drunk person. Why? When a person gets drunk, his talk changes and his walk changes because he is under the control of the drink that is in him. To be Spirit-filled is to be Spiritcontrolled.

The great significance of Pentecost is that each believer is now indwelt by the Holy Spirit. "Now if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he is not His" (Romans 8:9). "Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" (1 Corinthians 3:16). The third person of the Godhead dwells within us. Think of the possibilities! Think of the responsibilities!

The following did not happen to me, but it really did happen to a pastor. This man was the pastor of a congregation in a small town, some distance from a large city. One Tuesday morning, he drove to the city to make purchases. When he got to the checkout counter with his basket and reached in his hip pocket to pay for his purchases, he discovered to his chagrin that his billfold was not there. We can imagine his embarrassment! He concluded that it was still in the suit that he had worn the evening before. There was nothing that he could do but to go home empty-handed. He could not even buy a cup of coffee. His credit cards were also in that billfold. He drove home very carefully and five miles an hour slower than his usual speed because his driver's license was in the absent billfold.

Arriving home, the pastor went straight to the bedroom to get his billfold. But, when he dug into the pockets of other trousers, it was not there. It was not to be found anywhere in the other suit. Fear struck his heart. Had he lost the billfold? Almost automatically he searched every pocket of the suit he was wearing and there, in his right coat pocket was the billfold. He had it with him all the time and could have made all the planned purchases. He had been helpless, poor and embarrassed because he did not know what he had with him.

Is it not true of many believers who are powerless and joyless in their Christian lives? And all the time the Holy Spirit, the source of all spiritual victory, joy and blessing, is dwelling within, waiting to be trusted with our lives. Jesus promised" "Ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Spirit is come upon you." The "power" was sufficient to change a scared, hiding Peter into a fearless dynamo for Christ.

Receive Him

"He came to His own, and His own did not receive Him, but as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name" (John 1:11-12).

Most Americans do not know the meaning of the Cross, the purpose of the Blood of Jesus. They do not understand that He bore the sinner's sins in the blackest and most savage death that even God Almighty ever saw. Multitudes of people do not know that as Christ sank down into the dark whirlpools of death He took their sins with Him and paid for those sins in agony, once for all. They do not know the importance of His resurrection from the dead. They do not know that a sinner may be saved simply by being willing to turn from his sin of unbelief and placing his faith in the finished work of Christ.

There are some who do know the story of the Lord Jesus Christ, but have never accepted Him as personal Savior and Lord. To be saved, faith must be exercised by any individual for himself.

Many years ago the church where John D. Rockefeller, Sr. was a member had a great preacher on given Sunday. After the service Mr. Rockefeller thanked the preacher for his sermon. In addition to an honorarium from the church, Mr. Rockefeller gave him his personal check for \$100. The preacher was delighted to receive it, not so much for the money, but because it was a personal check from one who at that time was the wealthiest man in the world.

The next morning, the preacher presented it to the teller of the bank. The teller looked at it, and returned it to the preacher. Thinking something was wrong he became excited, "What is the matter?" asked the preacher. "This is the right bank! It is made out to me! The signature is not forged! He gave the check to me himself! Surely his signature is good for \$100."

The teller smiled and said, "Yes, this is the right bank. I am sure you are the one to whom the check is written, and I know the signature is genuine. It would be good on this bank, not for \$100, but for \$1,000,000. There is nothing wrong except that you forgot to endorse it. You must turn it over and write your name on the other side!"

You see, the preacher's endorsement made the check personal. In effect, it was his way of expressing his faith in the bank, in the one signing the check, and his faith that by so doing he would receive the amount for which the check was written. Without his endorsement, it was simply an evidence that the signer wanted him to receive the amount for which the check called. With his endorsement, it guaranteed that he would receive that amount.

God in Christ has made out a check for you that entitles you to receive eternal life. It is drawn upon the bank of God's grace, love, and mercy, and signed in the blood of His Son, Jesus Christ. It is God's invitation that you should receive that for which the check calls. In order to receive it, you must endorse it, and your endorsement is your personal faith in Jesus Christ. Your faith is the channel through which God's saving grace flows into your life. "Behold, now is the accepted time; now is the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6;2). Why not receive Him now?

Back in 1822 **Caesar Malan** was visiting at the home of a friend in Brighton, England. One evening he said to the daughter of the host, "I wish you were a Christian, Charlotte." What he had said disturbed her, however, and the next day she told him she would like to be converted but didn't know how. He explained the way of salvation but noticed that she was determined to "clean up her life" and do what she could do to first "establish her own righteousness" (**Romans 10:2**).

Finally Mr. Malan said, "Charlotte, Charlotte, you must give yourself to the Savior **just as you are!**" "What? You certainly don't mean that God will accept me without any works of my own, do you?" "I mean just that," was the reply. Nothing more was said then, but shortly afterward **Charlotte Eliot** called upon the name of the Lord and was saved. To describe how it all happened, she wrote her famous hymn, "Just as I am, without one plea, but that Thy blood was shed for me, and that Thou bidd'st me come to Thee, O Lamb of God, I come! I come."

If you are reading this and want to be saved, you must come to Jesus **just as you are** and ask Him to wash your sins away. He never refuses such a request when it is made by a pentinent, seeking soul" "For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved" (**Romans 10:13**).

"Just as I am, Thou wilt receive, Wilt welcome, pardon, cleanse, relieve; Because Thy promise I believe O Lamb of God, I come! I come!"

"Just as I Am" has been used as an invitational hymn with multiplied thousands coming to Christ. One wonders why it does not continue to be used when it is obviously one of the most effective hymns of invitation following a Biblical message.

Sometime ago, I received a report from Voice of the Martyrs (VOM). Included in the mailing, was a sheet entitled *Vote!* that I want to share with you for your consideration.

We are told only one in five evangelicals votes. Why should we care? After all many of us still have our retirement accounts and medical benefits, and some think we may be "raptured" before things get too bad.

But we at VOM have a different attitude. We serve Christians who live in nations where they do not have the privilege to choose their national leaders or have a say in moral, economic, or security issues. Under Islamic law, women are treated as second-class citizens.

In Sudan, Christians have fought a 21-year civil war for the right to choose their own form of law. Two million people have died. Imagine how their lives may have been spared and their suffering minimized if their fight against Islamic Law could have been waged at the ballot box rather than the battlefield.

Here in the United States, God has granted us the privilege to choose our leaders. What better way to honor that gift than by exercising the right our brothers and sisters in Muslim and communist nations are denied? When we visit persecuted believers around the world, they often tells us they appreciate the United States of America—a nation that stands for freedom, one that brings them hope and encouragement. They thank God for our example. What example are you willing to be for them?

Many of us are concerned about abortion, gay marriage and the destruction of Christian values. But what are we willing to do about it? If Christians in the nations we serve (who have no vote) can go on motorbikes down muddy trails, hide in caves and work in brick slave labor camps for introducing the righteousness of a holy Christ into their society, surely we can get in our car and drive 10 minutes to mark a sheet of paper.

The world was surprised when Indian voters chose Sonya Gandhi's Congress Party over the

ruling BJP. The so-called "untouch-ables," the lower caste Dalits—many of them Christians, made the difference. The Congress Party immediately took steps to reverse legislation that institutionalized discrimination and encouraged persecution against non-Hindu minorities. Chrsitian voters affected change in India. We can do the same right here in the U.S.

Perhaps Christian radio personality Michael Del Giorno says it best. He writes, "'We, the People' are the only true enemy of an America that is a clear and present danger to our way of life." We at VOM urge you to go and vote.

A pastor's exhortation

On Sunday, November 23, 2003, our home church pastor, Jack Barrett (Forest Baptist Church, Forest VA) spoke on the crisis facing America using Romans 1:18-32 as his text. Using a decision by the Massachusetts' Supreme Court mandate to that Commonwealth's legislative body accommodate gay marriages within the next six months. He noted that a moral vacuum has been created and that Christians have sat on the sidelines with the attitude that we don't want to be judgmental. He pointed out that many of our prevailing attitudes simply do not square with the Word of God. Speaking from Romans

- 1, Pastor Jack encouraged His flock to respond in four ways:
- 1. With common sense (vv 26-27). Many of the actions being taken in America are unnatural in the light of Genesis 1:27-28.
- 2. With genuine concern (vv 26-32). There are consequences to sin as is illustrated by David's agony described in Psalm 51 and Psalm 32. We need to be concerned for people who are blind and have gone astray. Jesus is our model. We need to reach out with love to bring sinners to a saving knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ remembering Jesus died for sinners. We cannot put our heads in the sand. Otherwise, we are approving those who practice ungodliness and are headed for eternal death.
- 3. With compassion. We must love sinners into the kingdom of God. Lifestyles change when one becomes a Christian and begins to walk with God. This is our hope.
- 4. As a community, we must get engaged and involved. It is time to use our voice in our society and with our elected officials.

The crisis has intensified each year since his message. Both California and Connecticut have approved same-sex marriages. What can Christians do to make a difference? What can you do? We must pray for spiritual renewal in America; then we must put legs to our prayers and be willing to take steps that will make a difference. The Word of God provides the CONTINUED ON PAGE ELEVEN
