## THANKSGIVING: IT IS TIME

The year was 1978. Two years earlier, the Holy Spirit impressed upon me the need to turn to the Bible for my personal spiritual food, a step beyond going there for a message to preach. The latter had been my modus operandi since my first sermon prepared in September 1953. Then, twenty-five years later, my goal was to know God more intimately through reading devotionally. Gradually, my eyes were opened to life-changing truths that had been there all along.

Among the striking corrections from my Bible reading was one related to the Holy Spirit. My understanding was that Spirit-filled meant having more of the Holy Spirit. After all my perception of more was quantity (e.g., more water, then the glass was filled). Fact: the moment that a person believes in the Lord and places his faith in Him and His work on the cross. he/ she is indwelt by the Holy Spirit. His bresence is the new life that constitutes a new birth spiritually. At that moment the believer receives all the Holy Spirit He is ever going to receive. A great moment for me was to understand that Spirit-filled actually should be interpreted as Spirit-controlled (e.g., the drunk man controlled by the drink that is in him as revealed in **Ephesians 5:18**). To so live became an intense desire.i

The disciplines of the Christian life became important to me as my understanding developed. Not only was the Word of God important, another example was my view of prayer. Since I was a local church pastor as well as a full-time educator, I realized that it was the custom to pray before preaching. Through the Word of God, I soon saw the need to make a correction. My praying was basically telling God what to do

#### STILL IN EFFECT

God is still seeking:

"So I sought for a man among them who would make a wall and stand in the gap before Me, on behalf of the land that I should not destroy it ... "(Ezekiel 22:30a).



## BUT ONE DAY He will cease seeking:

"...but I found no one. Therefore, I [will] pour out my indig-nation on them; I [will consume] them with the fire of My wrath and [will recompense their deeds on their own heads]" says the Lord God (Ezekiel 22:30b,c).




#### BALD EAGLE EYES

The eagle's ability to see detail at a distance is extraordinary. Its eyesight is 4-8 times sharper than a human's. The eyes are fixed in their sockets, so the eagle has to turn its whole head to look around. when to do, and how to do it (e.g., Father, I must preach at 8 o'clock. If you are not there, we are both in trouble). Much to my delight, I learned that prayer is not bringing God down to get in on what I was doing; prayer is coming into the very presence of the Father in the Throne Room in Heaven (Hebrews 4:16; 10:19). I was teaching the Pastor's Class in Sunday School at Pleasant View Baptist Church, Lynchburg, Virginia at that time for new believers as well as others wishing to be in the class. I taught them what the Holy Spirit was teaching me. I could hardly wait for a new day to arrive since the first hours each day was my time to be in the Word and in prayer.

The initial motivation for writing lessons on prayer was to prepare 168 prayer warriors for a prayer chapel ministry to undergird the ministry of a local church, Immanuel Baptist Church, Newport News, Virginia. The plan was quite simple. We were to build a prayer chapel back in the woods behind the church building and have someone praying in the chapel every hour around the clock, a 24/7 ministry. A framework began to appear for the preparation: (1) What is Prayer?; (2) Bible Examples of Prayer; (3) Praying in the Name of Jesus; (4) The Holy Spirit and Prayer; (5) The Sin of Prayerlessness; (6) Getting Ready to Pray; (7) Personal Praying; and (8) Hindrances to Prayer. Each week, I wrote a lesson and then taught it during the Church Training Hour (one hour before the Sunday evening worship service). The Holy Spirit worked mightily in all of us as we studied and learned; we saw much fruit with many saved and many lives transformed. We were ready!

Fast forward to September 1980 when I was invited to lead a prayer conference at Madison Baptist Church, Madison, New Jersey. When our pastor, Jim Hooten, extended an invitation to lead an area-wide prayer conference, I agreed, knowing that I had the mimeograph stencils from the earlier studies. The compilation led to a seventy-nine page Prayer Seminar Workbook. The prayer seminar itself required six hours of teaching time. This document became the basic teaching tool for the next twenty-five years. A decision was made in 2004 to adapt the twenty-nine page international prayer seminar workbook for the primary workbook for all seminars, both national and international.

Following is the front cover of the



thirty-page English workbook.:
Each participant in the prayer seminar is provided a workbook. Although there is no charge for a workbook, a suggested contribution to assist in printing is \$5.

Although the elements of prayer are first introduced in Session One, the elements are fleshed out in

Session Seven, a study that deals with one's personal praying. Basically, I begin with another reminder of the IMPORTANCE OF PRAYER in one's life and in the work of the Lord (e.g., You have not because you ask not James 4:2b). This is followed with SOME BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES (and there are two fleshed out: 1. ESTABLISH A TIME TO MEET THE LORD (e.g., Set an appointment. Keep the appointment. Early morning praying. 2. ESTABLISH A PLACE TO MEET THE LORD. Then there is a suggestion to use an acronym. A-C-T-S, to organize a daily prayer strategy to cover the five elements of prayer: A-doration, C-onfession, T-hanksgiving, **5** eeking for self (petition) and S-eeking for others (intercession).

I continue thankful for God choosing to entrust the prayer seminar ministry to Sue and me. I am thankful that He has called Adam Nathanson to continue this ministry. I don't have the words to express the joy that I have had to share this material for the past forty years. It is so much a part of my life that I have sometimes awakened realizing that I had been teaching the prayer seminar in my dreams. Many years ago, Sue said that if, one day, someone came to tell her your husband is dead that she is going to ask, Where is his body? She said that she would say to me, You better get up from there and start packing those boxes. You have a prayer seminar!. She then said, If he does not immediately get up then she would know that I had got out and gone!

Since November is Thanksgiving Day in America, it has been a tradition to amplify Biblical teaching on thanksgiving each year. If you are

thinkful, you will be thankful. While I will deal with the element itself, please remember that <u>praying</u> is a ministry to pursue, in the same category as <u>preaching</u>, <u>teaching</u>, <u>witnessing</u>. In fact, <u>praying</u> is the work that must come before all other work.

## Abraham Lincoln, 1863 Thanksgiving Proclamation

It is the duty of nations as well as of men to own their dependence upon the overruling power of God; to confess their sins and transgressions in humble sorrow, yet with assured hope that genuine repentance will lead to mercy and pardon; and to recognize the sublime truth, announced in the Holy Scriptures and proven by all history, that those nations are blessed whose God is the Lord.

We know that by His divine law, nations, like individuals, are subjected to punishments and chastisements in this world. May we not justly fear that the awful calamity of civil war which now desolates the land may be a punishment inflicted upon us for our presumptuous sins, to the needful end of our national reformation as a whole people?

We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of heaven; we have been preserved these many years in peace and prosperity; we have grown in numbers, wealth, and power as no other nation has grown.

But we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us, and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God who made us.

It has seemed to me fit and proper that God should be solemnly, reverently, and gratefully acknowledged, as with one heart and one voice, by the whole American people. I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November as a day of Thanksgiving and praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens.

The Sovereign God has ordained prayer as a tool to get His work done. "Ordained" means "laid out ahead of time. God works only in concert with the praying of His people" (John Wesley). PRAYER IS THE WORK THAT MUST COME BEFORE ALL OTHER WORK.

One of the interesting pages in the PRAYER SEMINAR WORKBOOK is page nine in the Session One section. The overall thrust of this session, the first ten pages, is to survey a question, "What Is Prayer?" There is a multi-faceted answer. Other questions are posed for a serious disciple to ponder. An example is "Does God want His children to pray?" "Does God want me to pray?" "Does God want you to pray?" The Scriptures, which reveal God's point of view, are used to answer the questions.

Prayer touches three worlds, Heaven (page seven), Earth (page eight), and Hell (page nine). When you touch Heaven you focus on God and that is worship; when you touch Earth, your focus is on people and circumstances, and that is work; when you touch Hell, your focus is on Satan and that is warfare. A key thought related to SPIRITUAL WARFARE is given on page nine. "I will never win the war if I do not know where the battle is fought."

A key Scriptural passage on spiritual warfare is cited, **Ephesians** 

6:10-18. The foundation is laid in verse ten: "Be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might." Our strength is not enough; we must have His strength. God has provided armor to protect us from the wiles of Satan, but He does not put the armor on for us (vv 11-12). It is our responsibility to put the armor on. How can we put it on if we do not know what it is? Again, we are reminded that we need to immerse ourselves in the Word of God (Hear the Word, Read the Word, Study the Word, Memorize the Word, Meditate on the Word, Apply the Word.)

Where is the battle fought? PRAYER. The first activity mentioned after our armor is in place is prayer (verse eighteen). C. T. Studd said, "I want to build a workshop within a yard of [the gates of] hell." This pioneer missionary was not looking for a soft easy place where he would never have to risk his life. Fact. We need recruits who are ready to fight on their knees a hot fierce war against the very gates of hell. IT IS TIME FOR CHURCHES TO WAKE UP OR THE WAR IS LOST! PRAY AND VOTE! VOTE AND PRAY!

#### The Prayer Seminar

The pandemic months (beginning mid-March 2020) have been a factor in getting The Prayer Seminar up and running full force. If you have been following the transition in the leadership, you know that a decision has been made to use <u>The Prayer Seminar</u> as the identifying name. **JGHM** is pleased with this selection. Although Adam Nathanson will continue in his work as a missionary as circumstances allow, he has assumed responsibility for prayer seminars both in the United States, and in other nations as God opens doors.

Adam has used the months to establish the foundation for his new ministry. Groundwork has been laid for prayer seminars in Alabama, Florida, Missouri, Pennsylvania and Texas. Although we could focus on very significant undertakings such as his use of ZOOM teaching pastors/teachers, take a glimpse at The Prayer Seminar activated.

We pinpointed October 1 as a quasi-official launching of The Prayer Seminar. His venues have been in Maine, October 7-9, he ministered at Grace Bible in Gorham, Maine, Then on October 10, he conducted a prayer seminar at the Salvage Church in Rockland, Maine, Among the comments Adam shared about the launching on the prayer seminars was how the unction of the Holy Spirit rested upon the Word that was shared. There was deep conviction with a grown man" weeping before God, an event that deeply moved Adam.

The tenacles are many and far-reaching to many locations and the prospects are amazing.

# IN LOVING MEMORY DOORKEEPERS Willis James Snow

11/24/1901-9/16/1991 Carol Snow-Stewart (Mrs. Willis Snow) 2/24/1925-2/7/2019 Waterford. Connecticut

When word came from Carol early Monday, September 16, 1991, that her husband and our **Doorkeeper**, Willis James Snow, was hovering at the door of death, many thoughts came to my mind as I began to pray. At that point, no man had touched me more than Willis. I quickly asked God to release him from his earthly tent if indeed his work on earth was finished and God was ready for him, and to strengthen Carol every needed way.

I fell in love with this couple at our first encournter and began to delight in what Willis had to offer. It was the first week in August 1983 at Rumney Bible Conference in New Hampshire where I had gone to conduct a prayer seminar for Conservative Baptists during their special week. My first memory was joining Willis and Carol in the dining hall. We talked about many things--including their son Mark who had enrolled at Northeastern Bible College during my tenure as president. We laughed together because there was no alternative as Willis began to stir our minds with some of the most humerous anecdotes I had ever heard. Before the meal was over. I knew that I was securely imbedded in the hearts of this dear couple; I knew they would forever be in my heart.

Willis' strong commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ and getting His Gospel around the world, along with



His confident faith, were established points from the very beginning. During one free period, Willis and Carol asked if I would enjoy seeing some of the beautiful scenry surrounding Rumney. I did. Among the places visited was the early house of the founder of the Christian Science Church, Mary Baker Glover Eddy. What fun that trek was!

For the next few years, Willis ministered to me through correspondence. What an amazing intellect! What a tremendous facility to put thoughts into words. In all my work in higher education with many students sitting in my classes and many well-educated faculy members/administrators, none came near Willis. He was a literary genuis, a superb communicator.

I never returned from a trip to other nations when there was not a letter awaiting me from Willis. Here is an example: "Great is the Lord and greatly to be praised. We praise Him for blessing your efforts in Nigeria and granting you a wonderfully bountiful harvest. Your efforts were rewarded with the ripple effect of your conscientious and loving labor, like an eddy in a quiescent mill pond, will, without doubt, spread outward


together." Yes, we're walking through Heaven together—my Savior and I.
