How are you getting along in your personal, regular daily time with God? Since January 1990, the purpose of the monthly studies shared in the Doorkeeper Reports (Waymarks, or Reflectors) has been to strengthen our Doorkeepers in their own prayer lives and in their spiritual walk. So often ministries accept the support of their partners without ministering to them. We do not want to operate that way. My desire is to encourage, not discourage; to build up, not tear down; to be a stepping stone, not a stumbling block.

We began with twelve studies on intercession. This was followed by twelve studies on adoration. The intention was to include material that would not only be inspirational and challenging, but useable as well. Often we tend to receive truth as mere information and not incorporate into our lives what the Word has revealed. My prayer has always been that our own partners will be strong prayer warriors and that our writing ministry would provide ongoing assistance to each Doorkeeper Both the twelve studies on intercession and the twelve studies on adoration became books: **Intercession: Prayer as Work** and Adoraton: Prayer as Worship, Across the nation, some have used the books in small group Bible studies or in Sunday school lessons for a quarter (three months study). not written a book on thanksgiving although there is plenty of material in the Word of God that could be the basis of a comprehensive treatment of the subject. The focus of this September study, as well as the studies in October and November, is thanksgiving, one of the five elements of prayer that should be included daily in our prayer time: A-doration, C-onfession, T-hanksgiving, S-eeking for self (petition) and S-eeking for others (intercession),

I often think, as I teach the element of **thanksgiving**, that it should be unnecessary to teach thanksgiving. We should all be thankful. But in the light of **Luke 17:17**, I have no choice but to remind my students of the importance of including thanksgiving in their daily prayers.

How much Jesus appreciates gratitude can be seen very clearly from the account of the ten lepers whom He restored to health (Luke 17:11-17). He had healed them by sending them to the priests to receive the certificate required by law to show that they had been cleansed of their leprosy. While they were on their way to the priests, they were suddenly cleansed, every one of them.

Nine of them continued on their way to receive their certificates. And in so doing they were in reality complying with Jesus' words, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." One of them, however, turned around, went back to Jesus, fell down on his face before the Lord, and returned thanks to Him joyfully speaking His praises. This act of overt thanksgiving by one who was a Samaritan elicited Jesus' probing question. "Were there

not ten cleansed, where are the nine? Were there none found that returned to give glory to God, save this stranger?" Does this mean that nine out of ten receive the blessings from the Lord and never express gratitude? That could very well be true. Perhaps we are like the hogs under the acorn trees over in East Tennessee where I grew up which eat the acorns, but never look up to see their source!

Thanksgiving defined. Here we have the definition of thanksgiving given by Jesus Himself. To give thanks means to give glory to God. Remember that we were created to give glory to God, now and forevermore. We can be sure that our own spirits will rejoice when we offer genuine thanksgiving because we will be in harmony with His purpose for our lives!

It is obvious that God both notices and is moved by our response. Jesus attached high value to the words "thank you." Each of us is either the one who gives thanks or one who does not. Either we appreciate His daily gifts, or take them for granted. Jesus is not made of stone. He is moved to happiness every time that He sees that we appreciate what He has done for us. Let's grip His nail-pierced hand and say to Him, "I thank You, Savior, because You died for me." Then, let's thank Him for all the other blessings He showers upon us daily.'

<u>Difference in praise and thanksgiving</u>. Although praise and thanksgiving are very closely akin to each other there is a difference in praise and thanksgiving. Both consist in giving

glory to God. Praise is seeking God's face for fellowship. It is praising God for who He is and what He is in Himself. Adoration is looking at God and loving Him. Thanksgiving, on the other hand, is expressing appreciation for what **God's hand** has provided. We give God the glory for what He has done for us. One of my favorite verses is Psalm 68:19 where we are told to praise the Lord who "daily loadeth us with benefits." "Daily" does not mean "every now and then;" "loadeth" means not a "little" but a "lot." His blessings come every day. Thanksgiving of this nature exalts God, gives Him credit, and takes our eyes off ourselves and focuses them on God. Thanksgiving is our response to the goodness of God who is the Source of "every good and perfect gift" (James 1:17). Thanksgiving will naturally express itself in praise. And praises will be called forth by the acts of merciful kindness for which we are giving thanks.

Biblically, thanksgiving means expressing gratitude to God, not for who He is, but for what He has done. Thankfulness is defined as gratitude for blessings. The importance and spiritual benefit in thanksgiving in our prayer lives cannot be overly emphasized. We have a tendency to spend too much time asking and too little time thanking. We should cultivate the attitude of gratitude. Ingratitude is one of our most serious shortcomings. He pours out blessings; we fail to say thanks. Thanksgiving is meaningful to the Lord when it is offered as a sacrifice as we call on the name of the Lord (Psalm 116:17) "Offer to God thanksgiving" **Psalm** 50:14). "Come before His presence with thanksgiving" (Psalm 5:2), We

are directed to "Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and His courts with praise " (Psalm 100:4). A lack of thanksgiving is an evidence that true worship is missing.

An expression of humility

The Bible reminds us that "God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble" (James 4:6). Humility means dependence on God, not ourselves. Thanksgiving is Godcentered, not self-centered. One evidence of humility is a thankful heart knowing that who we are and even hope to be comes from God. Humility particularly includes acknowledgment of our own inadequacy both physically and spiritually from the very first days of our lives. Whether we are aware of it or not, even the air we breathe comes from Him. It is a serious matter to fail to have a thankful heart. It was the sin of thanklessness that caused the people long ago to plunge into the sin of sexual depravity (Romans 1:21-22 LB).

We need to remember that we learn to pray according to God's will only as we learn His will and way in the Book in which it is revealed, the Bible. Through prayer we speak to Him, and also open our souls to let Him speak to us.

U. S. Military Bases


One of the special blessings that God has given me over the past thirtynine years is to share the prayer seminar and preach in chapel services on
military bases both here in the United States and bases in other nations.
The liquid love that flows from heart to heart has been incredible. Many
have been renewed and some have come to Christ. I have been treated as
royalty on the bases with a warm welcome and an invitation to lodge in VIP
lodging. In my initial remarks, I express my delight on being with our troops
and their families knowing that it is an opportunity to reach many states
from this one point.

The reception at Goodfellow Air Force Base (San Angelo, Texas) was encouraging and humbling since there was an opportunity to meet separately with the three ranking officers on the base. After considerable time, I expressed concern that I was taking up too much of their valuable time only to be assured that my presence in their midst was what they needed to motivate and challenge them to renewed service.

Many of you are aware of <u>an attack on the chaplaincy in our armed forces</u>. An insideous effort has been launched to silence voices of evangelical chaplains. One can easily document elements of the attacks emanating even from government and military officials. "Don't mention the name 'Jesus' in any military chapel or function." A brigade official ordered Army Chaplain Captain John Stertzbach to "modify" his prayers at the funeral of a slain sergeant to minimize use of the name "Jesus." On and on, we could go. "What shall we say to these things?" We must fervantly push against the spiritual darkness through our prayers and the groups that are behind these attacks. Pray for the ministry of chaplains in the chapels and with individuals and their families.

Keep in mind that "Righteousness exalts a nation; sin is a reproach to any people" (Proverbs 14:34). Many actions taken by our legislative and judicial bodies are those favoring acts that God calls "abominatdion" leading us farther and farther away from God's Word, His ways, His will. Pray against evil and the evil one. Pray for those who are seeking to defend our religious liberties as a free people. Stand up for the right and oppose the wrong. Remember that "the nation that forgets God will be turned into hell" (Psalm 9:17).

Anxiety

What does anxiety do? It does not empty tomorrow of its sorrow, but it empties today of its strength. It does not make you escape the pressure; it makes you unfit to cope with it when it comes. Does the Bible have the answer? Is it true that when you are at wits' end that God is able to "send His Word" and "heal you?" (Psalm 107:20) Is this possible? Yes, it is true and it is possible. "Be still," He says, "and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10). "Draw near to Me," He says, "and I will draw near to you" (James 4:8). "Come unto Me, all you who are heavy laden," He says, "and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28-30). Notice that we must take the initiative and make decisions.

Perhaps CHOOSE is the word for the day! God has given us the ability to make decisions. He did not make us a robot whereby He presses a button for us to prostrate ourselves and bow down before Him. He could have done that, but He made us in His own image and we have the power to choose.

Jim Moon (1934-2014) came into our lives when we moved to Lynchburg in April 1972 to assume our duties at Lynchburg Baptist College (now Liberty University). At that time he was music leader at Thomas Road Baptist Church as well as Associate Pastor, Jim was one of my favorite preachers. Sometimes I kidded Dr. Jerry Falwell (1933-2007), the founder of Thomas Road Church and the college, that Jim Moon could "out preach" him. He smiled and agreed! Jim sometimes spoke in the college chapel services. One day, he included a memorable instructive statement to the LBC students, faculty, and staff: "Don't let others determine your day!" He illustrated by sharing an experience he had with a careless driver on the way to the campus while he was listening on the car radio to one of my favorite radio speakers, Earl Nightingale (1921-1989), an inspirational speaker who mostly dealt with the subjects of human

character development, motivation, and meaningful existence. At the very moment the incident happened, Nightingale said: "Don't let others determine your day!" We all got the point and I have remembered this statement for over forty years and have determined to follow it!

From that college pastorate five were called into full-time ministry.

During my days as Vice President for Academic Affairs at Lynchburg/ Liberty Baptist College (now Liberty University), I baptized ninetynine in ten months at Shenandoah Valley Baptist Church, Winchester, Virginia. One of the baptismal services was outside in the coldest water I have ever experienced; on that day I baptized twenty-nine. I baptized many at Pleasant View Baptist Church, Lynchburg, Virginia. From time to time, the Reamers return from their home in Florida and visit Beulah Baptist Church, our home church in Lynchburg. It was my privilege to baptize Daphne Reamer (now living in Florida) at Pleasant View in the 1970s.

The last two years of pastoral ministry at the Immanuel Baptist Church, Newport News, Virginia, I baptized over 100 each year <u>WITH 24/7 PRAYER CHAPEL ACTIVE</u>.

2,000 in one day in Dubai is a reminder to us that throughout the world more are coming to Christ this day than any day in history. God is at work in in a world that is "white to harvest" and we are to pray for laborers. Each church needs to pray!

Since 1980, God has placed me primarily in a teaching ministry. Although many have come to Christ through the prayer seminar ministry, I think of Acts 28:31 as descriptive of the ministry that He has entrusted to me: "preaching the kingdom of God and teaching the things which pertain to the Lord Jesus Christ with all confidence ,,," My concern at this point is ENDING WELL. September is my month—the month of my physical birth (September 30, 1935), my spiritual birth (September 24, 1948), the month that I began my work as a pastor (September 1953), the month that I conducted the first prayer seminar outside my own pastorates (Madison Baptist Church, Madison NJ September 5-8, 1980) and the month we moved into our onsite office building in our back yard in Murfreesboro, Tennessee (1987)

Once it dawned on me how significant September has been in my life, I have used the month for celebration and for self-examination. My life as an educator and as a minister has been satisfying and fullfilling in every way. I have few regrets and would do few things differently. As I look back over my sixty-six years of ministry, I believe that the prayer seminar ministry surpasses all other ministry and work that I have done.

Although there have now been 1,738 prayer seminars throughout the world, I find myself more excited about the next seminar than I was the first! I have learned from experience to expect the Holy Spirit to move mightily using the Word of God to provide help needed in the lives of those who attend a seminar. I continue eager to share as often and as widely as possible the message that God has given me on the many

facets of the Christian life, majoring on the purpose and power of prayer.

As I look back across almost seven decades of ministry and service, it is with a deep sense of gratitude to the Lord for His faithfulness step by step." I am satisfied with Jesus, but the question comes to me, as I think of Calvary, Is my Master satisfied with me?" This has been the refrain that the Holy Spirit has brought to my mind and spirit over and over and over since I began to reflect on what to share in the September issue of the Reflector. You need to know the source of this refrain.

I remember it as though it happened yesterday—when I received word that B. B. McKinney, one of the heroes of my Christian faith, was severely injured in an automobile accident across the mountains in Bryson City, North Carolina. I grieved a few days later when I heard that he died on September 7, 1952. Songs written by B. B. McKinney are included in the Broadman Hymnal, the hymn book he edited used in my church and in most Southern Baptist churches, strengthened and challenged my walk with Christ. Among those songs was "I am Satisfied with Jesus." written in 1926. After becoming a Christian, my life was drastically changed and I constantly have asked myself "Is my Master satisfied with me?"

I want my Lord to be satisfied with me, I want my life to be what He wants it to be. Both Sue and I want to finish well. THANKS FOR YOUR HELP!
