



THE PRIVILEGE OF PRAYER Our ACCESS to God Do You Know that You Are Saved?

Roger Babson, a renown statistician, said, "The greatest undeveloped resource in the world is faith; and the greatest unused power is prayer. The most neglected part of our Christian lives is prayer." If we are to become the people God wants us to be, we must spend time in His Word and prayer.

Once you become a Christian, you have the privilege of prayer. In fact, believers are to order their lives around prayer. From the moment of salvation our marching orders include "Everything by Prayer." Our privilege in coming to God is not dependent on our goodness. We can't earn salvation; we don't deserve it. A personal relationship with Jesus Christ gives us our only way of access into God's presence. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life; no man comes unto the Father, but by Me" (John 14:6). Our access to the Father is His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. It is only through His blood that we have access to the holiest (Hebrews 10:19).

Most of my remarks, written or spoken, are for believers (usually called Christians), not unbelievers. A continuing concern is that lost (unsaved) people will be present who will receive my teaching as truth to incorporate into their lives. That will not work even if he perfects a ritual that embraces everything taught. The same is true of many other truths given in the Bible. For example, the healing of a nation is in the hands of believers (My people, called by My name) who follow God's prescription as provided in 2 Chronicles 7:14.





Further, believers must be on praying ground to have an effective prayer life. The word is plain in **Psalm 66:18** that when we know iniquity is in our hearts and we do not deal with it that our prayers will be hindered; God will not hear our prayers. First, be sure you are saved by following God's direction for salvation in the Scriptures; second, be sure known sins are confessed and forsaken.

Do you know that you're saved? Salvation is not from what you. It is what Jesus Christ did for you. You are saved by God's Grace through your faith. You must place your faith in the Lord Jesus Christ (His death, burial, and resurrection for our sins—the Good News of the Gospel). Jesus Christ died for our sins, was buried and rose again on the third day according to the Scriptures. Trust in the Blood Atonement of Jesus Christ (God the Son) (Romans 3:25). The Rapture is very near. Are you ready? As noted in the September Reflector God the Father wants to hear a sinner's prayer when an unbeliever becomes a believer.

You may have a question in your mind about your relationship with Jesus Christ. The Bible. our only source of authentic information on this subject, says, "But as many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name" (John 1:12). You may say, I have never received Christ personally into my life; or think Ι have I hope I have, but I am not sure. You can invite Him into your life right now and be sure you have this personal relationship.

The following is a suggested prayer you can pray:

Dear Lord Jesus,

Today I realize I need a personal Savior. I believe You are the Son of God; that You died on the cross for my sin and rose from the dead that I might have eternal life. I ask for forgiveness and cleansing for the past sins of my life.

I now invite You into my life. By faith, I receive You as my Savior and Lord and turn the control of my life over to You.

Thank You for the gift of eternal life which I have just now received making me a part of Your family. Help me to read the Bible and pray each day that I may know Your plan for my life.


This I pray in the name of Jesus.



No Habitual Sinning

First of all, John wrote: "Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin" (1 John 3:9), "Whosoever is born of God sins not" (5:18). A person who has been born again, or regenerated, does not habitually commit sin. He no longer sins with his heart and will and whole inclination. There was probably a time when he did not think about whether his actions were sinful or not, and he did not always feel grieved about doing evil. There was no quarrel between him and sin; they were friends. But the true Christian hates sin. flees from it, fights against it, considers it his greatest plague, resents the burden of its presence, mourns when he falls under its influence, and longs to be completely delivered from it. Sin so longer pleases him, nor is it even a matter of indifference to him: it has become a horrible thing which he hates. However he cannot eliminate its presence within him.

If he said that he had no sin, he would be lying (1 John 1:8). But he can say that he hates sin and that the great desire of his soul is not to

commit sin at all. He cannot prevent bad thoughts from entering his mind, or shortcomings, omissions, and defects from appearing in both his words and his actions. He knows that in many things we offend all (James 3:2). But he can truly say, in the sight of God, that these things cause him grief and sorrow and his whole nature does not consent to them. What would the apostle say about you? Are you born again?

Second, John wrote: "Whosoever believes that Jesus is the Christ is born of God" (1 John 5:1). A man who is born again, or regenerated, believes that Jesus Christ is the only Savior who can pardon his soul, that He is the divine person appointed by God the Father for this very purpose, and beside Him there is no Savior at all. In himself he sees nothing but unworthiness. But he has full confidence in Christ, and trusting in Him, he believes that his sins are all forgiven. He believes that, because he has accepted Christ's finished work and death on the cross, he is considered righteous in God's sight, and he may look forward to death and judgment without alarm.

Practicing Righteousness

Third, John wrote: "Every one that doeth righteousness is born of Him" (1 John 2:29). The man who is born again, or regenerated, is a holy man. He endeavors to live according to God's will, to do the things that please God and to avoid the things that God hates. He wishes to continually look to Christ as his example as well as his Savior and to prove himself to be Christ's friend by doing whatever He commands.

He knows he is not perfect. He is painfully aware of his indwelling corruption. He finds an evil principle within himself that is constantly warring against grace and trying to draw him away from God. But he does not consent to it, though he cannot prevent its presence.

Though he may sometimes feel so low that he questions whether or not he is a Christian at all, he will be able to say with John Newton, I am not what I ought to be, I am not what I want to be, I am not what I hope to be in another world; but still I am not what I once used to be, and by the grace of God I am what I am. What would the apostle say about you? Are you born again?

Loving Other Christians

Fourth, John wrote: "We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren" (1 John 5:1). A man who is born again has a special love for all true disciples of Christ. Like his Father in heaven, he loves all men with a great general love, but he has a special love for those who share his faith in Christ. Like his Lord and Savior, he loves the worst of the sinners and could weep over them; but he has a peculiar love for those who are believers. He is never so much at home as when he is in their company.

He feels they are all members of the same family. They are his fellow soldiers, fighting against the same enemy. They are his fellow travelers, journeying along the same road. He understands them, and they understand him. They may be very different from himself in many ways—in rank, in station and in wealth. But that does not matter.

They are his Father's sons and daughters and he cannot help loving them. What would the apostle say about you? Are you born again?

Overcoming the World

Fifth, John wrote: "Whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world" (1 John 5:4). A man who is born again does not use the world's opinion as his standard of right and wrong. He does not mind going against the world's ways, ideas and customs. What men think or say no longer concerns him. He overcomes the love of the world. He finds no pleasure in things which seem to bring happiness to most people. To him they seem foolish and unworthy of an immortal being.

He loves God's praise more than man's praise. He fears offending God more than offending man. It is unimportant to him whether he is blamed or praised; his first aim is to please God. What would the apostle say about you? Are you born again? Keeping Oneself Pure

Sixth, John wrote: "He that is begotten of God keepeth himself" (1 John 5:18). A man who is born again is careful of his own soul. He tries not only to avoid sin but also to avoid everything which may lead to it. He is careful about the company he keeps. He knows that evil communications corrupt the heart and that evil is more catching than good, just as disease is more infectious than health. He is careful about the use of his time; his chief desire is to spend it profitably.

He desires to live like a soldier in an enemy country—to wear his armor continually and be prepared for temptation. He is diligent to be a watchful, humble, prayerful man.

What would the apostle say about you? Are you born again?

The Test

These are the six great marks of a born-again Christian.

There is a vast difference in the depth and distinctness of these marks in different people. In some they are faint and hardly noticeable. In others they are bold, plain and unmistakable, so anyone may read them. Some of these marks are more visible than others in each individual. Seldom are all equally evident in any one person.

But still, after every allowance, here we find boldly painted six marks of being born of God.

How should we react to these things? We can logically come to only one conclusion—only those who are born again have these six characteristics, and those who do not have these marks are not born again. This seems to be the conclusion to which the apostle intended us to come. Do you have these characteristics? Are you born again?

The Lord brought Marie Herling into our lives and ministry when she joined our pilgrimage to Israel in 1983. She was a Doorkeeper partner in the prayer seminar ministry for many years. After her retirement as a nurse in San Diego, California, God used her mightily in short-term teaching ministries in Ukraine. She often wrote poems for our publications. This poem encapsulates the content of the prayer seminar beautifully—Throne Room Praying. God the Father is on His throne in Heaven (Revelation 4:1-2) with Jesus at His right hand, the place of honor and authority making intercession for us (Romans 8:34, Hebrews 7:25, Hebrews 9:24, 1 John 2:1). What is prayer? Prayer is coming to the Father, through the Son, in the power of the Holy Spirit, for ourselves (petition) and for others (intercession).

If you read Marie's poem carefully, you will understand clearly what Throne Room Praying is all about. You, too, can enter boldly (Hebrews 4:16) into the Throne Room through the blood of Jesus (Hebrews 10:19). You don't have to have prior appointment. God is always there. Since her death, we have missed Marie's frequent letters and notes in which she shared how God was using what she had learned in the prayer seminar in her own life and as a framework to share with others. One day we will meet again, along with scores of Doorkeepers. For those who have experienced a prayer seminar and those who wonder what a six-hour prayer seminar is all about, prayerfully give attention to Marie's poem which unfolds the effect of the prayer seminar ministry. Yes, we do need reminders. Yes, we, too, will profit from developing a practical, viable framework for our own praying.


