For many years, Kathie Connolly has been one of our strong encouragers and one who has provided prayer covering for each step we have made in carrying out God's mandate



During our time in the 1960s-early 70s, working with Kerby Knob Baptist Church in Jackson County, Kentucky, one of Lexington's leading newspapers, The Lexington Herald-Leader, wanted to do a feature story for a Sunday newspaper on our work. Of course, we were flattered but felt that this would be a means to point readers, including many of our colleagues/ students at Eastern Kentucky University and Sue's friends at the Blue Grass Army Depot where she and her friend Lillian Robinson manned the Medical Clinic to the Lord Jesus Christ. The staff member assigned to write the article asked for back issues of the Reflector and Sunday bulletins. She was well prepared for the interview. Each guestion was a challenge for me to flesh out the comments in such a way that Christ would be glorified and the Father's name hallowed. The Holy Spirit helped me. The article is included on pages ten and eleven. The headline on the front page of the Sunday feature section was

A Church

For over 1,400 Sundays I had the privilege to be called "pastor" of several Southern Baptist churches and poured my life into those local assemblies. Those were wonderful days as God poured out His blessings with many souls saved. One of the most memorable days in my Book of Memories is the first Sunday living in New Jersey (1980) with a college to serve, but not a local church. Sue often said that our churches had me spoiled! True! Quite frankly. liquid love flowed freely between pastor and people.

In this issue, Sue and I are now celebrating the anniversary of our first year at Beulah Baptist Church. We believe God led us to Beulah. We feel at home in Beulah.

As I thought about all the churches in Lynchburg and its environs, a question arose in my mind. Is it important what church you attend with your family? The answer is yes. It could be the difference in heaven or hell. Does the church preach the Gospel? Does the church magnify the Lord (or self) in her singing? Is there a meaningful invitation period inviting decisions for salvation and church membership? Read carefully the article on page twelve. Avoid membership in a church that does not invite people to come to Jesus in its services! This is a warning! One of our Doorkeepers asked, "Why did I have to wait until I was 50 to hear the Gospel when I attended church from my early childhood?" Do you see?

'Full-Time Busy' Describes Dr. Henry, a REACHING, TEACHING, PREACHING MAN.

A preaching man. The blessings God's grace was pouring over our church were highlighted. The church was organized in 1887 and had featured Sunday school on every Sunday except bad-weather ones and preaching once a month. The reality was that no one had been saved since the 1940s when a man was murdered in the churchyard. A leading preacher told the people to write "Ichabod" over the door because "the glory had departed." My first preaching service was on a Saturday night with twenty-nine in attendance—actually twenty-nine plus One—the Holy Spirit. The gospel was preached and a leading citizen in the area, Bob Williams, heard the simple gospel and trusted Christ as his Savior! The next few years saw many come to Christ following their Lord in baptism and church membership. The building, constructed from hand-split yellow poplar logs, was one room. There was a potbelly stove for heat. It was not long until we needed to expand and added an educational/fellowship hall. Now the church meets in a \$500,000 building!

A teaching man. Not only was the "educated preacher" at Kerby Knob featured in the article as a preaching man, he was an educator. From his position as the principal of the Berea City Schools, he moved to Eastern Kentucky University to teach human development, and soon became the director of Model Laboratory School, a department in the School of Education.

Every home in the area received a visit with attention to presenting


the Gospel. Many began to attend the "meetings" at Kerby Knob. The Sunday school grew. Church services were never cancelled regardless of how much snow. Soon attention was placed on the muddy roads. With the encouragement of Lady Bird Johnson, we were able to see roads blacktopped. You should see the Kerby Knob area now! Beautiful houses (estates?) grace the hilltops.

Now the years have come and gone. Our REACHING, TEACHING, PREACHING has reached around the world. Thousands upon thousands have come to Christ. Many more have their own copy of the Prayer Seminar Workbook in their own language. Lighthouses of Prayer are now pushing against the spiritual darkness that prevails throughout the world.

Fast forward to 2017.

On October 2, Sue and I will celebrate our first year as members of Beulah Baptist Church, 528 Leesville Road, in Lynchburg, Virginia. The people welcomed us with open arms and we felt quite at home the first visit. You should hear the Beulah choir sing and the special music accompanied by organ and piano under the leadership of Steve Trost. Both Jo Anne Dudley at the organ and Robin Trost at the piano have touches that bring us before Heaven's Throne where the Father sits with Jesus seated at His right hand. When the congregation sings the hymns, one is reminded of the great celestial choir that is now forming and will one day perform in our eternal home.

Sue and I are members of Bill Hogan's Sunday school class and profit

immensely from his anointed teaching. At eighty-eight, he has developed teaching skills and techniques that are those of a master teacher enabling him to "unpack" God's Truths using the Word to Explain the Word—the very best kind of teaching. With Bible in hand, he opens his mouth and the Word of God comes forth. His smile. reinforced by his twinkling eyes, engulfs his students motivating them to become completely absorbed in the teaching-learning process. Quickly, each recalls truths learned previously and that now become the foundation for further learning adding new insights. We are challenged to move to higher ground in our thinking and in our living. We go away from Bill's class pledging in our hearts to let our lives count for Jesus until the day He calls us Home.

Now, I want to tell you about our pastor. The header in the Lexington Herald-Leader so long ago, certainly fits our pastor. Dr. Dennis Hollandsworth, is a REACHING, TEACHING, AND PREACHING MAN. Anyone who has heard one sermon from this man of God or has

sat under one of his Bible studies eagerly awaits his turn to come forward. From his first word until the last, the members of the congregation sit on the edges of their seats eager to receive the pure, unadulterated Word of God, the meat of the Word as well as the milk. The Holy Spirit brings the Word alive and it becomes the rhema that is talked about in Ephesians 6:17 and specified as the Sword of the Spirit both here and in Romans 10:17. As has been our custom for many years, I have called **Estelle Gabbard** on September 2nd to wish her a happy birthday; on September 30th, she reciprocated with a similar call. This year, on her 91st birthday, we talked about her statement a few years before, after Raymond made his exodus. When I asked, "Estelle, what are you doing?"— her answer was "I'm just waiting!" Both of us knew what she meant.

We always prayed together with thanksgiving for our salvation, for our blessings, and for our friendship. Thirteen days after our telephone call, Estelle's "waiting" days were over. So much transpired in those days. She began to have falls and was taken to a "safe" facility in nearby Lexington, Kentucky. She then fell again and shattered her pelvis. A decision was made to cancel a scheduled surgery and call in hospice. Her family gathered and last Sunday (September 10), she opened her eyes. A nephew expressed their love and her final words were "I'm so lucky to have a family." She lingered until 5:30 Friday morning, September 15, then was released for her special journey to Heaven to join that "great cloud of witnesses" where Raymond was waiting.

The photo on the front cover of the July **Reflecto**r tells a story of six decades of friendship. Now, Sue and I are "waiting!"

Sunday, Herald-Leader, Lexington, Kentucky, April 25, 1971 'Full-Time Busy' Describes Dr. Henry, A 'Reaching, Teaching, Preaching' Man

Kerby Knob, Ky. - Dr. J. G. Henry is a "reaching, teaching, preaching" man. Many might feel that serving either as the Director of the Model Laboratory School at Eastern Kentucky University in Richmond or as pastor would be a full-time job. Not so Dr. Henry. Constantly, he reaches out to find more ways to serve.

At the Model Laboratory School on the campus of Eastern Kentucky University, Dr. Henry works with 729 students from the nursery level (4 years of age) through the 12th grade. One second-grader recently observed, "Dr. Henry knows everybody and calls our names as he passes or talks to us in the cafeteria. He likes me and I like him."

This despite the fact that Dr. Henry believes in the students "conducting themselves as ladies and gentlemen" and does not hesitate to use the paddle board as a "means to an end" when necessary.

Dr. Henry is accustomed to honors in the field of education throughout his learning and teaching career. As a high school student he received the Danforth Reward, was graduated as salutatorian, was a member of honor societies and granted the Paul Reed Scholarship. He earned the Master of Arts degree at Eastern Kentucky University and a doctorate from the University of Kentucky. He is president of Eastern Kentucky University Education Association, a member of the Faculty Senate, Associate Professor of Educational Foundations, active with Little League and finds time to fish with his son.

And at the Kerby Knob Baptist Church on the highest cleared hill in Jackson County, Dr. Henry has been pastor since 1964.

After Dr. Henry's first 21 months of service, he took time to "reflect" on the moving of God during that time. The church had been established in 1887 and, prior to the calling of Dr. Henry as pastor, had "quarter-time" preaching services one Saturday night and one Sunday morning each month. He agreed to serve the church only if the church agreed to full-time services (two each Sunday and one mid-week) and to support missions on a monthly basis.

The church agreed to try. The results were 38 additions to the church, 26 by baptism, and the highest attendance on record—97—and an enrollment of 101. The church had begun giving 6 percent of its regular tithes and offerings to missions through the SBC Cooperative Program, and in addition gave for a children's home, the hospital charity fund, foreign missions, home missions and community mission work. The church building had been painted.

Subsequent years saw 77 additions to the church; an educational building added; a water supply; central heating and other building improvements. A \$1,250 piano for the sanctuary came in 1971 and was paid for in three months. "We have not had a pastorate that has failed to develop far beyond our expectations, said Dr. Henry. He is often called upon to preach revivals in other churches.

Yet this man claims little formal education as a theologian, although he began preaching as a pastor at the age of 17.

Dr. Henry's father had no formal education and could barely write his name. His mother completed the fourth grade. Although money was scarce, the seven Henry children were provided with food and clothing and encouraged to learn.

Dr. Henry's formal education began

at a White Pine, Tennessee, school, where he completed his primary and secondary studies. This was followed by a four-year, work-study program in Kentucky.

"I am proud to have been the recipient of an education at Berea College," Dr. Henry says. "My student labor experience was invaluable. One summer at the dairy, three school years and three summers working in the Office of Guidance and Testing, and one year working as "teacherin-charge" in a Foundation School dormitory."

He married Sue Troutman of Calhoun while he was a student at Berea. They have three children, Mona (12); Mark (11), and Melody (9). All are students at Model Laboratory School. Mrs. Henry is a registered nurse and is employed at Lexington-Bluegrass Army Depot.

Since becoming a Christian in 1948, Dr. Henry has served as pastor in Berea and in Richmond and in Ohio. While living in Ohio, he was the state approved Young People's Worker for the Ohio Baptist Convention. Dr. Henry has also served as a member of the Kentucky Baptist Convention's Executive Board and has served on the staff of the Cedarmore Baptist Assembly.

"My total life has been happy and profitable. I am deeply grateful for the opportunity of living in a country like the United States. My health has been perfect up to this point and God has blessed my life with many, many good things. My desire is to so live that I can please God and in some way endeavor to make this a better world in which we learn and live," he says.

It is difficult to say whether Dr. Henry is more a "full-time preacher" or a "full-time educator" but one thing can certainly be said of him - he is "full-time busy."

IT'S TIME TO INVITE PEOPLE TO COME TO JESUS

There was a lot of talk on the topic of evangelism during the Southern Baptist Convention's annual meeting in St. Louis. The sermons that were preached, the panel discussions that were presented, and our mission boards' reports all made reference to the 15-year decline in baptisms in our Southern Baptist churches.

Plenty of people are attempting to explain the decline. Some say it's because so many of our churches are not filing their annual report, thus skewing the numbers. Others say the decline is theologically based while others say it's methodological. One thing is for sure: It's time to get back to inviting people to come to Jesus.

When God said to Noah in Genesis 7:1, "Come into the ark, you and all your household, because I have seen that you are righteous before Me in this generation," God extended a public invitation to him. When Jesus encountered the rich young ruler in Matthew 19:21, He said, "... and come, follow Me." Jesus extended a public invitation to follow Him.

C. E. Autrey in his book, The Theology of Evangelism, wrote, "The primary purpose of the message of evangelism is to call men to a personal relationship with God." Autrey, a former SBC leader in evangelism, went on to say, "If the church quits calling on people to decide, then death is certain. The church must never turn from inviting men to an encounter with Christ. The people of God have no choice but to keep a strong emphasis on confronting the lost, privately and publicly, with the gospel and calling on them to decide."

Jesus tells us in Matthew 10:32

"Therefore, whoever confesses [acknowledges] Me before men, him I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven." That certainly describes what takes place during a public invitation.

As the apostle Peter wrapped up his sermon in Acts 2, we read in verse 37, "Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, 'Men and brethren, what shall we do?" Peter then told them to repent and be baptized, and we read in verse 41, "Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about 3,000 souls were added to them "

How did that happen without a public invitation? How are we to move forward in fulfilling the Great Commission without inviting the lost to Jesus? The God who initiates a relationship with us and then invites us into that relationship has commissioned us to become the inviters, as we invite the lost to Christ.

The invited are now the inviters! Regarding the public invitation: First, give it consistently. When your members bring a friend to worship, they should know that a public invitation will be given. Be consistent! Second, give it creatively. There are various ways to give a public invitation. Be creative! Third, give it clearly. Explain in simple terms what you're asking people to do. Be clear!!
