PERSPECTIVE

“Yet who knows whether you have come to the kingdom
for such a time as this?” Esther 4:14b



“For such a time as this” is an expression that encompasses the “here” and “now.” I remember vividly a conversation I had with a pastor friend during the days following my enlightenment about the value and joy of daily Bible study. I shared that I was thinking about making a number of changes in my life-style to free more time for the Word of God.

For many years, I had been an avid reader of the newspapers and three news periodicals, **Time**, **Newsweek**, and **U. S. News & World Report**.

My friend told me to trash that idea since any effective minister must keep abreast of current events—understanding the times in which he was living! I am glad I heeded his advice since I am sure that my ministry reflects the times. Instead, I found various time leaks in my schedule, corrected them, and had more time for the Word.

“For such a time as this”—what are the conditions of our time? Someone has pointed out **the church is powerless because it is prayerless**. Another said, **the supper room has supplanted the Upper Room**. There are few prayer meetings in the average church. Jesus pointed out that men must always pray and not faint (**Luke 18:1**). Most of us don’t think to pray until we do faint.

The result of the loss of power in the church and in the lives of individual Christians is rapid moral deterioration in the United States. What was proudly hailed as the “land of the free” can now be better characterized as the “land of the spree.” At a time when the material is so abundant, few believe there are any moral absolutes.

In the world, the population has surpassed eight billion. Not only are most unsaved, one can safely say that the vast majority—perhaps as many as two out of three—have never heard the name of Jesus in a saving sense one time. This is primarily because there is no one to tell them. There are no laborers in many parts of the world. Nine of ten Christian workers work with six percent of the world’s population. This means that there is only one worker for ninety-four percent. At this point most of the people will live their lives and die without ever hearing the Gospel one time. The fields are white, but the laborers are few. Why? Christians simply do not pray for laborers. In fact, if it were possible to record every prayer prayed today and there is one for laborers, it would be surprising.

What is the point? **JGHM has been entrusted with a message and a mission**—to mobilize prayer warriors who are anchored in the Word of God and who understand the times. The word **entrust** brings up the idea of a steward and his stewardship. The thought is being granted a trust for profitable use.

Paul reminded Timothy that he had been entrusted with a ministry and urged him to be faithful in executing that trust to the very best of his ability. **It is required in stewards that a person be found faithful**. Further, we can be sure that God will equip us to fulfill His purpose for us. **Where God guides, He provides**.

Any Christian, as well as any leader of a ministry, is wise to step aside from daily demands and the business of life and ask some basic questions. For what have I been entrusted? Am I being faithful? Am I doing my best? Am I faithful with every opportunity? So often opportunities appear to be simply unwelcomed interruptions. It is so easy to move into neutral and waste minutes, hours, and even days.

Moses, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, informed him that our days are three score and ten. When God graces us

with additional years, a good prayer is “Teach us to make the most of our time, so that we may grow in wisdom [learn more about Him] (**Psalm 90:10a, 12**). Approaching my 88th birthday, I hacve done serious assessment of my life in relation to the unique ministry God has entrusted to me. I am satisfied in some areas, but see clearly a number of areas that need attention to keep on target. As the psalmist said, “*I thought on my ways, and turned my feet unto Thy testimonies*” (**Psalm 119:59**). I believe the result will continue to be found doing what God has brought us into the kingdom to do “for such a time as this.”

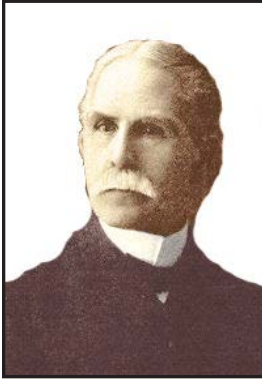
Prayer Seminars in Ecuador

The role of music



Music is an excellent way to plant spiritual principles into our minds that will guide our responses to life’s circumstances. Anyone who takes time to reflect on the truths embedded in the great hymns of the faith written by **Elisha A. Hoffman** (1839-1929) will become an advocate of returning them to our worship services today. Among Hoffman’s 2,000 hymns are these favorites: “*What a Wonderful Savior,*” “*Are You Washed in the Blood?*,” “*Leaning on the Everlasting Arms,*”

“*No Other Friend Like Jesus,*” “*I Must Tell Jesus,*” “*Is Your All on the Altar?*”. One of the mistakes that churches are making is to move away from the hymns of the faith in favor of what is known as “contemporary Christian music” that often exalts man, not the Lord. Clearly, the Holy Spirit often anoints the words, the music, and the singing that helps us remember that God is our strength, our song, and our salvation (**Psalm 118:14, Isaiah 12:2**).

Continuing Prayer—The Secret of Revival

Prior to Pentecost, it is recorded that the believers “continued steadfastly...in prayers” (**Acts 1:14**). After Pentecost, the young church continued steadfastly...in prayers” (**Acts 2:42**) and when the rivers of blessing were flowing far and wide, and the work was so extensive that the apostles could no longer cope with it, we hear their solemn resolve: “We will continue steadfastly in prayer” (**Acts 6:4**).

Let it be burned upon our hearts by the Spirit of God that this mighty movement that turned the world upside down was not only born out of prayer, but was brought forth by prayer and maintained by prayer. Such praying, costly but indispensable, has ever characterized the great revivals of the past.
