

The books I have written were intended to flesh out truths taught during a prayer seminar. There are eight of them. Over the years, our primary distribution has been from the book tables set up. Often someone has come asking which book I would recommend as the "starter" book? Since my long-time secretary and administrative assistant the late Sue Bell (1940-2010) felt that the most helpful book was Spiritual Warfare, I have often recommended that book. My own favorite book is The Upper Room Discourse.

However, I have changed my mind. From now on, the book I will recommend without equivocation will be A Christian's Necessary Food. Although I became a pastor at the age of seventeen, my life did not change until I got into the Word of God for my spiritual food (not just for a sermon to preach). The year was 1977 when I implemented the plan for spiritual growth that I developed in 1977. "I have cherished His Words more than my necessary food ..." (Job 23:10).


Here is the **PREFACE** for **A Christian's Necessary Food** that will provide my thoughts as I sent the book out initially:

"The greatest work that any of us can do for one another, whether young or old, is to teach the soul to draw its water from the wells of God."




BOOKS AVAILABLE

Our first ministry in Venezuela was in July 1992. This will be our eighth trip. Not only have thousands been taught the purpose and power of prayer, the results speak for themselves. participants are challenged to incorporate daily Bible reading as an integral part of their Quiet Time.

Dwight Moody observed that he had never known a useful Christian who ignored the Word of God. It is my firm belief that a believer will never become a prayer warrior apart from the Word of God.

My life changed dramatically in 1977 when I learned to get into the Word of God on a daily basis for my own food. Prior to that time since I began my pastoral ministry in 1953 I was only in the Bible to get a message to preach.

Since then, I have read the Bible through each year beginning in Genesis and ending in Revelation. By reading three chapters a day and five on Sunday, a believer can complete the reading in a year. I have learned to read with a pen or pencil in hand. There is value in underlining a word or a phrase and making notes in a new study Bible each year. Further, I have practiced making a page of notes out of my reading every day. Whereas, I spent years struggling each week to get a message to preach, I now have more to share than there is time to share it.

For several years, my prayer time has started with praise and worship based on my day's reading. As I see God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit revealed in the Scriptures, I praise God for who He is. My praise never becomes stale because the beauty of the Lord shines through.

My wish is that you will find the studies valuable in drawing your own water from the wells of God and that you will, in turn, encourage others to read the Bible for their food.

DON'T FORGET TO REMEMBER 9/11

The fabric of society is strained by moral decline and materialism. The very existence of such forces in society testifies to the superficiality of religion. No superficial religion can save a nation from disaster.

A case in point is Judah during the days of Isaiah. Through this prophet God pronounced a series of "woes" on Judah (Isaiah 5:8-30) that could easily fit America. A "woe" is an exclamation, a cry of grief, or anguish, that is typically associated with divine judgment.

Among the specific sins that are particularly grievous are these six issues: (1) a desire for wealth (Isaiah 5 8-10); (2) hedonistic living that shows no regard for the deeds of the Lord (vv 11-17); (3) scoffing at divine judgment (vv 18-19); (4) calling evil good and good evil (v 20); (5) relying on one's own counsel rather than revelation (v 21); and (6) failing to take governmental responsibility soberly (vv 22-23).

These six woes can be summed up

by noting that the sins condemned involve a reconstitution of society. Does that sound familiar?

A desire for wealth and personal pleasure is expressed in societal values to replace those revealed by God. The good traditional values are replaced by evil new values and scoffed at by those who are wise in their eyes. Even those who administer the nation's laws accept the new values in lieu of the traditional values.

STAND UP FOR AMERICA ON YOUR KNEES.

Adonai (Lord)

"[The LORD said to Moses,] 'So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt' Moses said to the LORD, 'O Lord [Adonai], I have never been eloquent, neither in the past nor since You have spoken to Your servant. I am slow of speech and tongue'" (Exodus 3:10; 4:10].

"Then I [Isaiah] heard the voice of the Lord [Adonai]. Saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I. Send me" (Isaiah 6:8).

Many of our prayers begin with the words "Dear Lord." Our conversation is often peppered with references to "the Lord." Calling God our Lord is easy. But truly acknowledging Him as our Lord our Adonai is a different matter. To do so means to live as His humble servant, to be ready and willing to obey His every command, and to hand all that is ours our time, abilities, thoughts, possessions, relationships over to Him.

God's name Adonai is translated by the English word Lord (not to be confused with the word LORD in all capital letters, meaning Jehovah). The word adonai is used throughout the Old Testament to refer not only to God, but to earthly masters as well. The term implies a relationship of complete authority and possession.

Look at the two Scripture passages printed above. In the first passage, God is summoning Moses to carry out a difficult task, and in the second, He is summoning Isaiah. Both Moses and Isaiah refer to God as Adonai, but only Isaiah really acknowledges Adonai's lordship. Moses makes excuses of why he can't serve his Master, but Isaiah responds in ready, willing obedience.

Are you a Moses or an Isaiah? Are you only calling God Adonai, or are you truly serving Him as your Lord and Master? As you ponder this question along with me, remember this: As our sovereign Lord, Adonai expects obedience from us. But as our perfectly good Master, He also provides for our every need.

"BEAUTIFUL LAND"

The book of Daniel is known as a book of prophecy. You don't have to be a "Bible scholar" to pick up relevant information to apply to the current situation in which we find ourselves. In Daniel 11, the "Beautiful Land" becomes a battleground. Will the United States of America, your land and my land, become a battlefield someday? As I write, our eyes are on the confusion that is prevailing in Ferguson, Missouri. The news announcement being televised today looks like a battleground. Don't forget the author of confusion is Satan himself.

In my lifetime, the moral boundaries of our society in America have been shrinking. Initially, the decline was minor, but now it is major. Sins once publicly decried are now portrayed as normal behavior. A relatively small number have insisted on the protection of "alternative lifestyles" in the name of tolerance and fairness. Media immorality is now wrapped in the mantle of free speech. How is it that Americans at large have been so gullible and have allowed a very few, under the guise of civil rights, to undermine the very foundations upon which we have rested? Those who stand up for traditional values and righteousness are accused of censorship.

A total of 2.3% of U. S. adults said that they are gay, lesbian, or bi-sexual. That number is lower than the 3% to 4% found in some other recent surveys but some of those studies encompassed broader groups, including trans-sexuals. In the new survey of 34,557 adults, released recently by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, an additional

1.1% said they are "something else," didn't know or refused to answer.

The Christians of America are the nation's last, best hope. If we are weak, the nation will be weak. If we are strong for the Lord, the nation will be strong. That is God's promise in Proverbs 14:34. Unless Christians take a stand, and unless our voice is heard, God will surely act against our country to "judge you according to your conduct and repay you for all your detestable practices" (Ezekiel 7:8). The Word of the LORD coming through Ezekiel is certainly applicable to any nation, including the United States, whose conduct is disgraceful.

THE ABILITY TO INFLUENCE THE WORLD

Mounting tensions and international turmoil yet you and I can make a difference. How? By praying for kings and those in authority (1 Timothy 2:1-2).

Just as we are not praying for laborers for the fields, which is the way Jesus indicated to get the harvest gathered (Matthew 9:35-38; Luke 10:2; John 4:35), we are not obeying the Word in praying for government leaders.

America, as do all nations, needs godly leaders. There is no better way to make a difference by praying for our leaders. After all, this is what the Word of God teaches




Sunrises and sunsets

OUR REFUGE AND STRENGTH —in troubled times, in peaceful times

God has provided a wonderful place positionally for every believer because he/she has been placed "in Christ." At the moment of salvation. the Holy Spirit comes to dwell in us; at the same time, He places us "into" the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:13). Our names are written into the Lamb's Book of Life. What a glorious thought! We are "new creatures" in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17). We are partaker of His divine nature. We share the perfect righteousness of Christ. We share His destiny. We share His heirship. We share His sonship. We share His election. We share His priesthood. Thus, we have a perfect position in Jesus Christ.

God has also provided a wonderful place experientially for us in while we live in this world. We can't have it by seeking for it or hustling around trying to earn it. It is a place of perfect peace, of joy, and inner happiness. It is our place of strength, stability, and power.

During this lifetime, we are assured of life with God forever eternal life. But we can also live victoriously in every situation and cope with every confrontation successfully as it arises. We never have to be defeated! This is a place that is provided by God's grace provisions.

Have you discovered God's place of mental rest and stability for your life? God is our refuge and strength, constructed by Bible doctrine and Bible promises in your mind. Stay in your refuge. How? By

constant thinking on the basis of what we know about God. Feed on His Word. Live prayerfully. Remember, the more we know about God and apply it in our lives, the stronger our refuge and strength.

The bottom line

To what extent should we Christians seek to influence the laws of our nation? Is the criticism that we try to impose our morality on others valid?

For many years, both Sue and I have started our day in the Word of God individually taking notes out of our reading. After our personal devotions, we have learned to take time to share our notes in a "family" prayer time. Following the Bible reading program provided in the Doorkeeper Prayer Calendar, we have recently spent time in the prophets, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, and now Ezekiel.

We were both blessed by the refreshing that came in Isaiah 32. The paragraph heading (a requisite for a study Bible since it helps get your brain in gear to profit from what you will read) in my Bible is simply "Joy will Follow Judgment. A righteous kingdom will arise." The Jews were living in hard times. As a nation they were isolated and surrounded by hostile nations. Spiritually, the nation was blind and without understanding. Great tribulation is described in vv 9-14. But **HOPE** is introduced beginning in verse 15 and following: "Until the Spirit is poured upon us from on high, and the wilderness becomes a fruitful field, and the fruitful field is counted as a forest. Then justice will dwell in the wilderness, and righteousness remain in the fruitful field. The work of righteousness will be peace, and the effect of righteousness, quietness, and assurance forever."

Isaiah 32 has two things to say to us. First, peace (social health and harmony) is an outgrowth of righteousness. Any society that allows wickedness to flourish will be torn by strife and injustice. In the end, no nation whose laws fail to control expressions of man's sinful nature will be able to protect its citizens. No wonder a "bornagain Christian" in America, deeply concerned with the trends of our society, feels an urgent need to return to laws and lifestyles that reflect biblical standards.

Second, a truly just and righteous society awaits the day when the "Spirit is poured upon us from on high" (Isaiah 32:15). Society is beyond redemption without a spiritual awakening. A spiritual awakening must start with individuals. It is individuals whom God's Spirit must change, and that happens from within. Let's not hesitate to keep praying for that spiritual awakening to come to society and work for righteous laws, but let's not forget that man's greatest need is for salvation.

A hymn that I learned in my early Christian life expresses my feeling as I enter into my 62^{nd} year of ministry and celebrate my 79^{th} birthday. "I Need the Prayers of Those I Love." **James David Vaughan** (1864-1941) wrote both the tune and lyrics. I particularly like the refrain: Refrain:

I want my friends to pray for me,
To hold me up on wings of love,
And intercede with God for me,
I need the prayers of those I love.
I need the prayers of those I love,
While traveling o'er life's rugged way,
That I may true and faithful be,
And live for Jesus every day.

I need the prayers of those I love,
To help me in each trying hour,
To bear my tempted soul to Him,
That He may keep me by His power."
I want my friends to pray for me
To hold me up on wings of faith,
That I may walk the narrow way,
Kept by our Father's glorious grace."

As I enter a new year of life and ministry, I ask you to continue to hold Sue and me up in prayer as Aaron and Hur held up the hands of Moses: Exodus 17:11-12 B. This will help us to walk the narrow way (Matthew 7:13-14). As we so walk, God's grace will be sufficient for us (2 Corinthians 12:9). I am excited about the plans we have made to carry us through September 30, 2016 when I celebrate my 81^{st} birthday as the Lord opens doors and provides.
